# Pastoral Reflection

## The Kingdom of God

Dear Friends,

Throughout the season of Lent we have been talking about Jesus' teaching on the Kingdom of God. There is general agreement that this was the central theme of His preaching and teaching ministry. There is also general agreement that He taught about it in a rather interesting and unusual way...by using parables.

What is the Kingdom of God? It is like a farmer sowing seeds in the field, some fall among the rocks, others on thin soil, still others on good soil, some even among the weeds. It is like a net cast in to the sea, a woman who kneads yeast into the flour, a treasure buried in a field, a pearl of great price and so on.

Do you get what He is talking about? Do you understand what the Kingdom of God is like? Perhaps with the disciples we nod our heads "yes," but then have to confess, "no, not really."

Some might say that Jesus was being intentionally vague and ambiguous in His use of the parables, but I don't think so. I think, like any really good storyteller, Jesus was inviting His listeners, then and now, to enter into the stories He told so that we could discover their meanings for ourselves. During this season of Lent, I hope you are doing just that for yourselves.

But then, just so that there wouldn't be any misunderstanding about His message and meaning, Jesus did some things that were crystal clear and unambiguous...He showed us what the Kingdom of God is like - and we are going to celebrate those events during Lent as well.

On ***Maundy Thursday, March 24***, we are going to offer a Passover Seder meal from 6:00p-9:00p. Our host for the evening will be Steve Sherman, a former Tab member who was raised in a Jewish home. Together we will experience the Passover feast just as Jesus celebrated it with His disciples at the Last Supper. Read more about the Passover Seder in this edition of the Tower Chimes and be sure to register your attendance.

On ***Good Friday, March 25***, at 7:00p, we will reflect and remember Jesus' death during a service of Tenebrae (darkness). This is a powerful and moving service as the Sanctuary moves from light to darkness, from sound to silence, in remembrance of the sacrifice of our Lord.

All of this leads to and prepares us for the ***Celebration of Easter Day on Sunday, March 27***, with services at 7:30a, 9:00a and 11:00a. Through music and prayer and preaching we will celebrate the way God showed us the coming of the Kingdom of God through the resurrection of our Lord!

Any questions we may have about who Jesus is or what He meant by His teachings are answered in His death and resurrection!

Jesus is alive! Alleluia! Amen!

I look forward to worshiping with you throughout this Lenten and Easter season.

# Fresh Stop Produce

## Family Eats Better with the Help of Fresh Stop

Lorisa Lydick and her family already understood the value of eating fresh, local, organically grown produce. They once did an experiment where they all agreed to “go completely natural and organic and see how it went.” Well, it went great as the family saw improvements to their overall health. So when someone handed Lorisa a brochure about Fresh Stop Produce one day last spring while she was watching her kids play football, she came into the Parlor and ended up purchasing a share of fresh produce. The Fresh Stop model usually requires that you purchase your share ahead of time, but we always have a few extras for people like Lorisa. She was able to benefit from the \$12 option, and after that first time, because she has a large family, she ordered three shares each time.

What’s a share? At each Fresh Stop everyone gets the same variety and amount of produce (and sometimes eggs), no matter if they pay \$25 or \$12. Fresh Stop provides a newsletter with recipes, especially for the lesser known veggies and makes samples for people to try. Lorisa doesn’t mind Fresh Stop choosing the produce for her. “It was actually a lot of fun because we got to find new things on our own,” she said. “I searched for some recipes online. Some of them we just played with, like literally just kinda of just stuck them in a pan and went, ‘here, let’s try this!’ My family loves it.”

Lorisa feels she gets good value - a lot of produce for her money. “I had money to buy other things to go with (the produce) to create meals and to be able to feed my family in a healthy manner,” she said. “It definitely opened a huge doorway for us to be able to do better and eat better, and I know we appreciated it greatly. It was wonderful for us!”

## Rev. Gable Joins the Faculty of CREDO

Rev. John Gable has been invited to join the faculty of CREDO, a program sponsored by the Board of Pensions of the Presbyterian Church USA. CREDO is designed to help mid-career pastors address issues of their health and well-being: vocational, spiritual, emotional, physical and financial.

The design of CREDO is to invite groups of 30-35 pastors to attend an eight-day retreat at a remote conference center somewhere distant from where they are currently serving. During that time away, a faculty of eight will guide them through times of insight and discovery as they address these critical areas of their life and ministry. At the end of the retreat time participants are encouraged to write a CREDO plan; a plan of action that they will implement when they return home. Rev. Gable has been asked to serve on the CREDO faculty as a conference leader.

John was a participant in a CREDO conference in 2010 and remembers thinking, "This has been so beneficial. If ever I am asked to be part of the CREDO faculty I would love to participate." He was invited to join the faculty and will lead his first CREDO conference in Hunt, Texas March 6-14. Please keep him and the participants of CREDO in your prayers.

## My Week in the Big Apple

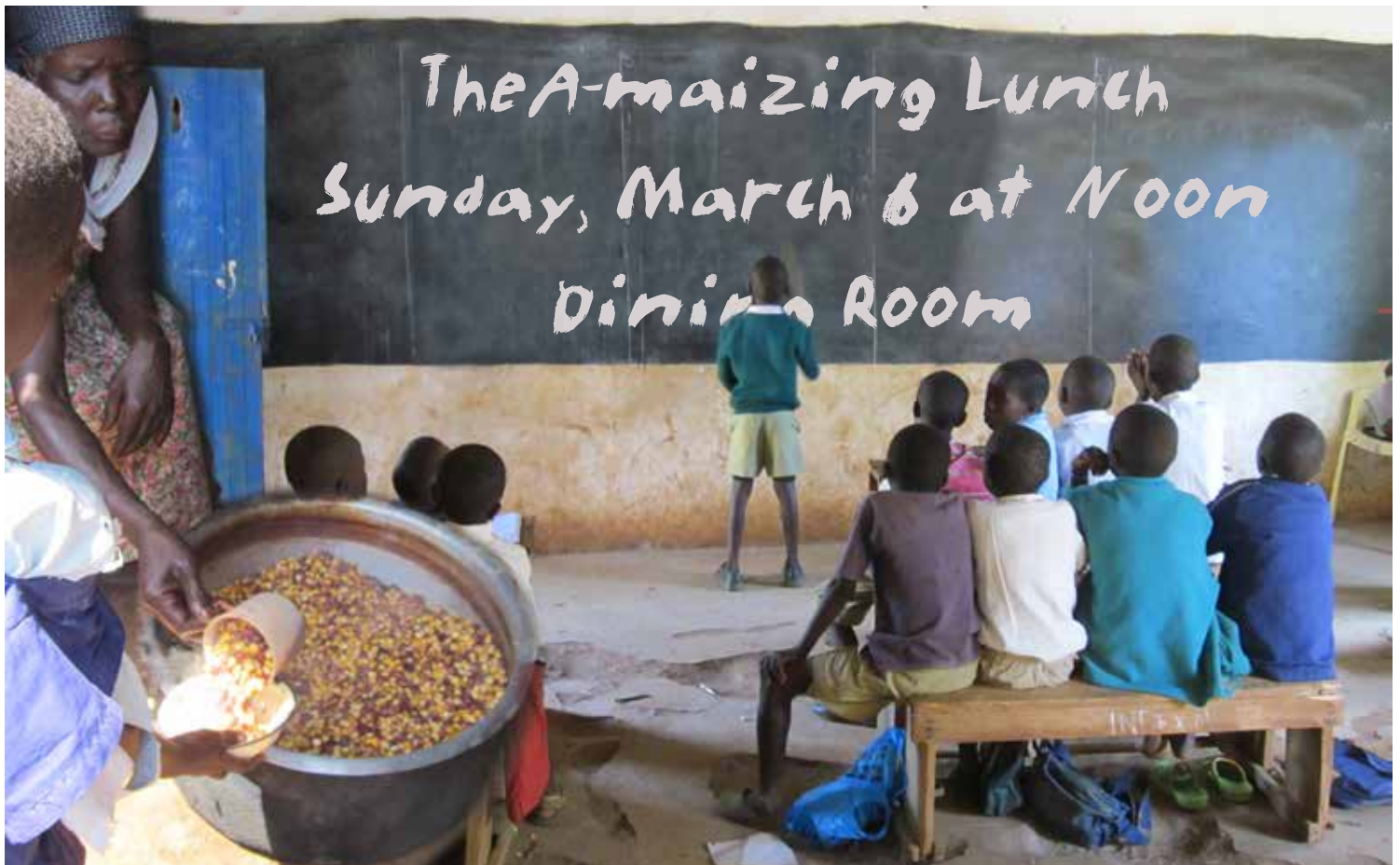
For a week in January, I was privileged to be a part of an exclusive group of folks from literally across the world that participated in a workshop in New York City, "The Complete Conductor: Orchestral Conducting for the Choral Conductor." An extensive application and video audition were required from each prospective participant. Out of all the applicants, 16 were chosen to be a part of this intense six-day program that included classroom work, private conducting lessons and observing two concerts presented at Carnegie Hall.

The workshop leaders for this program were some of the finest in the profession. Renee Clausen, one of the world's top choral conductors, from Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota led the choral portion of the workshop and Michael Adelson, one of the conductors of the New York Philharmonic, led the instrumental conducting portion of the workshop. During these times, conducting techniques were shared with respect to communicating with singers and players (which differ tremendously) and how to bring these two groups together in producing wonderful choral and orchestral interpretations through our conducting techniques.



Outside of the classroom work, each of the conducting mentors spent private time with each of us. After their critiques (and going back to the hotel to work on them!) we were privileged to work one-on-one with, first, a string quartet who offered their critiques and suggestions and then with a full chamber orchestra who also offered their critiques of our conducting and communication to the players.

The time that I spent in New York for that week was professionally one of the best opportunities that I have had throughout my career. Thanks to Tab for allowing me the time to participate in this phenomenal experience and for your constant support to the Music Ministry of Tab and to me personally. God bless each of you!
