Pastoral Reflection

A Vision With A Plan

Dear Friends,

On Sunday, April 10, we had a great celebration at Tab as the Vision Renewal Team unveiled the report they/we have been working on since last June. John Thomas and Chad Lynn led a great presentation explaining the report during the 10:00a hour to a full Sanctuary, then we enjoyed a wonderful pitch-in dinner together following worship. Thanks to the Deacons and Jen Thomas for hosting another great time of good food and great fellowship.

If you haven't yet received a copy of the Vision Renewal report we have one waiting for you in the Front Office. I hope you will take it, read it, and digest it. It is really a good vision for Tab, built on the strength and inspiration of the past, as we move into the future.

I really don't want to give you the "Reader's Digest" version of the report; however, I do want to highlight the three pillars which I believe will undergird and influence the future of Tab's ministry every bit as much as the commitment to stay in the Mapleton-Fall Creek neighborhood did in the mid-1960s.

The three pillars of the document are a commitment to:

- Greater faith
- Deeper relationships
- A stronger community

In one regard one might say, "You spent nine months getting to that? Of course that is what we are committed to at Tab." If that is your response, I say "Amen!" We didn't set out to craft a "new" vision for Tab, but to "renew" our vision for Tab. These cornerstone principles are hardwired into Tab's DNA.

However, on second look, as we really commit ourselves to these three principles they will have a significant impact on the way we do ministry, the things we are committed to, the way we use our God-given resources of time and talent and treasure. As we look at every program and ministry we offer, these principles will help us evaluate which ones we should be really committed to and what we must do to make already good programs even better.

To this end, the Session has commissioned a "Next Steps" committee to help guide us in the near future, but lest we wait around for a committee to decide and act, I believe there are "next steps" every one of us can, and should, take.

Beginning now, I encourage you to ask yourself these three questions on a daily basis, as you start your day, whether at Tab, at school, at home or at the office.

*What am I doing TODAY that will help me GROW IN MY FAITH? Be specific. What can I do to improve my prayer life? My understanding of Scripture? The way I use the treasures and talents God has given me?

*What am I doing TODAY to go DEEPER IN MY RELATIONSHIPS? How can I use this conversation, this cup of coffee with a friend, this table conversation, this chance encounter, to go deeper in friendship and faith? How do I see Jesus being present in my relationships and conversations?

*And finally, what am I doing, if anything, to help build a STRONGER COMMUNITY? I know many of us are concerned about our city, our neighborhoods, our children and the children of our community. It is one thing to bemoan the changes we see happening around us and quite another to be an agent of change. What are you doing to help build a stronger community in and around Tab?

Some, I know were expecting some grand vision to come out of the Vision Renewal process and that may happen still. I think Mother Theresa was onto something, though, when she said, "I can only do little things, but I can do them with great love." And I would add, "With great love we can do great things!"

A Vision for Tab's Future

Greater faith. Deeper relationships. A stronger community.

Those three statements summarize the vision the Vision Renewal Team and Session presented to the congregation on April 10. But they also reflect the challenge that has been put before the congregation; to push, stretch and grow in ways that expand God's blessing and the Kingdom.

The presentation offered by the Vision Renewal Team noted that, as team members worked on their report (and as they talked with the congregation, with people outside Tab and with each other) they felt that Tab is being called to echo some of the great moments from its past by making an impact for the Kingdom that is powerful and lasting.

The Vision Renewal Team presentation urged Tab's members to remember that making this impact will not be an event, but an ongoing process that calls us to deeper spirituality, deeper commitments to each other, and more purposeful ministry with the people around us.

So what do these vision statements mean?

GREATER FAITH

Tab will be a place where people are challenged to grow stronger in faith, to become equipped to serve, and to pursue opportunities for innovative and collaborative service.

DEEPER RELATIONSHIPS

Tab will be a catalyst for deeper, loving relationships that embrace differences for the sake of fellowship and service.

A STRONGER COMMUNITY

Tab will work in partnership with its neighbors to strengthen the Mapleton-Fall Creek community, advocate for justice and promote God's *shalom* (an overall sense of well-being, a complete, holistic goodness) for all people.

These statements are a response to the desires that Tab's members put forth in conversations and a survey. They are the distilled results of conversations, study, prayer and discernment. And they are the product of discussions between the Vision Renewal Team and Session, which commissioned the team to create a vision that could guide decisions about the use of Tab's resources.



Tab is a part of a marvelous endeavor in which the God of all Creation has said, "You, Tab - you will be the means of redemption, the conduit of love and the recipient of My joy." As part of this endeavor, in the past God has used Tab in tremendous, remarkable ways in the past, and He continues to today. With this Vision, the Vision Renewal Team and Tab's Session hope to point Tab toward a future in which we offer God even more . . . more faith, more love for one another, and more work on behalf of His people.

Now begins the process of implementing this vision and getting everyone involved. A Next Steps Team is already formed and meeting, and the congregation will have opportunities in the coming weeks to participate in launching the new vision for Tab. Watch for those opportunities in the coming days.

Spotlight

The Mustard Seed

Again he said, "What shall we say the kingdom of God is like, or what parable shall we use to describe it? It is like a mustard seed, which is the smallest seed you plant in the ground. Yet when planted, it grows and becomes the largest of all garden plants, with such big branches that the birds of the air can perch in its shade." - Mark 4:30-32

Cross-cultural workers, Steve and Amie Parlato, are planting mustard seeds throughout Thailand using the gifts that God has given them with the faith that their work will change lives one person at a time.

HAVE FAITH IN GOD

"What you are proposing can't work," the Christian brother said. "Pastors are not going to let their people go to start new churches." With those discouraging words Amie returned to the guest house and spent the evening alone "remembering the deeds of the Lord" (as Asaph did in Psalm 77). A few days later the Parlatos trained 26 Thai Christians and their pastor who enthusiastically welcomed the new approach and practices, and immediately put into action what they learned. Amie said, "We have good reason to be confident in God's grace. By faith we are trusting Him to ignite a movement that results in a reproducing church."

FAVOR WITH NEW FRIENDS

"Don't call me Teacher, call me older brother," a rural pastor told Amie after they had been talking together five minutes in the Isaan language. The more she asked for district and province prayer needs the more he opened up. Steve and Amie are grateful for the favor God is giving them with pastors, lay leaders and villagers across Isaan.

SPONSORSHIP

During a recent trip, a brother in Christ met them in a border town. "Steve," he said, "we have seen God increase our numbers and we have vision for our region and beyond. This May, we are inviting church and denominational leaders from all 21 provinces to gather for the purpose of strategizing. We're expecting up to 400 people. Will you come and share your vision for church multiplication?" Steve reports, "This is no ordinary invitation. Sponsorship into society by a trusted friend is the way people in Thailand work; this opportunity in early May will move me directly into a circle of leaders with whom we can impart vision and train to make disciples who multiply."

RESPONSE TO THE TRAINING

The training Steve and Amie led in February inspired the local believers. Last week they received this message from the pastor, "Since the training we have taken people out prayer walking and sharing Jesus stories every Friday. On those outings five people have come to faith and others have expressed interest. The brothers and sisters in the next district went out sharing and brought people to church who also have believed. Now there are eleven new believers."

Who are the people we are called to serve?

Tab Mission Statement: "Tabernacle Presbyterian Church is called by God, led by faith in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit to demonstrate the Kingdom of God through worship, discipleship and outreach. Honoring our heritage at 34th and Central, we will faithfully serve our community, city and world in the present and prepare expectantly for the future."

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in." - Matthew 25:35

As a church family, our congregation has been extremely generous and for that we are all thankful. However, as we begin to live our vision to be greater in our faith, deeper in our relationships and to help with making the community stronger, it became clear that we are giving our time, talent and treasure too often to a faceless issue. The men, women, and children who receive our assistance, all of whom live in the 46205 zip code, each have their own stories. Some have failed at work or marriages and others have been victims of violence or systemic bias. In almost every case, the persons who are fed in the Open Door Soup Kitchen and those who seek financial assistance from our community care fund are extremely grateful for any assistance because they have live a life of "NO" and are overjoyed to hear "YES." Here are a few numbers for you to consider:

- Each month, the Open Door Soup Kitchen produces approximately 1100 cups of soup that are served or carried home. The hotel toiletries you provide are graciously received and the commodities provided by Gleaners and several stores supplement the food needs of those who frequent our service.
- Since September 2014, Tab has recorded and tracked those persons who come in for assistance. Since that time approximately 175 people have walked in or called for an appointment to ask for assistance.
- The oldest person who has walked through our doors was 76 and youngest was 21 with an average age of 48 years for all recipients.
- The adults we helped have a total of 110 children of varying ages.
- 43 of our recipients are employed in low wage jobs, and 115 reported they were currently unemployed or disabled.
- The average hourly wage is \$9.16 per hour, \$793 per month and \$12, 815 annually.
- Some of the families receive food stamps (SNAP) with values ranging from \$15- \$553 per month depending upon the number of children in the family. The family represented by \$553 of food stamps monthly has five children living at home.
- Women outnumber men in asking for assistance, 103 and 51 respectively. Of all of our recipients, only 15 reported they were living with a spouse, while two indicated they were widows.
- Public Assistance provided by various government agencies (housing, food stamps, WIC) is provided to 91 of our recipients and 28 reported receiving no assistance.

In John 3:17-18, Jesus told us "But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth."

Tab has long recognized the needs within the community around the church and responded to the best of our ability. As we begin this Year of Jubilee, keep in mind how much God has blessed you and the message Jesus delivered to those of us who have many of the world's goods. Greater Faith, Deeper Relationships, and Stronger Community can be reflected in what we do for the "least of these."
