# Pastoral Reflection

## One-Word Statements

Dear Friends,

Have you ever been part of a discussion or conversation that you thought had come to a conclusion when someone interjects, “**But...**” which then leads the conversation in a totally new direction? That “**But**” introduces a new possibility that hadn’t even been thought of or considered before.

Luke Chapter 24, the chapter in which he tells the resurrection story, opens with this one word statement, “**But!**”

Luke 23 ends with the women visiting the tomb of Jesus. He is dead. This is the end of the story, for Him and for them.

“**BUT** on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared.” **BUT**...the stone had been rolled away. **BUT** the tomb was empty. **BUT** the angels told them, “*He is not here! He has risen!*” **BUT** Jesus is alive!

And that changes everything!

On Easter Sunday morning we are going to celebrate the “**BUT**” of our faith, and I hope you will be with us. I also hope you will bring a friend because we’ve got really Good News to share with them about the “**BUT**” of our faith.

On **Easter Sunday morning, April 16**, we will worship at 7:30a, 9:00a and 11:00a. The Youth will be serving a Pancake Breakfast in the Dining Room throughout the morning. **BUT** that’s not all. We also hope you will worship with us on:

- **Palm Sunday, April 9**, at our regular hours of worship.

- **Good Friday, April 14, at 7:00p** in the Sanctuary for a service of Tenebrae (service of darkness) in anticipation of the announcement of the Easter day!

# Launching of the Year of Jubilee

**O**n the evening of March 8, McKee Chapel's typical stillness was disrupted by sounds of celebration as cheers and shouts, handmade drums and noisemakers, and even improvised shofars announced the launch of the Year of Jubilee at Tab.

Part of a series of five Wednesday evening gatherings designed to guide the congregation in a deeper dive into the Vision Renewal Report, the March 8 session focused on the notion of Jubilee and what it can mean in the life of Tab. Biblically a time for forgiving debts, freeing slaves and celebrating God's mercies, the Jubilee is being celebrated at Tab as a time for putting our renewed vision into action.

As part of the conversation, the 60-plus attendees were asked to consider what Jubilee can mean for Tab. While some of the conversation centered on ways we can extend God's mercies to those around us, attendees also were prompted to discuss ways in which we, as individuals and as a congregation, might live as though we are anticipating and accepting God's Jubilee in our lives.

Collectively, the Wednesday gatherings were designed to give Biblical background for the statements at the core of Tab's renewed vision: Greater Faith, Deeper Relationships, Stronger Community - to promote conversation about how those statements apply to our lives, and to offer hands-on activities that not only create tangible symbols of the vision but also nurtured opportunities for deeper relationships.

In April a special worship service will feature products of the Wednesday evening sessions, from the "musical instruments" participants created, to words written during the gatherings and more. The hope is that, even as we forge deeper relationships and get a firmer grasp on our faith, and strengthen our community, we will create "legacy projects" that memorialize this time in Tab's history.

Want to learn more about the Wednesday evening sessions and what came from them? Find someone who attended and ask him or her about "Gefdarsk." The odds are good that this question will help to spark an interesting and maybe even jubilant conversation, and open the door to a better understanding of where Tab's vision will take us.

Twenty years ago, Elisee Womack knew that God had called her to help those who needed a listening ear, some honest talk, a caring hug and someone who had the willingness to wipe away a tear. With the help of many, some of whom attended Tab, the Unleavened Bread Café was born. Since that time, hundreds of women whose lives were broken from drugs, alcohol, prostitution, loneliness and abandonment have found a refuge at the café.

The Unleavened Bread Café is open for breakfast and lunch Monday through Saturday, and each day you will find Mother Elisee sitting at one of the tables "holding court" for those willing to sit with her. Mother Elisee is a magnet for community help which is what has kept the café operational for all of these years. As you can imagine, the majority of those who come to the café for help have few resources of their own. Many need much more than they can give. However, no one is ever turned away - who is ready to turn their life over to Jesus for love and guidance through the compassionate hands of Mother Elisee.

One of her greatest joys is taking the women she has helped on a spring retreat out of the city. For many of the women, leaving the neighborhood was never a thought they had entertained, much less leaving Indianapolis and visiting a lake. By the peaceful swish of the water, God's voice is heard bringing calm and comfort to these women as they struggle to put the pieces of their lives back together.

Unleavened Bread Café has so much to celebrate on this occasion of their 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Join this celebration at 12:30p on April 9 to congratulate all who have made the café a reality!
