# Pastoral Reflection

## "Gift" Ideas

Dear Friends,

Let me encourage you to give a gift to your family members and to us at Tab...your funeral arrangements!

That may sound like a strange gift to give to those who will attend to your affairs after your passing, but I can't tell you what a wonderful gift it is to those who will be left with that responsibility.

Since January 1 of this year, I have presided over nine funeral or memorial services....nine good friends and long-time faithful members of Tab. Each of whom we have loved and will miss.

The first thing I do when we learn of a member's death is to go to their family file; the record we keep of their membership and involvement at Tab, so when I sit with the family to plan the service, we have a very good idea of what they have requested - that is, if they have given us the information.

If they have, it makes planning so much easier, not just for me, but for their family members. What were mom's favorite Bible verses? What hymns did dad always say he wanted us to sing at his service? Which of his friends did he want to speak? What stories did she want us to tell (or not)?

At the time of death, even those who have made immaculate plans still leave many decisions to be made by their family members, so as a gift to those who will be making your arrangements, please give them some advance directives as to your wishes. It is a gift they will greatly appreciate.

The Funeral Arrangement form we use at Tab is linked to your E-Chimes email or available upon request by calling the Front Office. Once completed, please give us a copy and if you would like to discuss your plans, either Oscar or Matt or I would be happy to visit with you.

Let me then add, as you are making those plans, it is also a good time to review your will and estate documents. This too, is a great gift to those who will serve as your executor. Remembering Tab in your estate planning will greatly benefit our ability to continue faithfully serving Christ in this community for generations to come. Gifts to Tab may be made directly to the church or to the Tab Endowment Fund. Again, feel free to contact us if you want more information about how to make such a gift.

Admittedly, this is probably not the first thing you thought of when I was suggesting "gift" ideas, but I assure you, any plans you make now will be greatly appreciated by those who follow you. I know that from first-hand experience with my family and with countless others.

# Spotlight

## Rexroth Romania Trip

Over spring break, we traveled to Romania to renew old friendships, pledge support, make new friends and begin plans for a youth trip in 2018.

The trip began in Timisoara which is in the west end of the country and where the revolution against Coucescu began in 1989. Tab was the first western church to provide support to the Missio Link International's (then called Jesus the Hope of Romania) efforts to win people for Christ after the revolution against communism in 1989.

While in Timisoara, we attended church, visited with longtime friends of Tab (Eugene Groza, Emil Toader and Lorena Rusoven) and visited two

locations of the Deborah House which are designed to provide housing, education and Christian upbringing and values to girls who have been abused or trafficked.

Next, we visited Alpinis which is the youth camp where we hope to bring our youth in the summer of 2018. From there we traveled to Campina to visit Marshall and Larisa McKenna and their outreach to young adults (and sometimes their children) who are homeless. While there, we saw one of the buildings that Tab helped build along with a tour of all of the amazing work that is being done in the name of Jesus to help others.

Finally, we traveled to Alexandria to visit with Pastor Octavian, a long-time friend of Tab, and to Zimnicea to visit the church that Tab helped build in the 1990s. While there, Pastor Octavian shared that he has a list of all of the people involved in the building of the church and that he prays for each of them, and Tab in general, each Friday.

Everywhere we went, we were greeted with thankfulness for the faithful support Tab has provided for the past 20 years. We heard stories of what a difference our support has made. Our lives were genuinely touched by these people and the love they showered upon us!

### VISION REFRESHER

On Sunday, June 4, during both the 9:00a and 10:00a Sunday School hours, we will have our first "Vision Refresher." It will be a wonderful time to gather together at a table with folks you may not know well, and through guided activities and questions, get to know each other a little better. This will be in place of regular Sunday School and is intended to be another step to living out our Vision Renewal. A continental breakfast and childcare will be provided. We look forward to getting to know each other better, building a stronger community and deepening our faith. Please plan on attending!

### FRESH STOP PRODUCE KICK-OFF DINNER

In July of 2015, after serving the under-served for five decades, Double 8 Foods shut down their markets. One of them was located just a block from Tab, leaving our neighbors in desperate need for accessible, quality groceries. A few weeks ago, Pastor John Gable told us how the Unleavened Bread Café is regularly robbed just for food - not money. Our Fresh Stop ministry is growing and is committed to providing healthy food for our neighbors at an affordable price. Last season, we sold 206 shares to those in the lower income bracket at a reduced price. Of those shares, 42 went to those receiving SNAP benefits (welfare) at an even lower price. The 194 shares that were sold at a higher price also helped folks since we all need to include more fresh produce in our diets. Last year we started something new by giving people the opportunity to purchase grass fed beef at two different price levels based on income. We sold about 200 pounds of meat to those of lower income at the reduced price. Also, our food education grew as we partnered with the Indianapolis Urban League which provided chefs and taught cooking classes at each of our Fresh Stops. If you'd like to hear more about what we're doing and how you can be involved, you are invited to our Fresh Stop Kick-Off Dinner on Wednesday, May 17, at 6:00p in the Dining Room.
