Pastoral Reflection

Greater Things at Tab in 2018

Dear Friends,

By now, you have received stewardship materials for the 2018 operating budget. With the Cantwell's, we believe that God is indeed doing "greater things" in and through us at Tab, and I ask that you prayerfully consider what part you will play in making those things happen in 2018.

Each and every week in worship, as Oscar calls for the offering, he reminds us of the reason why the offering is part of our experience of worship. The offering is not the collection of a "fee for service rendered" or the "dues" you are required to pay as a member of the church. Rather, each week Oscar does a great job in reminding us that our giving is in response to all that God has given us; so it should be done with a glad, joyful and generous heart. He reminds us that our giving is a way in which we partner with God in His Kingdom work and is an expression of our obedience and devotion. He is also good to remind us that what God asks of us is not just our money, but our very lives.

Please keep all of that good teaching in mind as you prepare to make your financial commitment for 2018, but let me also ask you to keep another understanding of the importance of your giving in mind as well. **While the Church is a spiritual entity entirely dependent on God; it is also a very human entity dependent on the faithful giving of its members to support its mission and ministry.**

In recent years the Session and staff have demonstrated a commitment to "living within our means." We do so with the understanding and full conviction that God will provide, through His people, the resources necessary to do the ministry He has called us to do. However, there is a catch.

In recent years, while we have gained many new and generous members to our Tab family, we have also lost many long-time and faithful members. Of course, we miss them as persons we knew and loved, but in their passing we are also feeling the loss of their support in giving. In this year alone (since last November) we have lost 20 members and are experiencing a corresponding loss in revenue.

In order to maintain our levels of support, much less increase them, we who remain are being asked to increase our giving just to "keep up," much less expand. In short, while the asked increase in the budget from 2017 to 2018 is relatively small in total dollars, it will require an increase in total giving: first to make up the shortfall we have experienced from death and other moves, then to meet growing demands.

So as you consider your pledge commitment for 2018, beyond your desire to be cheerful and grateful, please also consider being additionally generous in order to cover the shortfall we will experience from those we have lost. If you have never given or pledged to support the ministry of Tab, this would be a good year to start!

Thank you for your continued support of Tab and our ministries.

Tab Recreation is excited to have Chance Snell, an intern from the PCUSA Young Adult Volunteer program. We asked Chance to tell us about himself:

“I am 24 years old, and I have an Associate’s Degree in Administration of Justice. I am originally from Fishersville, Virginia and a member of Tinkling Spring Presbyterian Church. I have been a part of that church for as long as I can remember. I went to preschool there, Sunday school there, high school and middle school, and became a Deacon and a Youth Advisor as an adult. Professionally, before joining the YAV program, I was a security officer at the Virginia School for the Deaf and the Blind. After working in the job for around three years, I decided that I wasn’t spiritually satisfied where I was, and decided to make a change and take part in a YAV year. I was placed in the Indianapolis site. Due to my interest in athletics and my experience working with youth, Tab Recreation seemed like a great opportunity to take part in God’s community in a context that I enjoy. I am excited to be a part of this program and your church for the next year.”

Chance will be working 16 hours each week, mainly Tuesday & Thursday evenings and all day on Saturdays. He will be working with Nigel Foreman, Tab Recreation Chaplain, to promote the goals of Tab Recreation by:

- Leading corporate prayers prior to basketball, flag football and Spring soccer practices and games.
- Participating in devotional and book reviews.
- Providing encouragement and assistance to head coaches during “team talk” time.
- Monitoring one of the game sites used during basketball.
- Circulating during practices and games; specifically to build and enhance relationships with parents, players and neighbors.
- Assisting the Director with social media and promoting the FCA 3D coaching concept and other selected training tools.
- Preparing fields or courts to be used for practices and games.

Please introduce yourself to Chance as you see him on Tab’s campus and thank him for his willingness to assist the Recreation staff as we focus on the three pillars of the vision renewal document: Greater Faith, Deeper Relationships and a Stronger Community.

Alongside members of several other churches in the Indianapolis area, members of the Tab family worked to hang siding, install fascia board for roofing and gutter support, as well as a host of other "punch list" items in helping prepare the homes for presentation to their new owners in the coming weeks. The designation "parish associate" is no longer recognized by the PCUSA, but many long time Presbyterians will remember this status as a way for ordained ministers who are not currently serving in a local church to maintain their ordination requirements. Ed and Jan are both retired Presbyterian ministers, as well as being the parents of Jacquie Green. They have chosen to associate with us at Tab and wanted to have a more formal relationship with us since they can't actually become members. (A fun fact: Presbyterian ministers belong to the Presbytery, not the congregation they serve.) So, in September we named Ed and Jan our "parish associates" without responsibility or compensation. Should we ever ask them to "do anything" it would be on an "as needed/as available" basis, much as it is with any other Tab member.
