

## Pastoral Reflection

## A New Way of Life

Dear Friends,

On Easter Sunday morning, April 1, we will celebrate THE story that shapes and informs OUR stories! I hope you will be with us in worship to celebrate the glorious resurrection of our Lord!

Yet Easter is not intended to be the celebration of a given day alone; it is the announcement of a new way of life for all who put their trust in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

Easter is the announcement of God's victory over death through Jesus' death and resurrection.

Easter is the confirmation that Jesus was who He said He was and is who He says He is.

Easter is the confirmation that all of the promises of God are "yes!"

Easter is the down payment on our resurrections as we put our trust in Jesus and the assurance of our salvation! Because Christ lives, we shall live also!

Easter is the promise that the ways of this world and of the Prince of Darkness will not have the last word with us but that God will.

Easter promises that the kingdoms of this world will one day be the Kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ!

# Spotlight Meet Carolee Berry

native midwesterner, Carolee grew up in Chippewa Lake, Ohio. She went to nearby Ohio State University to get her degree in Child Development, with a minor in Special Education and Psychology. While a student at OSU, she met and married her husband, Gene. Gene's career led them to the opportunity to live in several areas of the United States, including Pittsburgh, Riverside, California and Roanoke, Virginia. Eight years ago, they moved to Indianapolis when Gene accepted a job with OneAmerica.

Along the way, Carolee and Gene welcomed their daughter Melissa, and sons Stephen and Eric. Melissa resides in North Carolina, as does Stephen and his wife, Mary. Eric and his wife, Sydni, live in Montana. Education is a priority for the entire Berry family, as each member of the family has completed post-secondary degree programs, including master's and Ph.D. degrees. Carolee and Gene don't have any grandchildren, but they are proud grandparents of their "grand dogs!"

Given the importance of education in the Berry family, it comes as no surprise that upon joining Tab eight years ago, Carolee immediately joined the Tab Tutoring program as a tutor. A few years ago, program founder, Ann Weller, made the decision to retire from leading this program. Carolee was asked to step in as the new leader a couple of times, and each time she said no. Finally, she began to realize that "God's telling me something here," and she then agreed to step into this leadership role.

Tab Tutoring has been a significant outreach in supporting children from kindergarten through eighth grade. The tutoring program supports academics through one-on-one tutoring, and the key to this approach is in focusing on relationship development between the tutor and student. Currently, 31 students are each paired with tutors and they meet each Thursday afternoon through the school year. Students come primarily from School 48 and from The Oaks Academy. In addition to providing education support, the tutoring program also feeds students a healthy snack. Carolee also helps enroll students in the Horizons summer education program that is sponsored by St. Richard's Episcopal School, as well as connecting students with the Young Actors Theatre program, which is run by Tab members Justin and Georgeanna Wade.

Tab Tutoring isn't the only child-centered program to which Carolee devotes her talents and time. She is also the associate child director of Heart Change Ministries where she works alongside another Tab member, Ann Ost. Heart Change Ministries comes alongside women in crisis pregnancies to encourage them in their spiritual walk and impending motherhood.

An avid runner for more than a dozen years, Carolee typically runs 20-25 miles per week! She frequently takes on the challenge of completing half-marathons, and it's even more fun when she travels to a destination, such as the Caribbean, with her kids to participate in a run. She and Gene also enjoy cycling together and they've even done a cycling trip through Spain. They are looking forward to their next travel adventure this spring when they will cycle through the island of Sicily.

# 2018 Tab Recreation College Scholarship

The Tab Recreation Bud Harris College Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior each year that meet the following requirements:

- Applicant must have participated in at least two Tab Recreation programs for two seasons each, or more
  - Applicant must be a graduating high school senior
- Applicant must be accepted for admission to an accredited college or university
- Applicant must return completed application and required references by May 30

The winner of this scholarship will receive \$1500 per year for four years while a full-time student in good standing at an accredited College or University.


**12 Years a Slave**: **Themes** - Economics of slavery in the United States and man's inhumanity to man; **Words of Caution**- Greed corrupts. **Instructions for Life** - Do justice, love mercy and walk humbly. **Lessons for Today** - Don't misuse Scripture for your own guilty pleasure. (Luke 17:2, Luke 12:47, Isaiah 1:13-17, Luke 11:42)

**Selma**: **Themes** - Unity can bring change. **Words of Caution** - Violent confrontation against change = violent confrontation for change. **Instructions for Life** - Perseverance in spite of opposition. **Lessons for Today** - Worth of individuals and Jesus died for <u>them</u> too. (Matthew 5:38-41, Romans 12: 19-20, Matthew 6:26)

**A Long Walk Home: Themes** - African-Americans had to do more to meet status quo, solidarity in numbers, church as place to organize, church = safe house, fear of communism. **Words of Caution** - Going against parent's wishes has consequences, don't follow blindly. **Instructions for Life** - Engage in the conversation, keep an open mind. **Lessons for Today** - Relationships are hard to establish and require openness of thought and action. (Matthew 5:38-48, Romans 12)
