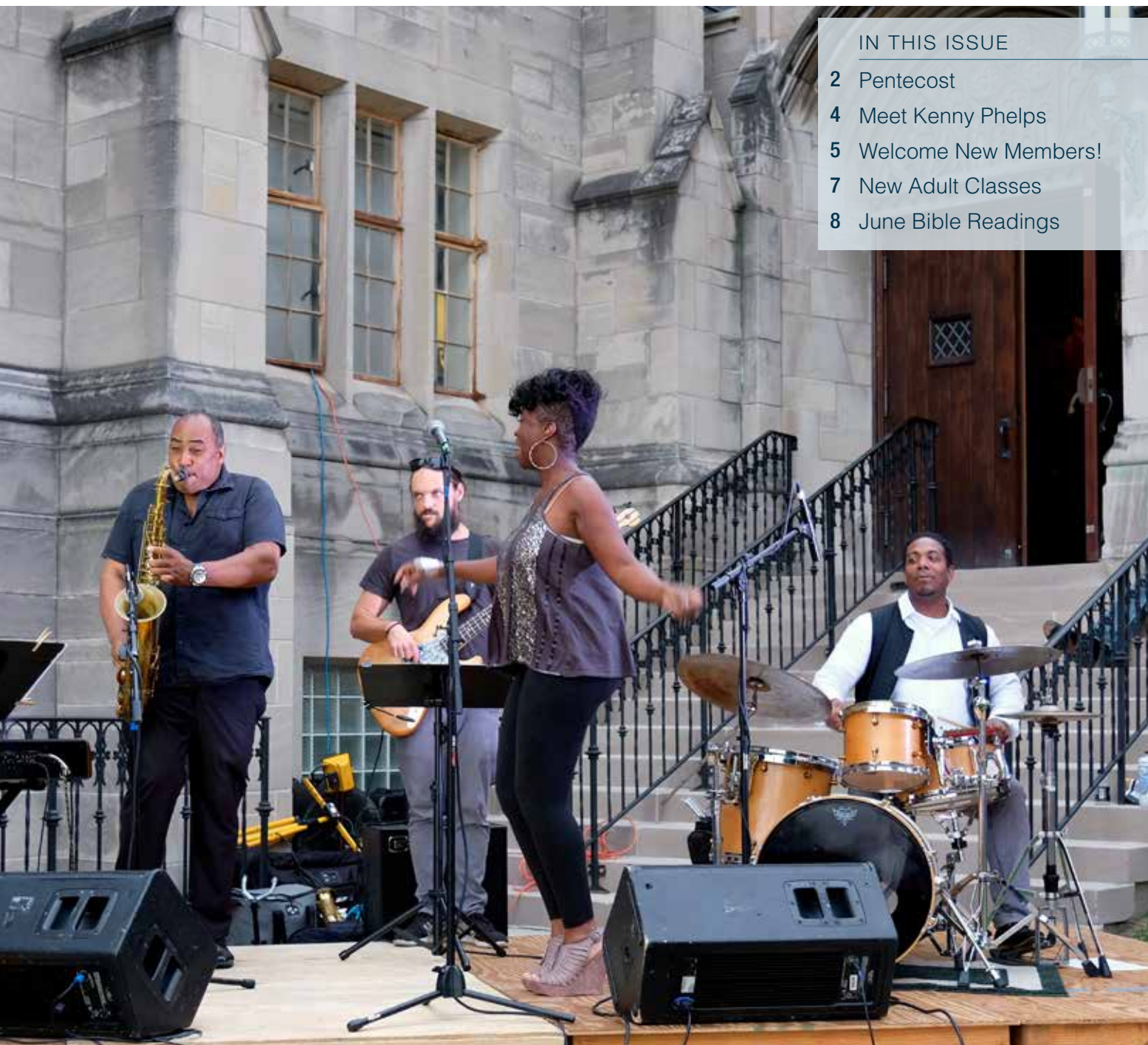

# Pastoral Reflection

## Pentecost - More Than Just A Day

Dear Friends,

On Sunday, May 20, we celebrated Pentecost, the day God poured out His Holy Spirit on new believers, the day some call the “birthday of the Church.” Pentecost, however, was more than just a “one day” event; it established the pattern for the Church’s witness and mission and ministry. Still today when we gather for worship and study and when we go out in witness and service, we do so by the indwelling and empowering of the Holy Spirit.

One of Jesus’ last commands to His disciples was to “*go and make disciples*” (Matthew 28:19) and to “*be His witnesses in Jerusalem (their city), in Judea and Samaria (their region), and to the ends of the earth*” (Acts 1:8). All of this again is by the empowering of the Holy Spirit.

## Meet Kenny Phelps

If you had the opportunity to attend one of the Tab Jams concerts last summer, then you've had the pleasure of hearing the talented Kenny Phelps. Tab Jams is the brainchild of Tab member, Jim Babcock. Jim was interested in finding a way to invite our Mapleton-Fall Creek neighbors to Tab for music and fellowship. When Jim and Kenny met, they began this amazing concert series that will continue again this summer.

Kenny Phelps is not new to Tab, though. He grew up in this neighborhood. In fact, Kenny played basketball with the Tab Recreation program. But basketball wasn't his first love. As a young child, Kenny found his passion in percussion. Specifically, he loved banging on pots and pans! His passion for drums evolved as he grew up, and in high school, he came to the realization that music could be a job. After a brief stint at Eli Lilly, Kenny knew music was the career he wanted to have. He then jumped headfirst into practicing his craft forty hours a week - as if practice was his job.



While growing up, gospel music was the only genre on Kenny's playlist. As an adult, he made connections in the local music scene and met jazz artists such as Steve Allee and Rob Dixon. He spent time as the house drummer with the American Pianist Association. He also toured with Dee Dee Bridgewater and Arsenio Hall.

But playing drums wasn't Kenny's only calling. He also felt a calling "of the heart." For almost 10 years, Kenny led a program called "Takin' It To the Streets." In partnering with local churches and local food banks, Kenny and his partner musicians would visit different areas of Indianapolis. They brought music, food and fellowship to neighborhoods in need.

Six years ago, Kenny entered a new phase of life when he became the owner of Owl Music Group. Owl Music Group is a record company, by definition, but it is really much more. Their mission is that the company "... exists to create a diverse and thriving community through mentorship and collaborative musical experiences." In short, Kenny wants to help young musicians learn what he learned growing up. He wants to help musicians learn that music is a career option. But it is not just about playing music or being center-stage. It's about marketing, networking, collaboration, planning, and so much more. And Kenny is there to help them learn about these aspects of the business. It's his passion for music and a belief - driven by his faith in God - that calls him to serve young musicians in this way.



As we look forward to the coming summer, we're excited for this season of Tab Jams. **This year's concerts will again be held in the courtyard, and they are scheduled for June 10, July 8 and August 12 at 6:00p.** Kenny, his talented wife, Valerie, and a variety of other local musicians, will be performing. Come join us for some great evenings of music!

### Parking Lot Update

In the last report we were beginning the bid process for work on the new parking lot. Unfortunately, there were two very surprising outcomes of that process. One is that we only had one bidder, and two, their price was almost double the amount we were expecting.

It was obvious that we were the victims of a bad time of year to be bidding. Most paving companies now have an abundance of business repairing our city streets and are not being very aggressive in seeking other projects.

Given that information, the committee quickly determined that the project is not viable at this price. It would not be wise stewardship moving forward with only one bid, and with the bid being that high an amount.

We will continue in the near-term to examine any planning options for the future and we will release a package for a second round of bidding in December of 2018.
