Pastoral Reflection

Worship Plus One

Dear Friends,

One of the questions we ask of our new members when they join the Tab Church family, after they have affirmed their faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and confirmed the vows taken when they were baptized, is, "Do you promise to make diligent use of the means of grace, to share faithfully in the worship and service of the Church, to give of your substance as the Lord may prosper you, and to give your whole heart to the service of Christ and His Kingdom throughout the world?"

I love that question! I love every aspect of what it asks of us as followers of Jesus, as members of His Body, the Church, so I ask you now to take a moment to reflect and consider your response to that question.

As you do so, I would like to focus on one portion of the question, "Will you share faithfully in the worship and service of the Church?"

"The worship"- while in one respect the question asks us to commit to being regular in worship, I think it also goes beyond that. I think it also asks us to make worship an essential aspect of our lives every day, not just for an hour on Sunday morning.

Being "faithful in worship" is making a commitment to being God-centered in our daily life, which involves regular times of prayer and the devotional study of Scripture. Just as worship is central to who we are as Christians, so "being faithful in worship" is central to our growing as disciples of Jesus and being an active member of the Church.

"The service of the Church"- while worship is the unique and essential aspect of the Christian life, so also is "service." Consider Jesus' answer to the question about the greatest commandment. He said, "The first and greatest commandment is to love God (worship); and the second is like it, to love your neighbor as yourself (service)."

We are called by Christ to both "worship and service" as we seek to follow Him.

So here is my encouragement to you, even as it is to our new members when we discuss this question. I encourage you to make a commitment to "worship plus one." Starting now, make a commitment to being faithful in WORSHIP PLUS ONE other form of activity and involvement which will benefit both your own faith development and serve others.

The opportunities to do this are nearly endless at Tab: tutor, sing in the choir, help in the Open Door Soup Kitchen, teach a class, take a class, visit a shut-in, usher, coach a team, rock a baby, build a house with Habitat for Humanity, join a small group or Bible study, and on and on. Every month the Chimes is filled with opportunities for "worship and service."

As we enter into a new program season of the church year, let me encourage you to "share faithfully in the worship and service of the Church."

WORSHIP PLUS ONE.

I look forward to being with you in worship (and service) soon.

TabTutoring

Meet Kathy Gunn

athy Gunn didn't expect to draw on her experiences as an overnight operating room nurse when she and her husband Rich signed up to volunteer for Tab's tutoring program. "No one expects to be in an operating room at night, so it was always a trauma," said Kathy, who worked for a hospital in inner-city Philadelphia for 13 years. "I found that I had a small window of opportunity to calm patients down and make them feel safe."

"It was always worth it to spend a few minutes to talk to the patient," she said, "because it's not good when a patient goes under anesthesia under extreme stress. If they were fighting when they got hurt or if they remember seeing the collision coming in a car accident, they wake up fighting and that affects outcomes. So while tutoring doesn't require anesthesia or sutures, it does help to be able to listen and pay attention to verbal and nonverbal cues."

Kathy and Rich moved from Philly to Indy six years ago. They were at Tab a couple years before they decided to sign up as tutors. Initially, Kathy was paired with a little girl from School 48. Kathy said, "She was so loving and eager for any kind of attention. Just a pleasant child who was cute as a button and someone anyone could work with."

But Kathy got wind of a nine year old boy, David, who has ADHD and attends School 48 as well. She was drawn to him and offered to take over when his tutor needed to step away due to family health issues. They hit it off immediately.

For a while, Kathy offered more emotional support than academic support. They talked a lot about the grief he was feeling over the loss of his cousin, also 9, who died. "It was really good for my heart to feel like I could deal with what he was dealing with," she said.

David is artistically inclined, so Kathy has him draw on a dry erase board while they talk or she reads from the Bible or prays. "Yes, he needed school help, but he needed this more so that's what we focused on," she said.

Kathy adds that something just clicked between the two of them. They've been together three years now. In that time, she's also formed a bond with his mom, Tameka, by going out to her van and talking with her at pick-up time. Tameka, who has three kids in the program, experienced some health problems last year. Kathy texts with her regularly. "It's nothing major, I just let her know I care and I pray for her family," said Kathy.

Her husband, Rich, is a tutor as well, matched with a student who's making great strides educationally with math and language. "He's a totally different type of child," Kathy said. "He's flourished this past year. We're very proud of both of them."





They both find it helpful that the planning team, Carolee Berry and Barb Babcock, provide flashcards, worksheets, games, crafts and books to use. "You're never in it alone," said Kathy.

When asked why she continues to tutor, Kathy said, "We're supposed to help each other. That's why we're here. We share God and we share His love."

TabYouth

They Have Such Faith in God!

uring the last week in June, TabYouth traveled to volunteer at the Neighborhood Ministries Kids Club in Phoenix, Arizona. Nineteen youth and adults ventured forth to help in various ways at the camp. The mission of Neighborhood Ministries is "to be the presence of Jesus Christ, sharing his life-transforming hope, love and power among distressed families of urban Phoenix to ignite their passion for God and His Kingdom." It does so by reaching out to the inner-city Latino community in numerous ways. It teaches business skills through operating a bicycle shop, a t-shirt printing company and an urban produce farm that benefits the community. Education is also vitally important and tutoring is provided along with an on-site preschool. As kids grow, more opportunities and assistance are provided. There is also a thrift shop, food and clothing bank, parenting classes and a church.

For the second straight year, TabYouth reached out to volunteer at Kids Club, a two-week camp for inner-city youth aged 5-13. Each morning, we arrived at 8:30a to worship with the leaders. We then went outside to greet the kids as they arrived before going back inside for a time of worship with the campers. Our responsibility was to run an activity for four groups ranging from kindergarten to seventh grade. This year we were accompanied by our own TabYouth alumna, Bekah Ost, who assisted us in leading science classes. We did experiments with dry ice, UV bracelets, and polymers. We connected our experiments to lessons about Jesus and what it means to be a Christian. We also were asked to provide story telling for several of the groups for one afternoon since the storyteller who was scheduled was unable to make it. We read books to the young children, taught songs and told stories from the Bible.

Our youth expressed numerous times how much this trip meant to them and several expressed an interest in returning every year, even when they are in college. They were touched by the relationships they were able to form with the campers in such a short time. TabYouth became an essential part of the week, often called on to help out in various ways at the last minute. Our youth represented Tab well and were excellent examples of what it means to serve in Jesus' name.

When asked about their experiences, some of our youth replied, "The kids in Neighborhood Ministries have so much going on but have such faith in God that we could see the joy in their eyes." "The kids just want our love and attention." "It was more pronounced this year that many of the kids that attend the ministry are dealing with many different challenges such as troubled homes, violence and drugs at home and fears of immigration." "Even though these kids are going through so much, their faith is strong and they are some of the most positive kids I have ever met"

As always, we are very thankful to Tab for all of the support provided to its youth as they learn more about what it means to be a Christian and to serve Jesus.
