

## Pastoral Reflection There's A Lot Of Music Going On

#### Dear Friends,

As you read the Chimes you'll notice the theme of music emerge. Music has been a way to express our thoughts, emotions, but ultimately our devotion to God. King David, the greatest worshiper in the Bible, reminds us that as we sing and make a pleasant noise, God is moved and enjoys the creativity of His people. Tab is no stranger to music and has gained a reputation for hosting world-class concerts and workshops to train musicians. It is only fitting that four music events are taking place in September.

First, we begin with the Community Worship Service, September 2, in our Sanctuary. This year we are hosting Phillips Temple and merging praise bands from both churches to create a sound that honors our cultures and long-standing relationship. This is one of my favorite services because the music is top-notch and I cherish the conversations we share afterwards. Even though we might not see each other often, throughout the year, Phillips is like that old friend that you always smile at and are grateful to see again. We hope to have a strong showing from Tab as we worship together.

After the Community Worship Service, we will officially launch our Rhythms of the World Children's camp on Saturday, September 8. We did a soft launch in the summer to test and fine-tune this endeavor. The fall program will continue to explore music from different parts of the world and provide a music education that is lacking for some students. We are excited to see this program grow and expand so please keep it in your prayers.

Then we move towards the Sacred Music Symposium, September 12, 13 and 14. This year promises to be even better than before with world-class clinicians and record-breaking attendance. While most of us will not attend the symposium, I am always encouraged to see the number of worship leaders who are diligent in fine-tuning their craft. We, as a church, should be humbled that we can host such an event where both the current and future generation of worship leaders can mature their skills. We'll have two concerts during the symposium. The first is "Sing to the Lord A New Song" on Wednesday, September 12, at 7:00p followed by "Christ, Light of the World" on Friday, September 14, at 7:30p.

Lastly, on September 30, we celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month during worship with Spanish worship songs and a bilingual sermon. All worship services will have some elements of this as we celebrate Hispanic heritage, and our contemporary service will feature it prominently.

As I said, there's a lot of music going on this month.


Betsy will be serving once again as a deacon (her third time since joining Tab) beginning in January 2019. "There's that people thing again," she said, "I love that!"

Betsy enjoys bird-watching, brisk walking, biking, working out, scrapbooking, music and community theatre. While in high school she played the clarinet, danced in ballet and performed in the theater. "Singing and dancing makes me smile," she said. And smile she does!

Blessed with two grandchildren, she visits her daughter, son-in-law and granddaughter regularly who live near the beach in Alabama. She will be doing more traveling with her four siblings who all agreed to use the inheritance from their parents to travel together. She mused, "I am so blessed with how my life has unfolded. ## Let's Get Cooking....

#### Story by Paula Means

Last month we introduced you to Tab's new Kitchen Manager, James Bryant, and Assistant Manager, Rhonda Kaley. You know that they prepare the meals for our Open Door guests, but they are also here to provide food services for all of our programs and special events when requested.

When you reserve a room for your meeting or event with Matt Kauffman, you will receive an event form which helps the kitchen staff determine what resources are required to support your meeting or event. Those resources can include paper products, flatware, beverages and food.

James and Rhonda are also the exclusive caterers for any non-Tab organization reserving a room for their meeting or event. The recent kitchen reorganization helps us better manage our church financial resources as well as our building and supplies, and with the reorganization comes some small changes in processes that will make a big difference in helping the kitchen staff operate smoothly and efficiently.

You can help with this new process by doing the following:

- 1. All non-Tab organizations are automatically redirected to Matt if a request comes in through the Front Desk.
- 2. For any Tab meeting and/or event that is not a recurring entry on the church calendar, you should first talk to Matt Kauffman or have an outside group to talk to Matt.
- 3. Matt will check the church calendar and ask about the specifics of the planned event.
- 4. If the event, in either case, is being planned with the intention of serving food, one of the following things will occur:
  - a. <u>Non-Tab organizations</u> will be referred to James and Rhonda, since they are the designated caterers for Tab. They will work with the organization to choose a menu that is in alignment with their planned budget.
  - b. <u>Tab organizations</u> will be asked to complete the event form Matt has given them with respect to their food requirements. This should be completed even if the event is a pitch-in or a member of the committee is preparing the food.
  - c. In both cases, the completed forms should be submitted to Paula Means who will record the information and discuss the specific needs with James and Rhonda.
  - d. If all of the necessary information is not on the form, either James or Rhonda will contact the organizer with specific questions in an effort to ensure a quality event.

These procedures will be very helpful in establishing a history of our recurring events, which will reduce confusion when committee leadership changes and help us in forecasting supply purchases with greater accuracy which impacts the budget process. We hope that the benefit of this new procedure will outweigh any inconvenience. No plan is perfect until it is put in practice and improved through suggestions and mistakes. We are expecting a few mistakes and will be welcoming to all suggestions. Any questions regarding these procedures should be directed to Paula Means at paula.means@tabpres. org or 317-923-5458.
