OUR MISSION



A Celebration of Indy Grace Meet Dan Gushee

n October of this year, we will celebrate the 10-year anniversary of Indy Grace Place which has been a Tabsupported community ministry for several years.

In 1999, Dan Gushee was completing a three-and-a-half year prison term. Within a week of his release, he was introduced to Tabernacle Presbyterian Church through some trusted friends and he has been worshipping at Tab ever since. During his time in prison, Dan completed an Associate Degree, which resulted in a reduction in his prison sentence. For a short time following his release, he pursued a bachelor's degree at IUPUI while working part-time. After a year of school, Dan decided to pursue a full-time job with the option of going to school part-time. He quickly landed a position working for Rolls Royce.

At this time, the idea of Indy Grace Place was starting to form within Dan. He realized that his transition from prison to post-prison life was, in his words, "exceptional." In contrast, he knew many others were struggling with that transition and he began to wonder how he might help them. Dan began looking for a home to buy, and he specifically looked in the neighborhood near Tab. A home close to bus lines would be especially important. He bought his home in May of 2011 after a series of challenges, but, as Dan testifies, "God worked out this amazing thing."

In 2008, Dan began to hear a clear message from God. He had hosted ex-offenders in his home through the years, but nothing "formal" had been established. The message he heard from God was "I've given you what you asked for." Dan heard this call and established articles of incorporation for Indy Grace Place. With support from several Tab members, a board of directors was established to help guide and support the home, in addition to providing relational support to the residents. Dan is the Executive Director of Indy Grace Place.

Indy Grace Place is specifically a home for ex-offenders who are looking for support as they re-enter society following a prison term. The home provides space for up to four residents at any given time. Residents must complete an application and go through an interview to be considered. The maximum stay in the home is 18 months. Residents have several responsibilities. These include payment of \$70 per week for room and board, sharing in household tasks and sharing in an evening meal together. They also participate in a Christian life skills program called Wholistic Hardware and are required to complete a re-entry program through Brookside Community Development.

In the last ten years, over 65 men have lived for some period of time at Grace Place. Dan is grateful for what God has been teaching him through this work and in knowing that he is "a small piece of what God is doing in these men's lives."

Spotlight Tab Recreation Honors Its Volunteers

n Sunday, August 24, Tab Recreation presented the Louis A. Dawson award to Nigel Foreman and Harold Henderson as part of Tab Recreation Sunday. This award was established in 1957 to honor adult volunteers for extraordinary service in Tab Recreation and as a memorial to Mr. Dawson, whose devotion to the program was an inspiration to those who served with him. Below is a short description of the contribution of these two extraordinary volunteers.



Nigel Foreman was born in Louisville, Kentucky and his family moved to Indianapolis when he was a young child. As one of nine children, Nigel played youth basketball and football at Tab. He started coaching at Tab in 1995 as an assistant coach in football, and later as an assistant and head coach in both basketball and football. Soccer has become a great passion of Nigel's over the past few years; coaching both in the spring and fall leagues.

Nigel is married to Anita Dian and has three children: Nigel Joshua, Angelo and Olivia. He also has three adorable grandchildren. All of Nigel's children played youth sports at Tab, and now his grandchildren have started playing in the soccer league.

Nigel joined the Tab Recreation staff in 2006, the same year I became Director. As part of the staff, Nigel has worked as my assistant and now is almost exclusively the Recreation Chaplain. Nigel's love for the Lord is infectious and his ability to work into all conversations the importance of faith and a relationship with Christ is impressive. All who have heard him pray are moved by his passion!



Harold Henderson was born in Indianapolis, Indiana. As a youth, Harold, his sister Damita, and his brother Arthur, played basketball and soccer at Tab. As the boys got older they added football to their list of Tab sports. Their mom was a huge fan and despite being a single mom, she never missed a game. Both Harold and Arthur represented Indianapolis in the Peace Games, both in Canada and in Indianapolis, playing softball. They remember the opportunity fondly for the chance to compete while representing Indianapolis, for meeting athletes from Canada and even having a player stay at their house.

Harold started coaching at Tab in 2003 as an assistant football coach. In 2005, coach Steve Summerville talked Harold into being the head coach for the Cowboys. Despite being a die-hard Steelers fan, Harold coached and managed Cowboy teams in all three age divisions from 2005 to 2017. Today, he coaches a new 10U team named the Hoosiers. In 2008, Harold decided to coach basketball in an effort to keep as many of his football players together as possible. He now coaches in-house basketball Tab travel teams.

Harold is married to Angela and their son Drake played football and basketball at Tab. Harold's motto is "Do your best, that's all that matters." He says Tab was a safe haven for him and a place to learn, enjoy and have fun playing sports.

Fresh Stop Produce

Fresh Stop is a buying program that brings in produce from local farmers twice a month providing it at different price points based on income. Higher income folks pay \$25, lower income folks pay \$12 and those with SNAP/EBT pay only \$6. You have to order ahead of time by the Sunday beforehand and everybody gets the same variety of fresh, beautiful produce in their shares. Shares are picked up on Saturdays between 10:00a and 11:00a.

What's New? A grant from the Townley Family Fund has allowed us to do some fun things this year. We've had a drawing and given away kitchen items such as a spiralizer, a Foodsaver, knives and cutting boards. We've had chefs who cook up samples for us and talk about how we can use the produce in our share. Most of the time that has been Tab's chef, James Bryant.

We also received some donations which allow us to continue selling frozen grass fed beef. It is safer, healthier and tastier than conventional beef. Fresh Stop will be at the People's Food Summit on Saturday, October 20, at the Garfield Park Arts Center, 2432 Conservatory Drive, between 11:00a and 4:00p. Sally John will be making a presentation about our Fresh Stop program at 3:00p and would love to have your support.

Give it a try! The next Fresh Stops are October 6, October 20, November 10 and November 17. We could use more people buying at the \$25 level, which allows us to get more produce in each person's share. Fresh Stop not only benefits you and your family, but also provides the means for others to have a more healthy diet. Fresh Stop is also helping with the food desert situation in our neighborhood which has worsened in the last few years.
