



Pastoral Reflection What Will They Say?

Dear Friends,

On Sunday morning, December 9, just before reading the Scripture lesson and preaching, I reflected briefly on the life and legacy of President George H. W. Bush after having watched his funeral services earlier that week. Regardless of one's political persuasion or thoughts regarding his presidency one cannot help but be inspired by his life of service to our country and his love of family and friends, and opponents, alike. During the memorial service a friend of ours texted, "Inspiring! Makes me want to be better!" I agree.

While life has moved on for us (and by the time you read this that service will seem in the distant past) I want to encourage you, as I have myself, to reflect and consider what we can "take away" from our reflections on the way "41" lived his life.

As I mentioned that Sunday morning, one day there will be a gathering of family and friends to remember each of us, perhaps not with quite the pomp and circumstance or wide-media coverage, but a gathering of people who will pause to reflect and remember us and the way we lived our lives.

What will they say about us? What words will they use to describe us, our actions, our characters, the way we lived our lives? Will anyone be "inspired" and "want to be better?" As long as we have breath we have the opportunity to change, to improve, to be better.

In his book, *The Road to Character*, columnist David Brooks contrasts our "résumé virtues" - achieving wealth, fame and status, with our "eulogy virtues," those that exist at the core of our being: kindness, bravery, honesty, faithfulness and the like. "Résumé virtues" focus on ourselves and our own wants and needs to be first, right, in control, while "eulogy virtues" focus on the other and the kinds of relationships we have formed.

The Apostle Paul, in his letter to the Philippians, writes these words of encouragement: "Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing these things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you." (Philippians 4:8-9)

As we enter into this new year, let us commit ourselves to living lives of virtue and character so that when that day comes when our family and friends gather to remember and reflect upon the living of our lives, they too, will be "inspired" to "be better."

I look forward to sharing this year in worship and service with you.

Team World Vision: A Monumental Impact

Tab runners give hundreds access to clean water!

or four months last year, if you wanted to find a certain dozen Tab members early on Saturday mornings, you could have found them in a Broad Ripple parking lot. Stretching, tightening shoe laces, hooking up headphones and praying. They were preparing for their weekly group run, part of their training program for the Monumental Half Marathon.

Whether it was a cool and clear dawn, a humid and hot morning or a cold and dreary daybreak, they were there, cheerful and ready to run. For some, each Saturday would challenge them to run farther than they ever had before. Partnering with runners from Light of the World Christian Church, Faith Presbyterian Church and Northview Church Binford, the Tab team started with a 35-minute run in July. By the end of August the runners had notched their first 5-miler. In mid-October they ran 10 miles and on November 13, they completed the 13.1-mile half-marathon.

As delighted as they were to participate in the event, it wasn't running that attracted them. It was bringing water to people in Africa through World Vision, a Christian humanitarian organization. World Vision helps millions of people around the world each year, attacking some of mankind's greatest challenges: poverty, famine, lack of education, AIDS, disaster relief and more. Last year, one of its core programs (the one supported by the Tab runners and donors) delivered clean water to 3.2 million people by drilling and installing working wells. It would be hard to overstate the impact that clean water can have. A lack of water suitable for drinking, cooking, sanitation and hygiene kills some 1,000 children every day around the world through diarrhea and other curable illnesses. In some areas, having "access" to water means walking long hours to distant wells and back again, sometimes multiple times a day. This time spent fetching water means no time to work, or for children to attend school.

The Tab crew did its part to help deliver clean water to these people. Thanks to generous donations from Tab members and other friends and supporters, the Tab team raised \$18,075 - enough, according to World Vision data, to supply clean water to 360 Africans. Across Indianapolis, World Vision teams raised more than \$1 million, which means World Vision can provide nearly 20,000 people in Africa with clean water. At the same time that World Vision works with African communities to address their water needs, the organization also delivers Living Water. As the organization points out, "Water initiatives provide an ideal way for World Vision staff to share their faith. Receiving water not only brings good health, but also opens up a conversation about the character of Christ." And a Ghanaian who leads World Vision programs in southern Africa added, "It is Jesus who enables us to strike water. That water is stored there by God."
