Pastoral Reflection

Going Behind the Scenes

Dear Friends,

Have you ever taken a tour of Tab's beautiful building with Matt Kauffman, our Director of Music Ministries? Twice a year he offers an "official" tour of our stunning Sanctuary and McKee Chapel. When I, on the other hand, have guests visiting Tab for the first time, I often give them a "mini" tour which includes other ministry areas, such as the children's wing, the gym, and the kitchen.

There are some vital areas of Tab's ministry, however, that never seem to get on the tour itinerary. For instance, the boilers in the church basement, as important as they are; they're seldom visited.

Likewise, the business offices (important to everything we do here) remain largely "unseen" by many. If I were to take you "behind the scenes" to the Business Office, you would be impressed by and grateful for all the important work that Rod Iberg, Director of Operations and Kristine Green, Director of Finance and others do to keep us open and organized. You would quickly come to appreciate the challenge of keeping a complex organization like Tab humming along. It is this complexity, and a desire to bring our management systems into the 21st century that led Rod and Kristine to find new procedures and products that would aid them.

Earlier this year, after exploring many options they chose a platform called Realm to help them with member records, financial record-keeping, and church community building. I am pleased to say they have been using the accounting tools in Realm for many months now and they love the way it works.

There are many ways that Realm will be used to enhance our congregational life and this is where you come in: If you have not received an email invitation to "join" Realm, you will be receiving one soon. I encourage you to accept the invitation and sign up. I have done so, as have the staff and many other church leaders. You will create a secure password and then be able to enter and update your membership information including your address, phone number, and family members. Realm will serve as a new database for the church directory. You can also use it to sign up for online giving.

In the future, Children's Ministries will be using Realm's security and check-in feature on Sunday mornings. There are also "community groups" being formed around adult Sunday School classes and other interest groups.

Rhythms of the World

Tab Global Music Academy Arises from Successful Rhythms of the World Camp

For years Tab has dreamed of having a music and arts program that could be offered to youth in our community. So when the music program at IPS School 48 was terminated last school year, Tab launched its first youth music and arts program on a trial basis. The eight-week sessions, offered in the fall of 2018 and the spring of 2019, gathered about 20 students each Saturday morning to learn basic music theory, rhythms from around the world, and visual arts. Led by Tab worship leader Leah Crane, Pavel Polanco-Safadit, Director of Jazz Studies for Earlham University and Raul Padro, Latin Percussionist, the students displayed what they had learned by leading worship for the 9:00a service at Tab on June 9.

Twenty-six students attended the Rhythms of the World summer camp during the first week of July at Tab. Each day a different country was explored. Students learned about the culture, rhythms, art, and tried a

meal typically eaten in that country. Our kitchen staff, James and Rhonda, were excited to present a dish from Columbia, Brazil, India and Nigeria. Caryn Costlow, who joined the teaching staff with a focus on visual arts, challenged the students to make instruments, masks, and a clay plaque from those same countries. Students not only learned about the culture, music, instruments, rhythms, and art but also were encouraged to share what they learned with their families.

With a successful beginning, comes new growth and focus. Tab's Global Music Academy is being launched this fall on Saturdays from 9:30a-noon and will offer a more in-depth exploration of music and the arts. The Academy begins on September 21 and runs through November 16. You won't want to miss their special performance on November 17 during the worship services at Tab! Students from the previous programs will be returning, but space is currently available for new students. The fee is \$30 for the

nine-week session, with discounts offered for multiple children in a family. To register a student or for more information, please contact Leah Crane at 317-507-6360 or leah.crane@tabpres.org. Applications for scholarships are also available. The deadline for registration is September 10, 2019.

Neighbors Appreciate Tab's Presence and Leadership

If we ever risk forgetting the role Tab has played in its neighborhood, we can ask our neighbors. They're happy to remind us.

They'll remind us even if we don't ask, as I learned in May when I participated in a couple of "front porch chats" with Mapleton Fall Creek residents. Organized by the board of the Mapleton Fall Creek Development Corporation (MFCDC), the chats were a way to learn about residents' hopes and concerns for the neighborhood, and they served as fodder for a June 8 board retreat.

The residents at the meetings I attended covered a broad spectrum in terms of race, socioeconomic status and age. Their time living in the neighborhood ranged from 50 years to a matter of months. And they all seemed to share one belief: Tab is one of the neighborhood's greatest assets. Without being asked, neighbors offered praise for Tab, its history and its ongoing service to the neighborhood.

One 50-year resident said she treasures Tab's presence near her home, and another longtime neighbor described Tab as "holy ground" that is honored and respected by neighbors. Some described Tab as one of the things that make Mapleton Fall Creek a unique place. Of course, Tab's recreation program received praise, as some attendees described their time playing there. One young resident said he heard about pick-up soccer games at Tab shortly after moving to the neighborhood about a year ago, and now he plays in a regular Sunday evening game and he sees that game as a part of the fabric of the community. Many

described Tab as a community resource, and some said they look to it for leadership and services in time of need.

They do see a need. Old and young, new neighbors or longtime residents, regardless of race or socioeconomic status, the residents agreed that the area needs better access to food, more services, and amenities within walking distance, and better streets, sidewalks and drainage. They'd like to see traffic slowed down, and they want better lighting on side streets. The problems with Indianapolis Public Schools and its support of schools in the neighborhood is a big concern, and one of the few things that might drive some of the residents out of the neighborhood.

At the same time, the residents recognize that things are improving in Mapleton Fall Creek as new residents move in, fix up homes and build new ones. The neighbors are encouraged by that progress, but also concerned that gentrification might force out longtime residents.

As the MFCDC considers residents' concerns and hopes, it makes sense that Tab should factor into the conversation. Tab was one of five churches (along with North United Methodist Church, Broadway United Methodist Church, Our Redeemer Lutheran Church and Trinity Episcopal Church) that helped to form the MFCDC in 1985, and it has had a seat on the board ever since, helping to guide the organization dedicated to improving the neighborhood.

It's a leadership role that Tab has taken seriously for decades and one that neighbors are eager to say they appreciate...even if we don't ask.



Umoja Gives Students Confidence

During the June trip to the project area in western Kenya, Indiana visitors helped to spread CONFIDENCE to Umoja girls. "Confidence" is the brand name of the locally-sourced feminine products we distribute to adolescent girls. Without these supplies, girls would often miss an entire week of school each month, which negatively affected their performance.

Umoja students face extraordinary daily challenges in their quest for education. They often lack necessities, such as blankets, clothing, and light to study. Link Teachers at each partner school help us identify the particular needs of students and their families.

In addition to supplying sanitary products to girls, Umoja volunteers distributed undergarments to boys and solar lanterns to some students. By providing these essential items, Umoja Partnership instills confidence in these vulnerable students and helps them focus on their schoolwork, enabling them to perform to the best of their ability. Continue to pray for our partners in Kenya.

Realm is for Tab, it's easy and it's ad-free.



Important Information regarding online giving. One of the dynamic features of Realm is the ease by which you can give online, either by a single transaction or through setting up a recurring gift. Once you're in Realm, take a look at the giving option in the left menu, which allows you to view your giving history and schedule donations.

NOTE: Beginning on January 1, 2020, using Realm will be the only way to give recurring online gifts to Tab. Sign up for Realm and re-establish occurrence and payment information for 2020 by December 31, 2019. One-time gifts are still accessible through the Tab website, tabpres.org/giving.
