Pastoral Reflection

Just One Day in the Life of Tab!

Dear Friends,

Summer is often a time when things slow down (and I hope you have been able to enjoy some "downtime") but things have certainly been busy this summer at Tab. Let me describe one recent Sunday...August 11.

Worship that morning was wonderful and the children sang at the 10:00a service in preparation for the Children's Musical, "Go, Go, Jonah" the following Sunday (which by the way was WONDERFUL!). Attendance in worship and classes was good and there was "good energy" in the building.

By mid-afternoon, the newly installed field was full of men and women playing soccer while another group was playing basketball in the Gym. Meanwhile, a dozen or more people were scurrying around the Courtyard setting up for that evening's Tab Jams; creating a stage, setting up speakers and soundboards, and doing sound checks while others set up tables and chairs for refreshments.

Tab Jams featured Staci McCrackin and an outstanding band. The Courtyard was full of about 400 Tab members, neighbors and guests who thoroughly enjoyed not only the show, but good fellowship on a beautiful evening.

As I walked toward my car at the end of the evening, the field was filled with another 75-100 men and women playing soccer from a local soccer club. As I walked I was approached by one of our neighbors who wanted to set up a time to meet to talk about Tab, and then I had a conversation with one of our long-time members who had just taken a walk around the building to see how the parking lot project was coming along. He said, "John, I've been here a long time and Tab has never looked better. The building and grounds are well maintained and beautiful!" I agreed! My thanks to all of you who help to make that possible.

So, as I reflected on the day that evening I found myself giving thanks for the various ministries of Tab and our health and vitality as a congregation. I am grateful for how "active and involved" we are as a congregation, and I even reflected on how it might feel to be one of our neighbors. If I was a Tab neighbor I would be grateful for the welcome we extend in worship, and for the gift that we offer in programs like Tab Jams and an open field and gym. I would even be grateful for the positive activities that are going on here which benefit not only Tab as a congregation but also the neighborhood. Good things happen where and when good things are happening. In the beauty of it all is that it was just one day in the life of Tab. Those kinds of things are going on every day.

I am grateful for the ministries and services we provide and believe they are good not only for us but for our neighbors as well, which I pray makes them beneficial for the Kingdom of God in this place.

Sign Up For Realm: Focus On Community Building



The folks in the finance and administration offices at Tab have been using Realm Church Management Software for several months now, and in the words of Director of Finance Kristine Green, "It's a hit." Realm has streamlined many of her processes in the areas of giving and membership.

Now, our Session has stepped into the realm of Realm, using it for sharing minutes, agendas and other communications. More groups are also discovering Realm. For instance, the Media Ministry volunteers for the contemporary worship service, and Women's Ministries have started using it.

How about you? Have you considered using Realm for yourself, your committees or groups? There are four benefits for using Realm:

- Giving: Set up your online giving via Realm. It's easy to set up, and easy to use and change.
 Starting in 2020, Realm will be the only way to give recurring gifts online to Tab.
- 2. Personal: When life circumstances change (e.g.,

- address, phone, births), update your own church records via Realm.
- 3. Directory: As Tab members join Realm, the church directory gets populated. Remember, folks will only see what information you want to be seen.
- 4. Community: Connect with the church-wide family, do committee and group business, send messages, chat, email, all within Realm. If you don't want to receive notifications or you're worried about getting overwhelmed with communication, just set Realm to give you fewer notices.

The church office has sent you an email invitation to join Realm. So far, more than 155 of your fellow Tab members have joined. Follow the link in the email to create your Realm account and password. Then, follow the steps to verify your account.
