# Pastoral Reflection

---

## I Have Been "Birging"

Dear Friends,

Are you familiar with the term "birging?" It is an acronym for "Basking In Reflective Glory." It might be the kind of joy or pride a parent gets when their child performs well in school or sports, whether the parent had anything to do with the child's accomplishment or not.

Well, I have been "BIRGING" on Tab stories (past, present and future) a lot in the past month.

On the Thursday evening before Labor Day, I represented Tab at the launch gathering for a new ministry we are supporting in the city called "New City Fellows." This ministry is designed to raise up and train young professionals and help them integrate their faith and work lives. Tab members Caryn Costlow and Kat Gering are part of the first class of "fellows." During the program, I was invited to pray over this inaugural class, and as I was being introduced, David Bell, the founder of the ministry, spoke eloquently about Tab's history of launching and supporting ministries in the city. While I had nothing to do with the founding of any of these ministries, by representing Tab, I was "birging."

The following week Kristin and I were invited to attend a dinner celebrating the 25th Anniversary of the Raphael Health Center in their new community room. It was a wonderful gathering of Raphael supporters past and present, many of whom are Tab members. It was inspirational to hear how the center came into being as a group of physicians at Tab responded to the vision of Dr. Frank Kik as he preached from the Tab pulpit. We heard stories from early staff members, from patients who have been served, from a physician who currently serves there and from the present CEO, Sherry Gray. Each story was personal, touching and inspirational. I was then invited to come forward, not to speak, but to bear witness to a proclamation given by Councilman Greg Porter designating that day "Raphael Health Center Day." Again, I was "birging."

This past week we had about 70 church musicians, plus clinicians from around the country come to Tab for the Sacred Music Symposium. For three days the building was filled with beautiful music and our guests enjoyed good Tab hospitality. I can't begin to tell you how many people made a point to thank me for the welcome they received, for the quality of the program, for the beauty of the building, for the depth and breadth of our ministry and outreach and so on. Of course, I graciously accepted their thanks and words of encouragement all the while knowing that the credit for the Symposium goes to Matt Kauffman and the incredible team of leaders and volunteers he put together, as well as to the staff and hundreds of YOU who faithfully carry out our mission and ministry each and every day, year in and year out. Once again, I was "birging" - basking in the reflective glory of Tab.

So, let me thank you for the wonderful work you do and for your faithful and generous support of our ministry, both in terms of your volunteering, and your financial support. Let me also thank you for "getting" the reason we do the ministries we do. It was evident in every one of those settings and conversations that we understand "why" we are doing what we do...in response to God's great call and claim on our lives through Jesus Christ.

We are called to be the light of Christ to the world which means we all get to "birge" as we "reflect" His glory!

# Tab Welcomes New Director of Missions!

**W**e are delighted to welcome Terri as our Director of Missions! She retired in May after eight years as the Pastor at First Presbyterian (FPC) Church of Lebanon, Indiana. While Terri had been planning to retire for some time, she had not planned to immediately go into part-time missions work until she heard about Tab's Mission Director position. At FPC, she worked alongside the long-time preschool director who oversaw the daily operations of the award-winning preschool. In addition, Terri initiated a food ministry at FPC. It was an outdoor summer community meal held for six weeks each summer modeled similarly to Open Door, but on a much smaller scale. Terri also personally handled the community benevolence program similar to Tab's. During her tenure in Lebanon, she was very active in the community, including serving as the chaplain for the Lebanon Police Department. Prior to going

into the ministry, Terri was a management consultant. In this role, she developed the top-notch organizational abilities required to maintain and manage contacts and relationships.

In talking with Terri, you will learn that she has a passion for outreach in all of its forms. She described her approach to outreach as being "rooted in the hard work of relationship building." She says that the position at Tab appealed to her because it also seems to value relationship building. "It seems to be an excellent opportunity to help encourage, equip, and empower missionaries as they identify passion-driven opportunities for service," she states. "It is my belief that when Christ's followers are serving from our passion, we not only make God's love known, we grow closer to God and to each other in the process." She describes her style as "listening first, then a doer."

Terri is a Purdue graduate (industrial engineering) and holds a Master's of Divinity from the Christian Theological Seminary. Terri had connections with members of Tab before she joined the staff. Bob Donaldson speaks very highly of Terri, as his family considers First Pres to be their home church. They consider Terri to be a dear family friend, and Terri was especially close to Bob's father in his final days. Mary Mills also knows Terri, as she taught Terri's son and daughter.

Terri met her husband, Rob, when they were both students at Purdue.

They have been married for 33 years and have two grown children. Rob is a Sales Engineer for Gema USA, Inc. Their daughter, Julia, lives in Louisville and is finishing a Master's Degree in Social Work. Terri and Rob lived in Zionsville for many years. Their son, Mark, lives in Indianapolis and works for Ernst and Young.

In looking at her new role at Tab, Terri shared the following thoughts:

"We serve a God of relationships. The Trinity is a model of relationships. It takes the relationships to make the whole of God. We can't be God's people without relationship with each other. Authentic relationship building takes time, vulnerability and willingness."

# Insights into IRAs and Charitable Giving

If you're age 70½ or older, you may be able to take advantage of an important incentive for charitable giving. Congress has permanently authorized the provision that allows individuals to make gifts of up to \$100,000 per year from their IRA accounts to one or more charities, without first incurring income tax on the withdrawal. This means that you can direct that amount to Tab or the Tab Endowment with no federal income tax liability. The IRA Rollover may provide you with an excellent opportunity to make a gift during your lifetime from an asset that would be subject to multiple levels of taxation if it remained in your taxable estate.

Now, there are some details and restrictions:

- You must be 70½ or older when you make your gift, and the gift must be made from an IRA - no other retirement plans (such as 401k, 403b or SEP accounts) qualify.
- If you file a joint tax return, your spouse can also make a charitable contribution of up to \$100,000, meaning couples can exclude up to \$200,000 of their retirement savings from income tax if they donate it to charity.
- Your gift must come to us outright - it cannot be used to establish a life-income arrangement or support a donor-advised fund.
- Although the distribution will be free from income tax, it will

not generate an income tax charitable deduction.

- There are other details which we'll be happy to guide you through.

An IRA charitable contribution also satisfies the annual minimum distribution requirement for your IRA. You can donate part of your required distribution to charity and withdraw the rest of it as retirement income as long as you meet the minimum distribution requirement by the end of the calendar year.
