Pastoral Reflection

Have You Made Arrangements?

Dear Friends,

I want to wish you a Happy New Year filled with the fullness of God's joy and blessings!

Just when you thought you were finished with the "gift-giving" season, I have one more "gift" I'd like to suggest that you give to your family members or whoever it will be who will take care of your affairs when you are gone: a funeral planning form. (Not quite as exciting as a new widescreen TV, is it?)

You know I have encouraged you to do this in the past and the beginning of the new year seems to be the perfect time to remind you again.

Quite candidly, funeral planning is difficult in that there are a lot of decisions that need to be made at a time when those being asked to make them feel least capable of doing so. I could tell you of numerous conversations I have had with family members or friends of a recently deceased loved one who has said, either, "I am so glad mom let us know exactly what she wanted" or conversely, "I wish dad had let us know what he wanted."

I have also had numerous conversations with individuals or couples through the years who once they have completed their funeral arrangement forms have said, "I feel such a sense of relief now. That has been sitting on my desk for months!"

Included in this Chimes is a copy of the Funeral Arrangement Form we use at Tab. You can download it or pick up a hard copy at church. You will see questions there that whoever it is that will be taking care of your affairs will want to know, and perhaps some questions that you aren't yet sure of yourself, but are important for you to think about. Funeral service or memorial? Casket or cremation? Favorite hymns and Scripture lessons? Designation of memorial gifts given in your name? And on and on. There are a lot of things to consider.

Once you've completed the form, return it to the Front Office. We will make a copy/copies for you and then keep the original in your family file at Tab. If you have questions that you'd like to talk with either Oscar or me about as you fill out the form, feel free to give either of us a call.

Filling out a funeral arrangement form hardly seems like a very great gift, does it? But it really is a wonderful gift that will be greatly appreciated by whoever it is that will be making decisions for you after you are gone.

I look forward to worshipping with you this Sunday and throughout the new year!

Fresh Stop Produce is a ministry of Tab that brings locally-grown fresh produce and grass-fed beef to people of all income levels. The sliding-scale pricing makes fresh, organic produce affordable at half the price. Below is a testimonial written by one of the regular patrons of Fresh Stop Produce. "I thank God, Sally John, and volunteers from Tab for investing themselves in the well-being of my life through the Fresh Stop ministry. Fresh Stop has nourished my mind, body and spirit as my eyes have been opened to God as Creator and keeper of His children. Being disabled with medical issues including heart disease, high blood pressure, insulin resistance, obesity, and connective tissue disease, I have found living in a 'food desert' daunting; as pain, fatigue and transportation constraints limited my ability to shop for healthy foods. Ordering groceries online meant paying well over what I could afford and I didn't always receive the correct items.

Through Fresh Stop, I received wonderful assortments of brightly colored vegetables that are at a price I can afford and the cooking demonstrations were a great motivation for getting on a healthy eating track. Reading about God giving manna in the wilderness and Daniel's refusal to eat the king's rich food convicted my heart. Because I know I have health issues related to poor quality food, I have even more responsibility to make every effort to eat better. Fresh Stop has helped in ways that still remain to be seen, but currently, I have staved off Type 2 Diabetes and the weight I have lost has stayed off. I noticed that processed/prepared foods made me starved and ravenous and the healthier Fresh Stop vegetables and wonderful recipes that come with the food satisfy my appetite.

It is a tremendous blessing to buy beef that is free of hormones and antibiotics, which I was told by a nutritionist contribute to obesity and cancer. With cooking shows, food commercials and podcasts, we live in a food culture that enjoys food as entertainment, and fortunately, there are programs that educate; as does Fresh Stop - that God gave us food to nourish and to heal, as well as to enjoy. Fresh Stop has a delightful social atmosphere as I have shared other peoples' excitement about the ministry and healthy eating as it grows my mind, body and spirit. I had the thrilling experience of seeing Brussels sprouts on the stalk for the first time. My prior experience with Brussels sprouts was frozen in a plastic bag, while here before me was a God-created sculpture and I marveled at what an artist is our Creator. Just as 'form follows function,' off popped a Brussels sprout beckoning me to taste. I chomped down and the Brussels sprout bit back with a unique crisp taste that would make a great slaw - yummy!! I crunched and savored the flavor, anticipating when my 'edible sculpture' would become a nutritious and savory meal. Thank you very much for Fresh Stop!!"

A Room With A View

Every day, as I walk into work, I wonder if today will be the day that folks suddenly realize that they've given the best office in the building to the newest person on staff. Yes, I fully expect that the day will come when someone will tell me there's been a mistake; however, until then, I cherish the blessing of being able to bask in the morning sunlight as it streams through the many windows in my "corner office with a view."

And, may I just say, what a view it is! From where I sit I can see one of the busier intersections in the neighborhood (34th and Central): buses and parents bringing kids to and from School 48; folks gathering at the IndyGo bus stop to make their way to places I've yet to discover; neighbors chatting and laughing at the gazebo of Constitution Gardens; and many of my newest friends walking up the sidewalk toward the Open Door entrance. I can also see the emergency vehicles running past with lights and sirens, as well as the dozens of vehicles that make their way in and out of the Tab parking lot each day. In fact, there is so much activity to take in that one may wonder how I get anything accomplished from my office.

This would be a good question, I think, if I had a normal "desk job." But, thanks be to God, I do not! Best of all, I experience this position as one of dreaming and envisioning what it looks like to live in the realm of God here and now in our neighborhood, as well as discovering faithful, compassionate ways to invite others to do the same.

Still, as unstructured as my job may seem, most days in that corner office begin with the same routine. I start by just looking out the window - taking in glimpses of the neighborhood - and pray for God's light to shine upon us all. Then, as I begin to process the items on my calendar, I pause to look out those glorious windows one more time, eyes landing on the beautiful stone marker and ask myself, "How does this (thing I am about to do) foster Greater Faith, Deeper Relationships or Stronger Communities? This question has become the guiding mantra as I get to serve as your mission director.



Friends, Tab is blessed with many folks who are willing to view themselves through the window of, "How do I contribute to Greater Faith, Deeper Relationships or Stronger Community?" I am excited for the opportunity to get to work alongside such faithful servants in 2020. It's my hope that we will use this space in the Chimes to highlight what we are "seeing" in around our neighborhood. Please, feel free to stop by the best office in the building and share the stories with me. I look forward to hearing them...and we can look out the windows together!
