# Pastoral Reflection

# Let The Good News Go Viral!

Dear Friends,

Never, in my wildest imagination, could I ever have imagined canceling "in-person" worship, much less for eight weeks, particularly so during Holy Week and Easter! Yet, this is exactly what we have done and I am confident that the decisions we have been directed and encouraged to make are good ones.

We are making every effort to communicate and connect with you and to provide you with meaningful worship experiences. Each Sunday we are worshiping together at 10:00 a.m. via "live streaming" at tabpres.org. If you can't make it then; those services are also available at tabpres.org/live, also on YouTube at tabindy and can be watched at your convenience."We will also "live stream" services on:

Live stream - Palm Sunday, April 5, at 10:00 a.m.

Live stream - Maundy Thursday, April 9, at 7:00 p.m.

Live stream - Good Friday, April 10, at 7:00 p.m.

Live stream - Easter Sunday, April 12, at 10:00 a.m.

Let me reflect with you for a moment about something I am thinking about as I consider celebrating Easter without gathering as the church family.

As we read the Gospel narratives, the final days of Jesus' ministry are in the presence of a remarkably few number of people. After Palm Sunday the crowds begin to diminish and Jesus is focused almost exclusively on His chosen twelve. Not the mandatory ten, but the twelve of them gathered with Him to share the Last Supper. On Good Friday, as He prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane, He took with Him only three, Peter, James and John; His inner circle became increasingly smaller. At the time of His arrest He was denied, abandoned and isolated, and on the cross, He suffered and died alone.

Three days later, on the Easter morning, only a very few women went to the tomb to finish the necessary work of His burial. That would have appeared to be the end of the story.

BUT what they discovered there, an empty tomb, changed the trajectory of the story and the whole course of human history!

The news those women took away from the gravesite, that JESUS IS ALIVE, literally went VIRAL!

The few told the Good News to the some,

Jesus appeared to the 11 and then to a gathering of hundreds,

Peter preached to the crowds on the Day of Pentecost and 3000 people came to faith,

And on and on, the Good News continued to be told until it came to our hearing! Friends, if death could not stop this Good News, neither can a pandemic.

We have Good News to celebrate and to share...so let it go VIRAL!

# Meet Greg and Kathy Miller

Native Hoosiers Greg and Kathy Miller met at Ball State University. Kathy was working on her master's degree in biology, and Greg was in his first year of medical school. After a brief stint in Cincinnati for work after college, Kathy returned to Indiana to marry Greg, and they began their life together here.

Following residency, Greg opened a pathology laboratory, and she and Greg worked together for many years. Along the way, they welcomed their four children - Justin, Ryan, Samantha and Kyle - and they made their home in the Meridian Kessler neighborhood just north of Mapleton-Fall Creek. In their desire to connect to a neighborhood church, the Millers joined Tab in 1996. Their kids were all baptized at Tab, participated in Tab Recreation and TabYouth, and their son Ryan and his wife, Ruth, are now also members of Tab.

Early on, Kathy had a heart for mission work at Tab. She and Greg were particularly drawn to the mission work of Michael and Kay Johnson. The Johnsons were doing medical work in Kenya through World Gospel Mission, a Tab-supported global mission program. In particular, the medical aspect of this mission work appealed to them, and they took their first trip to Kenya in 1999. Greg and Kathy became personal friends with Michael and Kay along the way. (The Johnsons have since transitioned their mission work to their current home of Philadelphia and work at Miriam Medical Clinic.)

In 2007, the Global Interfaith Partnership began as an interfaith outreach in Kenya and is now known as the Umoja Partnership. The key goal of Tab's support of Umoja is to provide food for orphan and vulnerable children and keep them in school. Kathy's involvement with this organization continues to this day, as she serves on the Board of Directors for Umoja. She has been to Kenya four times, and Greg has traveled with her on three of those trips. In 2012, John Gable visited the Umoja Project as part of an interfaith leadership team. Upon his return, Tab hosted its first A-maizing Lunch as a fundraiser and informational event to support Umoja. Tab continues to host A-maizing Lunch events each year.

Kathy and Greg just returned from their most recent trip to Kenya, along with Tab members Dave Streit, Joyce and Jeff Peipert, and Marsha Robinson. While the trip always offers a good opportunity to see our mission dollars "in action," Greg sees as a true, lasting value of visiting Kenya: Meeting the people involved with Umoja - including administrative personnel, teachers and students - offers the opportunity for genuine relationships. Greg noted that this is something of great value to the people within Umoja, and it has offered a particular blessing in return to him and Kathy.

Back home in Indiana, Greg continues in his medical work as an urgent care physician with Franciscan Health. Kathy is enjoying retirement, but she helps with childcare for their two grandchildren, Reese and Levi who often join them for worship on Sunday mornings. They are looking forward to the birth of their third grandchild in June, as Ryan and Ruth are expecting their first child.

# Tab Team In Kenya

From February 15 to March 2, a group from Tab visited western Kenya to observe the work of the Umoja Partnership. Greg and Kathy Miller, Joyce and Jeff Peipert, Marsha Robinson and Dave Streit accompanied Denise Soltis, Executive Director of Umoja (US), and her husband Bob on the trip. There the group visited schools, homes and churches to witness the work, encourage the incredible Kenyan staff, and deepen the relationships between Tab and the Umoja Partnership. The group also visited Ampath Medical Facilities in Eldoret and had time to do some sightseeing.

The most visible work of Umoja is feeding thousands of school children who otherwise do not have access to a decent meal and help keep them in school. The program's objective is much more comprehensive and includes empowerment programs for girls and boys, support of schools in their missions and creating a web of care for the children in partnership with local communities.

# A Room With A View

Today the view from the best office in the building reveals a lot less activity in the neighborhood. It seems that folks are heeding the advice of experts and creating the recommended preventative social distance during the Covid-19 crisis. While this is clearly a gesture of communal goodness, it still feels a bit lonely around here right now. The important thing to remember, though, is that even though we are apart, we know that we are all in this together; and more importantly, we are not alone. God is with us.

When you think about it, it really is somewhat of a paradox that being apart from one another also has the power to create a sense of real togetherness. Yet, it is happening all across the globe - from Italians serenading each other from the safe space of their balconies to pastors in empty sanctuaries proclaiming the gospel to congregations via technology. Despite the quarantines, closures and separations, people are finding creative ways to connect and be "together."

I believe this "apart but together" paradox is possible because at the heart of the sacrificial act of social distancing is love...love which draws us near to God and to one another. It is love that inspires us to set aside our personal needs for the good of the whole and as a result, it is love that is spread farther, wider and deeper than any virus ever could.

A vision of this paradox is evident in the work of global missionaries. Many of them willingly, and sacrificially, distance themselves from family and friends, for the sake of God's love. Now, in their case, the distance isn't for protection from anything. In fact, they leave home to go toward those in need. Still, there is a sense of "separation" as they head to other places and they are missed very much by those back home. As a result of their willingness to set aside some of their own needs for the good of the gospel, love is spread far, wide, and deep across the miles.

As a way of lifting up our global missionaries who may be far away from the corner of 34th and Central, but are never far from our hearts, the Missions Committee has designated global missions the prayer focus for April. Each week in Tab's weekly email, and the worship bulletin when possible, we will introduce you to missionaries that Tab formally sponsors, sharing about their work and

offering suggestions for prayer. Our hope is that despite the distance between us, we will be drawn closer to them and to each other as love grows among us.

To be clear, there will be many lessons learned from this global health crisis, but the one that comes to my mind right now is one that has been heard for decades by children all around the world:

It's a world of laughter

A world of tears;

It's a world of hopes

And a world of fears.

There's so much that we share

That it's time we're aware

It's a small world after all.
