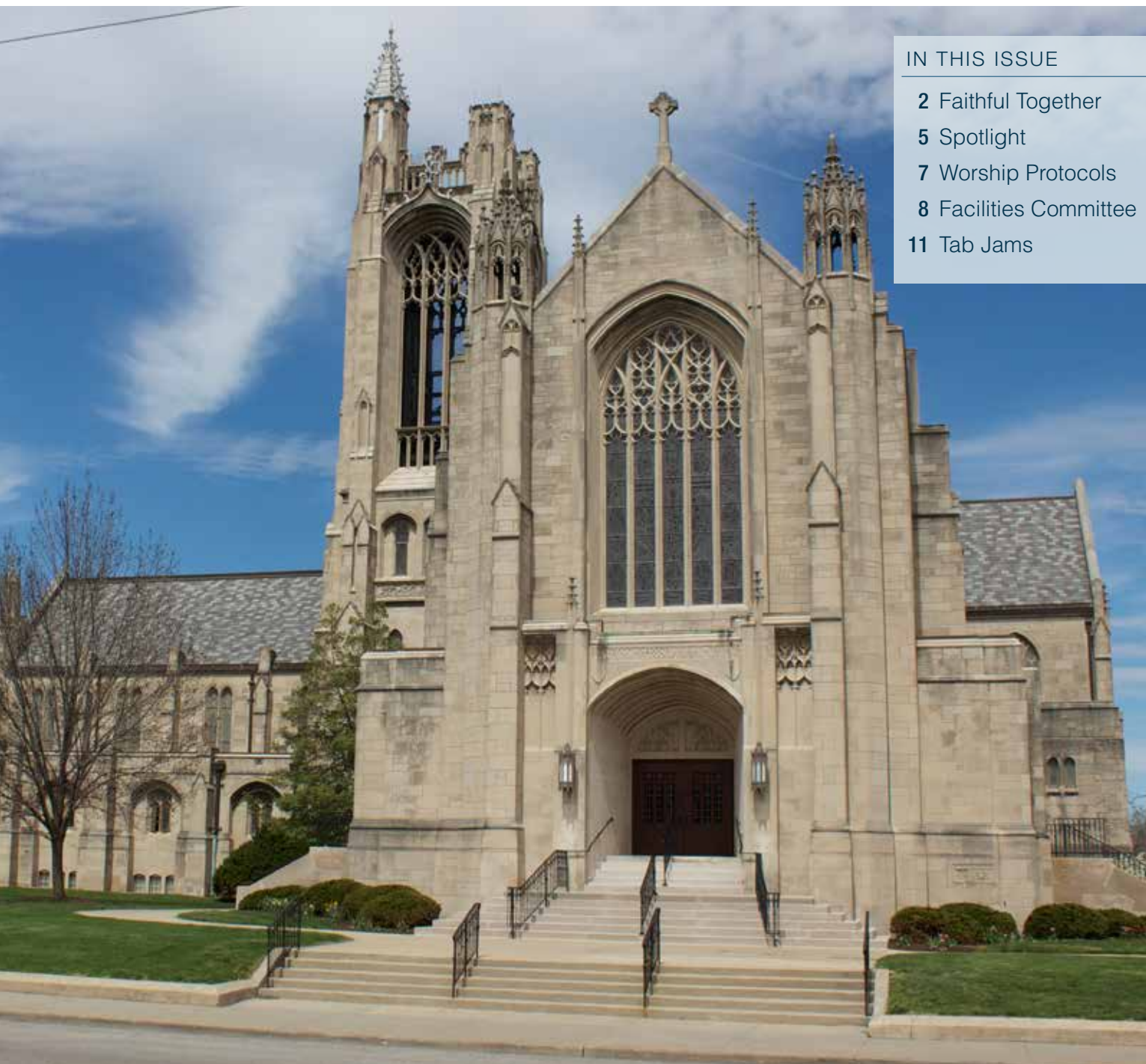

# Pastoral Reflection

## Seeking To Be Faithful Together

Dear Friends,

We are living in anxious and uncertain times. Adding to the tension is the “noise” we read and hear on social media, 24 hour news channels, even emanating from those we feel closest to. You name the issue, and you will likely find someone you know well and love much who vehemently disagrees with the position you also feel strongly about. I remind you, one of the foundational principles of being a Presbyterian is “that persons of good character and principle may differ.”

So how do we navigate these tumultuous waters? Or more plainly put, how do we engage in civil conversations?

In 1992 the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church USA adopted a statement which I have found very helpful titled - *Seeking To Be Faithful Together: Guidelines for Presbyterians During Times of Disagreement*. I offer it to you now.

**In a spirit of trust and love, we promise we will...**

*Give them a hearing...Listen before we answer*  
John 7:51; Proverbs 18:13

- 1. Treat each other respectfully so as to build trust, believing that we all desire to be faithful to Jesus Christ;**

we will keep our conversations and communications open for candid and forthright exchange, we will not ask questions or make statements in a way which will intimidate or judge others.

- 2. Learn about various positions on the topic of disagreement.**

- 3. State what we think we heard and ask for clarification before responding in an effort to be sure we understand each other.**

*Speak the truth in love*  
Ephesians 4:15

- 4. Share our concerns directly with individuals or groups with whom we have disagreements in a spirit of love and respect in keeping with Jesus’ teaching.**

- 5. Focus on ideas and suggestions instead of questioning peoples’ motives, intelligence or integrity;**

we will not engage in name-calling or labeling of others prior to, during, or following the discussion.

- 6. Share our personal experiences about the subject of disagreement so that others may more fully understand our concerns.**

*Maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace*  
Ephesians 4:3

- 7. Indicate where we agree with those of other viewpoint as well as where we disagree.**

- 8. Seek to stay in community with each other though the discussion may be vigorous and full of tension;**

*We will be ready to forgive and be forgiven.*

- 9. Follow these additional guidelines when we meet in decision-making bodies;**

Urge persons of various points of view to speak and promise to listen to these position seriously;

Seek conclusions informed by our points of agreement;

Be sensitive to the feelings and concerns of those who do not agree with the majority and respect their rights of conscience;

Abide by the decision of the majority, and if we disagree with it and wish to change it, work for that change in ways which are consistent with these guidelines.

- 10. Include our disagreements in our prayers, not praying for the triumph of our viewpoints, but seeking God’s grace to listen attentively, to speak clearly, and to remain open to the vision God holds for us all.**

The various issues we are being faced with are critical ones, so we must be willing to address them full on. But in doing so let us commit to being a people who will “agree to disagree agreeably” or as one has said, “Let us be careful that, in our attempt to slay dragons, we do not become dragons ourselves.”

“See you” in worship.

# Missions Report

## Welcoming Old Friends

The view out the window of the best office in the building is quite uplifting, even in the midst of a pandemic. It is good to see that there are many more people out and about, and most of them are wearing face-coverings. It feels as if the neighborhood is finding a new normal which allows us to lean into the uncertainty of these days with renewed hope.

At Tab, we are also finding ways to gather at a distance and reconnect to each other's lives in a genuine way. A sign of this reconnection shows up on the east side of our building every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 11:00 a.m. until noon. This is the hour that Open Door is open for carry-out meals.

Like many food establishments, traffic was slow when we first reopened on May 27. We were disappointed to not see a lot of our "regulars," but we also understood their hesitation to be out and about.

Thankfully, over the past few weeks, familiar faces have returned. What a joy it is to be able to see our neighbors even though our mutual smiles are hidden behind masks, and to be reassured that we are all well! This past week we were pleased to consistently serve meals in quantities close to our "summer normal" and to see a few more "regulars" make their way back to our door.

Now, this is not to say that we desire to see more hungry people coming our way. Hunger and food insecurity will always be a cause for lament. What we celebrate, and what brings me joy, is that friends, old and new, are back together again, six-feet apart, outside, with masks, for a few minutes. It's not ideal, but it is real.

We wonder what will happen as the weather turns cold again, but for now, we have chosen to enjoy the blessing of these brief carry-out encounters. To help mitigate the oppressive summer heat, we've added a few tables in the shade of the courtyard where folks, appropriately distanced with masks, can rest and share stories.

Speaking for the staff and volunteers, it does our souls good to see the folks we have missed. We cherish the holy moments into which we are invited by our Open Door



friends; to hear their stories of pandemic survival; to share tears of grief over those who died since we last gathered; to remember the 'good ole days;' to wrestle with the impact of racism in America; to bear each other's heartfelt joys and concern; to praise God for answered prayers and to laugh together at age-old jokes.

This summer, when I look out my office window, I not only see the Open Door in operation and reminders that relationships are what matters most, I also gaze upon a sidewalk and lawn which, beneath the feet of our neighbors gathered, are transformed into the hallowed grounds of the Church. And, I realize just how much I have missed it.

## Meet the Williams Family



A few years ago, Dan and Katharyn Williams, along with their son, Weston, were in search of a new church home. While Kathy grew up in the Methodist tradition, Dan grew as part of the Catholic church. They attended a variety of different churches before joining Tab in late 2017.

A native of Kokomo, Kathy attended Purdue University and studied nursing. Dan was born in Iowa, but his family moved to Clinton, Indiana, and then to Zionsville as a part of his father's job changes in working for Eli Lilly. Dan graduated from Miami of Ohio and originally planned to attend medical school. However, he took a job opportunity in sales with Eli Lilly, and Dan revised his plans, resulting in a long and successful sales career.

Kathy and Dan met on a blind date set up by mutual friends. They were married 28 years ago at the Culver Academy where Kathy spent many summers during her childhood.

Dan and Kathy openly share their long journey with infertility and the impact that their faith in God had in sustaining them through these years. After the very difficult loss of twins late in one pregnancy, they joyfully welcomed their son, Weston. At 17, Weston is a now junior at Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School. He has been involved in several sports there, including golf, lacrosse and cross-country.

Family life is a top priority for the Williams family. Kathy's parents still live in her hometown of Kokomo, and together the family shares a lake home at Lake Maxinkuckee. Dan's parents are retired and living on Sanibel Island, and the family regularly visits with them, also. Sadly, Kathy's best friend and sister, Teri Lambert, unexpectedly passed away in early 2019. Her loss is still deeply felt by the family, but Kathy and her parents have found great peace in witnessing Teri's deep and abiding faith in God.

Kathy continues to work in the nursing field, though she took a break during Weston's younger years. She is a perioperative nurse for Meridian Plastic Surgery. In this role, Kathy works occasionally with fellow Tab member, Dr. Mark Hamilton.

In 2017, Dan took an opportunity to retire early from Eli Lilly. After much discernment, Dan enrolled in Fuller Theological Seminary to pursue a master's degree in Theology. While Fuller is based in Pasadena, California, Dan has been able to pursue his degree online. Dan is excited for the coming fall where he will begin his Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) at Ascension St. Vincent Hospital. In yet another "Tab connection," Dan will be working under the direction of Tab member, Jim Pfeiffer. ### PROTOCOLS FOR MEETINGS

As we continue moving toward our "new normal," we have resumed opening the Tab facility for official **Tab committee meetings only**. Room availability will be limited as we follow social distancing guidelines so it will be important to check with your Elder or Staff Liaison to make sure when your meetings are scheduled and where you will be meeting. Masks will be required for all persons entering the building for any reason, including committee meetings. Committees will also have the option of continuing to meet online during this time. If you have any questions, please contact Matt Kauffman 317-923-5458, ext 102 or check the online calendar which is updated as information is received. Thanks for your cooperation and understanding during this time of transition.

### OFFICE/WEEKDAY PROTOCOLS

Please note that the Tab church offices are open from 8:30a to 4:30p Monday through Thursday and 8:30a to 3:00p on Friday. Please understand that access to the building will be limited to staff and those with appointments only. Please note that all persons entering the building must wear a mask. If you have an appointment and need to enter the building, please ring the bell at the parking lot entrance and someone will assist you momentarily.

### PROTOCOLS FOR WORSHIP

As we begin to offer an "in person" worship option, there are several precautions we are taking in order to ensure personal safety and social distancing.

Important Note: In order to accommodate appropriate social distancing needs, attendance at this service will be limited to the first 80 people who register to attend.

How do I register to attend?

Register to attend by emailing Paula Daum at [paula.daum@tabpres.org](mailto:paula.daum@tabpres.org) or by calling (317) 923-5458 x104. Please indicate the specific number of adults and children attending from your family if you are registering for yourself, your spouse and/or children. If attendance reaches capacity prior to receipt of your request to attend, you will be notified as quickly as possible. If attendance limits are reached, we will also send out an e-mail announcement to let everyone know that registration is closed.

As a reminder, worship attendance precautions include:

- All worshippers, ushers, media volunteers and staff must wear masks – no exceptions.
- All worshippers will be seated practicing social distancing from the center aisle.
- For the safety of everyone, there will be no congregational singing of hymns or worship songs.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at all entrances to the Sanctuary.
- Entry to the Sanctuary will be through the 34th Street entrance only. The parking lot entrance will be available ONLY for those needing to use the elevator. Please feel free to use the Raphael Health Center parking lot.
- Paper bulletins will be available. Feel free to print your own bulletin from our website at home and bring it with you if you would like. Please do not share printed copies with others.
- A collection plate will be located in the Narthex for depositing any offering gifts. We will not be passing an offering plate during the service.
- Exterior and Sanctuary doors will remain open to allow for maximum air flow.
- Dismissal following worship will take place using the side aisles in a row-by-row process beginning at the rear of the Sanctuary. Exit is available through the east Sanctuary doors, as well as the 34th St. doors.
- One usher will be at the parking lot door to assist those needing the elevator.
- The only restroom available for use is the single restroom behind the Sanctuary.
- We request that worshippers refrain from clustering on the front steps or front sidewalk or anywhere that may affect socially distanced passage either before or following the worship service.
- The Administrative hallways and Session Room are only open to staff.
- Do not attend "in person" worship - if you:
  - Are in a "high risk group" (age 65 and over) and have a high-risk or significant underlying health condition, have a fever, sore throat, or ANY symptoms of active infection, or have been exposed to anyone testing POSITIVE for Covid-19 within the last 14 days
- Online worship WILL continue to be available on Tab's YouTube page.
