# Pastoral Reflection

## Gratitude for Giving

Dear Friends,

It is always interesting to me that in the normal cycle of church life the stewardship appeal in support of the church's operating budget always falls in the same month as Thanksgiving, as if the two (giving and giving thanks) are somehow, inextricably, related.

Our stewardship theme this year is "Gratitude for Giving." This, too, has a double meaning. First and foremost, we are grateful to God for His gracious and generous provision to us AND we are also grateful to you, the members and friends of Tab, for your generous giving in support of our mission and ministry.

As an expression of our faith, OUR giving is in response to GOD'S giving, so we are, quite literally, "Giving in Thanks!"

It has been said that "a grateful heart extends a generous hand" and that has certainly been true at Tab. We are and have been a very faithful and generous congregation, so, citing Paul's message to the Philippians, we encourage you to "keep on doing what you have been doing." (Philippians 4:9)

As we have reported in the third quarter contribution letter we are currently running about \$60,000 behind in income to expenses. The Session and staff have done a remarkable job living well beneath our means by cutting costs and expense, so given that we are in the midst of a pandemic, with relatively few people participating in "in-person" worship, and coming off of the summer months, we believe we are in really good shape financially. Even since that third-quarter letter went out that gap has been narrowed as people have contributed to their pledge and even made additional gifts. Thank you!

Now as we look toward the 2021 operating budget we are asking you to:

- 1. Join us for the congregational meeting on Sunday, November 1, at 10:45 am, either in person or virtually, during which we will explain in greater detail where we stand financially year to date, income to expenses, and discuss the 2021 budget, as well as elect new elders, deacons and Endowment Fund trustees.
- Read and review the materials you will be receiving in the mail regarding the 2021
   Stewardship program and watch the videos we have produced (YouTube/Tabindy) which
   further explain all the ministries and programs and facility improvements that have been
   done during this time of separation. We have carried on our ministry and mission albeit in
   new and creative ways.
- 3. Finally, that you prayerfully consider your pledge of financial support for 2021 and return your commitment card to the church office on or before Dedication Sunday, November 22

Please know how grateful we are to God and you for the support and provision we have been given for our ministry and mission at 34th and Central.

# Meet Kevin & Tom Ahearn

ne thing that you discover when you get to know the members of Tab is that the connections between our Tab family members run deep. This is certainly true as I took the time to get to know Kevin and Tom Ahearn better.

Kevin and his brothers, Mark (also a member of Tab, along with his wife, Beth) and David, grew up in Indianapolis. At age 11 at Public School #106, Tab member, Sara Heitman, was one of Kevin's teachers. When he worked at a Boy Scout summer camp at age 14, Kevin first met Dan Hursh of our congregation, and the two have remained friends to this day.

Kevin is a graduate of Arlington High School and Purdue University (BA, French), and he found his niche in computer work early on. He worked for IBM for a time and lived in both Charleston and Morgantown, West Virginia. His employment with Digital Equipment (working with Joe Kukolla) brought him back to Indianapolis in 1986. Self-employment has given Kevin quite a bit of flexibility, which is evident from the list of things that he does in serving at Tab. Currently a Deacon, Kevin serves as the Home Communion Coordinator for Tab's shut-ins. When home communion was halted as a result of the pandemic, Kevin partnered with Dave Streit to "burn" CDs of "Sunday with Tab," the 30 minute weekly broadcast of our sermon which airs at 6:30 am on Sundays on WIBC 93.1FM radio. These CDs along with bulletins and notes, get mailed to Tab members who are unable to access worship through our YouTube live stream.

Both Kevin and Tom have been active members in the Saturday morning Men's Bible Study. In addition, they have been quietly serving behind the scenes for the Open Door Soup Kitchen. Tab receives supplies from Gleaners each month in order to provide food supplies for Open Door. Kevin and Tom have been part of the "receiving" team in moving the hundreds of pounds of food each month from the parking lot door to the kitchen storage areas. You can also find Kevin at the audio station in the Sanctuary on some Sunday mornings, serving as a media team volunteer.

During their time worshipping at a Zionsville church, Tom and Kevin became acquainted with Fort Wilderness www.fortwilderness.com, a Christian camp located in the North Woods of Wisconsin. Open year-round, the camp is designed for both youth and families. Tom has spent many summers at the camp, both as a camper and a staff member. Kevin and Tom are huge fans of the camp and look forward to future visits. They would love for other members of the Tab family to have the opportunity to experience the camp as well. It's a long drive, but so worth it.

# Mozel Sanders Thanksgiving Dinner 2020

eeping the Mozel Sanders Thanksgiving Meal tradition in the midst of a pandemic has become a challenge for the organizers of this great community effort, particularly since COVID-19 precautions at Butler University preclude the use of their commercial kitchen this year. As a result, the Mozel Sanders Foundation is recruiting new satellite kitchen sites similar to Tab's to help prepare to-go meals. In addition, all current partner sites are being asked to increase their production in an effort to make up for the loss of those dinners typically prepared at the central location at Butler.

So, what does all of this mean for the annual Mozel Sanders Dinner on Thanksgiving Day at Tab? First and foremost, it means we will respond with a stepped-up meal production. In fact, we plan to nearly double our typical meal count by providing somewhere between 1500 - 2000 dinners. It also means that our annual event will undergo some necessary changes.

This Thanksgiving we will scale back our hospitality efforts in order to focus on the extra meal preparation while still promoting public health safety. Sadly, this means we will not offer "commodity" bags, nor will we invite guests into the building for pie, coffee and conversation. Furthermore, we will NOT run deliveries from our kitchen. There will be no need for pie donations from the congregation, and we will deploy our volunteers differently.

The specific volunteer needs are still being configured, but we anticipate that the operation will only require approximately ten "hands-on" volunteer positions including: assisting with food prep, dishing food into to-go containers, washing dishes, bagging the meals, and distributing to our neighbors from the portico. More information about specific volunteer opportunities and duties, including shifts for service, will be forthcoming in early November. Please note, all volunteers will be expected to follow Tab's coronavirus safety precautions

including social distancing and wearing masks at all times. Finally, we do not foresee opportunities for children to serve this year.

While this is understandably disappointing for Tab family members who include serving at the Mozel Sanders Dinner as part of their Thanksgiving tradition, it is, truly, the very best way we can assist the Sanders family this year. They need us to provide meals to be picked up in a safe, low-contact drive-thru manner in our parking lot and to prepare additional ones to be taken to Butler for similar distribution from there. So, with gladness, we will.

With gratitude for all who have served in years past, we look forward to returning to our "norm" in 2021!

# Blessed to Be a Blessing

his morning, the view from the best office in the building looks very cold and dreary - a reminder that winter weather is on the way. It is also a reminder that winter always poses unique challenges for some of our Open Door neighbors but maybe even more so this year. Thankfully, due to the generosity of our congregation and the creativity of those passionate about Community Ministries, we are gearing up to help our friends meet the challenges ahead.

For now, Open Door meals will remain carry-out at the portico, but patio heaters are being added to help provide warmth until we can return to the Dining Room. Tab Community Care will continue to provide emergency utility assistance and bus passes while assisting neighbors with access to other forms of Coronavirus relief. In November and December, we will also begin offering Blessing Days each week.

The idea of blessing the neighbors is not new. We have shared donated goods with them on a regular basis for years. Sometimes there has been an abundance of choice; at other times the pickings have been slim.

This summer, in light of the pandemic, we made a decision to modify our approach to "give-away days." Rather than offering randomly donated items, we have focused on providing specific-need items and personal protection equipment (PPE). This shift has been well-received by our neighbors and has given us an opportunity to re-think how we can share blessings in the colder months ahead.

For the next two months, we are planning to offer Blessing Days once a week. Of course, if an urgent need arises, we have an ample supply of clothing and coats on-hand for the occasional emergency; however, moving forward, our focus will be to help meet specific personal-item needs for neighbors, based on what they've identified for us as helpful rather than funneling random donations.

We also believe that this new approach provides greater clarity for the Tab family about which donation items are most welcomed and needed, hopefully making it easier for folks to share their generosity with our neighbors in way that is truly beneficial. We look forward to receiving donations for the Blessing Days ahead. Items may be brought to the church during office hours until the end of the year, at which time we will re-evaluate this new approach.



Blessing Days for fall 2020. (Each day is a Wednesday.)

**November 4 - Socks for men, women and children.** Preferably new, warm, and calf-length or longer. We can never have too many socks!

**November 11 - Blankets.** New or clean gently-used blankets with size marked.

November 18 - 10-Piece Hygiene Kits and Hand Lotion. Kits have been purchased from Amazon in bulk (\$4.00ea). Lotions are a separate donation item.

#### November 25 - Closed for Thanksgiving

**December 2 - Hats, gloves, scarves and reading glasses.** Plenty of scarves and reading glasses have already been donated. Warm hats and gloves of all sizes, preferable unisex style, are needed.

December 8 - Socks (again) and Hand/Foot warmer packets.

**December 15 - Grab bag.** Popular items: deodorant, small dish detergent, laundry detergent, cleaning supplies, single roll/wrapped toilet paper, socks, lip balm, hand lotion, OTC pain relief (ibuprofen or acetaminophen), Vaseline, Band-aids, etc. No clothing, please.

**December 23 - Closed for Christmas** 

December 30 - Hygiene Kits and Hand Lotion (and leftover grab bag items)


#### **READ THROUGH THE BIBLE**

#### PRESSED MEAT

Two pounds veal, 1 pound pork, 1½ doz. eggs


Cook veal and pork until thoroughly tender, having it well seasoned. Hard boil the eggs. Grind the meat and make a layer in the bottom of the pan. Grind yolks of eggs and spread on top of the meat. Grind the whites of eggs and spread on yolks, seasoning well, and add another layer of meat. Moisten well with the liquid in which meat was cooked and cover with a net cloth and press.

Voila! A dish fit for even the pickiest of eaters!!!
