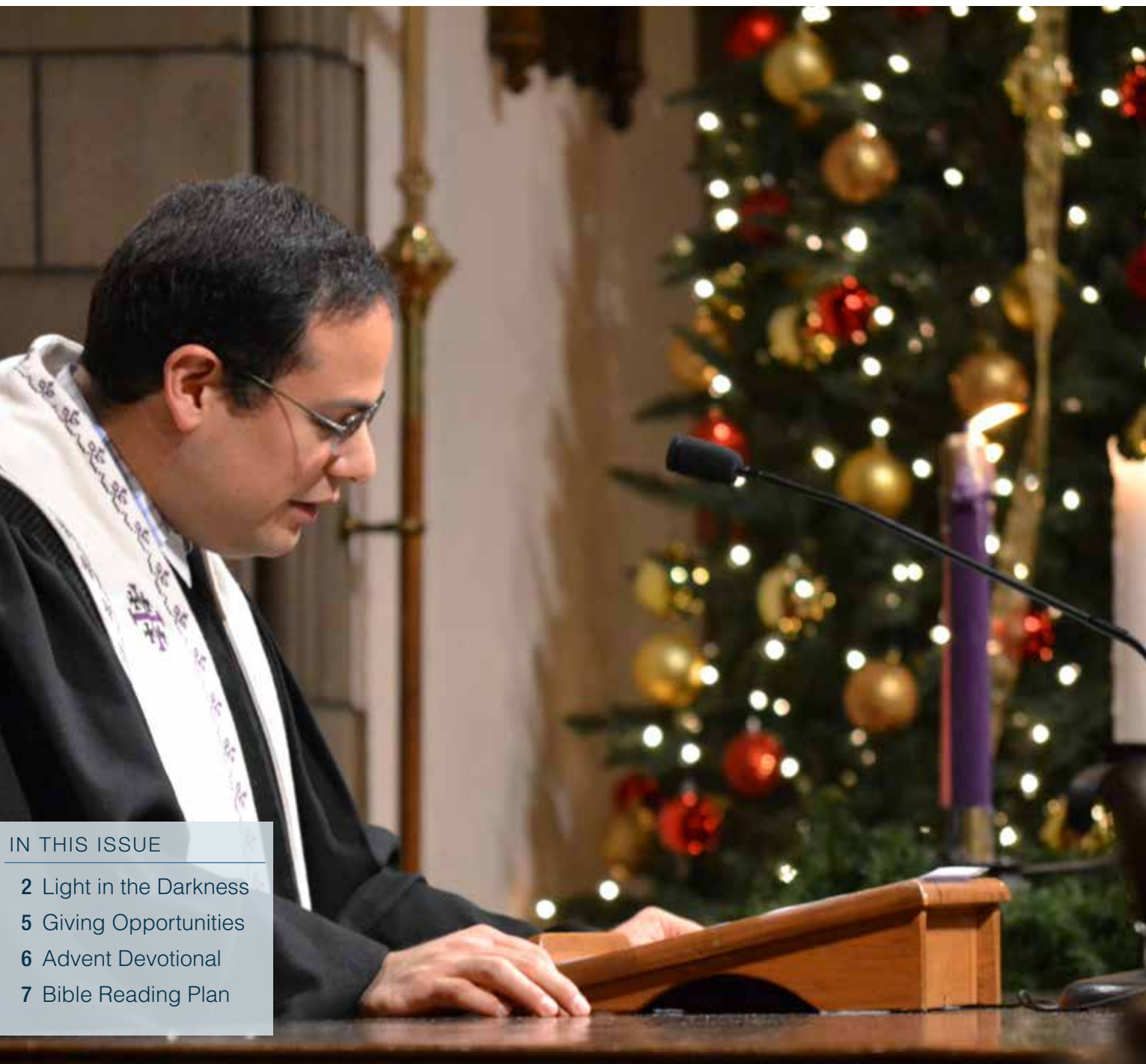

# Pastoral Reflection

## The Light Shines in the Darkness

Dear Friends,

In the opening verses of his Gospel, in his rather non-traditional way of announcing the birth of Jesus, John writes, *"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."* (1:5)

Into our darkened world, God sent His Son, the Light of the World!

We know all about living in a darkened world, don't we? We look around and we look within and we see the darkness of disease and distress, discord and division, brokenness and despair. So, where do we find hope? Where do we see light in the darkness?

As Parker Palmer reflects, December 21st is the shortest day of the year, "It gets darker and darker, and then Jesus is born!" There it is! There is the Light that shines in the darkness! In the birth of Jesus Christ, *"the true Light which enlightens everyone was coming into the world"* (1:6) and *"we have seen His glory!"* (1:14)

One of my favorite images of Christmas, every year, is when at the conclusion of our Christmas Eve services we stand together in a darkened sanctuary and sing Silent Night. The pastors' candles are lit from the Christ candle and we wait expectantly, with our own unlit candles in hand, for the light of Christ to be passed to us. Standing in front of the gathered congregation in that beautiful moment is a sight to behold as the darkened sanctuary is gradually filled with light, as the Light of the World is shared person to person.

All the darkness in the world cannot extinguish the light of a single candle!

Howard Thurman includes this poem in his book, *The Mood of Christmas*.

"I Will Light Candles This Christmas"

Candles of joy, despite the sadness.

Candles of courage for fears ever-present.

Candles of peace for tempest-tossed days.

Candles of grace to ease heavy burdens.

Candles of love to inspire all living.

Candles that will burn all year long.

Friends, we light candles during Advent and Christmas to remind us that our Light has come in the birth of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, and *all the darkness in the world cannot overcome it*.

# Can We “Zoom” Into Community?

## Tab's Women's Bible Study on Monday Evenings Continues to Thrive

It's been nearly a year since group gatherings were suspended and then moved to virtual platforms. While nothing replaces in-person engagements, our Zoom-supported Bible studies and fellowship groups are continuing to meet our members' needs. But what about newcomers that were beginning to make connections? How do visitors pursue connections in this socially distanced environment?

Jennifer Hamilton and Ruth Miller co-lead the Women's Bible study group on Monday evenings which began this Fall. In addition to the “regulars,” two women newer to Tab joined the community.

“We're new to the area and were in the process of finding a church home. On a Sunday morning drive, my husband heard Tab's radio program and really enjoyed Pastor Gable's message. We decided to visit the church and felt welcomed by the congregation, but soon afterward, COVID hit,” explains Christel Crater.

“As a way of continuing to explore the church and connect with other women, I searched the website for information on women's fellowship groups. The timing was right for me to start attending the Monday night Bible study.”

Ellen Moeller and her husband recently returned to Indianapolis after living for 24 years in the Philadelphia area. “One of my priorities was to find a congregation that had a focus on peace and justice issues. I knew Tab had a reputation for ministering to the nearby community, plus Tab was by far the most friendly church I visited,” explained Ellen.

“When I read that this group was starting a new study in September, I made it a priority. The homework is just right, and the discussion, aided by the questions, is quite rich. I need to keep God in the picture, and doing so with others who are earnestly walking their own faith path is deeply meaningful to me.”

Both Christel and Ellen appreciate the opportunity to connect via Zoom. “This group has been very welcoming,” said Ellen, later adding this humorous observation. “Thus far, I have met each group member on a flat-screen from the neck up. I'm wondering if I'll recognize the actual person when the time comes!”

For Christel, the Zoom option allowed her to engage with the study while taking care of family obligations, such as traveling to-and-from soccer practices and games. “It's also fun to learn more about each other's lives during a time when it's easy to feel disconnected from others.”

For the veteran members of the group, there's a shared belief that the study of Scripture is vital to one's well-being, even more so during a global health pandemic. Just ask Sharon Poole, who's participated for two years. “For me, the importance of a group Bible study cannot be overstated. Plus, I believe God wants us to pursue His truth with others. We see this played out on Monday nights as different insights are shared. Not one of us has it all figured out!”

# Missions Report

If you have peeked into the best office in the building recently, you may have asked yourself, "What's with all the boxes, bags and packing materials?" Well, no worries; all is well. What looks like chaos in the office is actually an indication of the incredible generosity and compassion of the good people of Tab and many of our friends.

Donations of socks, hats, blankets, gloves, hand sanitizer, laundry detergent, tissues, lotion, hygiene kits and much more have poured in. They have been dropped off in person, delivered anonymously and shipped from other states. The senders have included Tab members, friends of the congregation and friends of friends who've heard about the way we minister to our neighbors and decided they wanted to join in!

To be quite honest the response has been overwhelming and is, in fact, as big of a blessing to my spirit as the items are to the neighbors who will receive them! The only word to describe it is, abundance.

We asked for donated socks and received close to 200 pairs. Not to mention, when we asked for folks to roll these socks into pairs, we had more volunteers than work. We asked for blankets and received so many that we had to move them to the Gym.

We asked for notes of encouragement to go with the Blessing Day items and the 50 Thanksgiving boxes that will be prepared for families referred to us from Shortridge High School and the Circles ministry. Numerous Tab folks took on these "at home" projects and provided beautiful, inspiring messages of God's love and hope.

And... we did not even think to ask for help for Open Door meals the day before Thanksgiving, yet the Women's Ministry team volunteered to serve box lunches and Cub Scout Pack #72 came through with a pop-up food pantry for the neighbors.

Friends, whoever said that the church cannot do good relational ministry in the midst of a pandemic is talking nonsense. We can, and we do. Every day. It may look a little different right now, but we are doing good, faithful work through which the hope, peace, joy and love of Advent is shared. Because of you the One who came at Christmas is made known.

### 2020 YEAR-END CONTRIBUTIONS

Thursday, December 31, is the final day Tab is able to physically receive contributions in the Finance Office for credit to your 2020 giving statement. Checks dated, postmarked and sent via the US Mail on or before December 31 will be credited as 2020 giving even if received in 2021. Online giving must have a December 31 processing date for credit in 2020. All of the above is in accordance with IRS rules and regulations. Those interested in donating securities should contact Kristine Green at extension 111 in the Finance Office well in advance of year-end.

### 2021 STEWARDSHIP PLEDGE CARDS

Thanks to all who have responded to our 2021 Stewardship Campaign. If you have not yet returned your pledge card for 2021 we encourage you to do so as soon as possible. Your pledged gifts of support assist the Session in planning for the coming year, and we thank you for your continued support of the ministries of Tab. If you have indicated that you would like pledge envelopes for 2021, they will be mailed the week of December 13.

### QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS (QCD)

When planning your IRA withdrawal strategy, you may want to consider making charitable donations through a QCD. A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year, as long as certain rules are met. In addition to the benefits of giving to a charity, a QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. Keeping your taxable income lower may reduce the impact to certain tax credits and deductions, including Social Security and Medicare. See your tax professional for full details.

## Then and Now



As one walks into Tab's beautiful Sanctuary, one cannot help but notice the beautiful stained glass windows that surround the room. Our eyes move upward as we take in the beautiful art and biblical stories that are reflected in the glass. Did you know that it wasn't always the case? When the building was constructed, there were plans to fill the tracery (the intricate limestone framing) with stained glass, but that reality did not materialize until the 1950s.

Until then the windows were filled with solid glass. The only original stained glass window, installed at the time of completion of the Sanctuary, is the front window given in memory of Mary J. R. Evans by her son, Edgar H. Evans. This 13th Century type of glass was best fitted and is in perfect keeping with the architecture of the church, which embodies much of the symbolism of ecclesiastical art. The window was designed to reflect the three major events in the life of Christ - the Crucifixion, the Resurrection and the Ascension. Utilizing close to 20,000 individual pieces of glass, this window is one of the finest examples of medieval stained glass in the Midwest, if not the entire country.
