

## Pastoral Reflection

## Can We Talk About It?

Dear Friends,

One of the parts of ministry I have missed most during this past year of pandemic shutdown has been the opportunity to visit in homes, hospitals and care facilities. It is one of the aspects of ministry that I love most, so have missed most. During a "non-pandemic" year I am typically out visiting 2–3 times per week; during this past year I can probably count on both hands the number of times I was face to face with one of our members in one of those settings.

The good news is those opportunities are starting to open up again. Both Oscar and I are fully vaccinated and facilities are starting to welcome visitors again, given some well-designed restrictions. So, let me remind you again, if you or a loved one is in the hospital or a care facility please make sure to let us know. Not only do we want to be praying with you on their behalf, but, if there is an interest, we would be happy to visit.

I write this to you now as a word of encouragement and guidance as you consider visiting someone in a hospital or care facility. One aspect of the theological concept of the Priesthood of All Believers is, as Martin Luther put it, "we become little Christs to one another." You don't need to be a pastor to make a "pastoral" call.

So, here are a few reminders which I hope will be helpful as you visit others.

- Limit your visit: This may seem like a strange one to start with, but it is an important one. When I visit someone in the hospital I typically stay with them about 5 minutes and rarely any longer. That is enough time to express your care, inquire about their well-being and offer a prayer. Remember they are in the hospital to rest and heal, and every patient I know expends energy when a visitor comes to call. You may have driven 30 minutes and spent another 30 finding a place to park and getting to their room, but the 5-minute rule is still a good one to keep in mind.
- Listen: One of the reasons I have always loved these kinds of visits is they give me an opportunity to chat and LISTEN...one-on-one. As you inquire as to how they are doing or inquiring as to their needs, resist the temptation to tell them your story about your surgery, your vacation, your experience of pandemic. Even if they ask, keep your answers brief and toss the conversation back to them. Listen to the cues they give you that it is time for you to leave.
- Be Present: Many people are resistant to visiting in hospitals and care facilities because they think to themselves, "What do I have to say to them in their condition?" Please don't let that be a deterrent to visiting. Your mere presence will likely send a deeper and more lasting message than any words you might say. While being able to touch may be restricted at this time, your presence is worth a thousand words.
- *Prayer:* In as much that you are making a "pastoral" call it is very appropriate for you to offer to pray, if they would like you to and if you are comfortable doing so. If you offer and they agree, your prayer can be as simple as, "Lord, I lift to you our sister and ask Your healing touch to be with her and Your care and compassion to be with her family and all those who give her good care. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen."
- Not up for visiting in person yet? Letters, notes, emails, texts and phone calls are still greatly appreciated. Again, a simple, short, 5 minute phone call or an "I'm thinking about you" email is always wonderfully received. As difficult as this year has been regarding separation our developing use of technology has been wonderful! Take full advantage of it.

I hope these tips are helpful to you as you participate in the ministry of care and compassion.

I look forward to worshiping with you soon.

# Discipleship Spirit Growth

## How do you measure personal growth?

Sometime during last year's COVID shutdown, my husband and I became recreational swimmers at the downtown YMCA. Thanks to safety regulations and an orderly reservation system, we were able to reserve time in the lap pool on a regular basis. At the start, my goal was fairly basic: just keep moving. Roughly a month into our routine, I began to work on a suite of strokes—freestyle, breast, and side. As my confidence grew, I began counting lengths, then laps. These kinds of markers encouraged me to stay in the game, to keep moving forward.

When our Spiritual Growth & Development Team began exploring discipleship programs, we discussed assessments. If we are promoting spiritual formation, how will people know if they are growing? And is it not important to define a starting point from which to measure? Like my journey with swimming, is it helpful to have markers for our spiritual "exercise?"


The consideration of assessments and other measuring tools is ongoing. Part of the discussion is how to manage the tension of encouraging accountability while respecting an individual's personal experience. In the meantime, we are humbly offering what we call "Three Questions." In January, in a mailing to the congregation, Pastor Oscar Clavel introduced our team's new vision for discipleship under the banner "Rooted in Grace." His message discussed the importance of identity, a critical aspect of growth and asked. "How rooted is our belief that we are beloved children of God?"

A bookmark was included in the mailing that offered three statements—supported by Scripture—that lists transforming truths about a Christian's identity. They are:

> I am known and accepted by God. I am secure in Jesus Christ. I am significant in Jesus Christ.

Since January, I have returned to that simple bookmark several times. I continue to ask God, "I believe...most of the "Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Jesus Christ has made me his own...I press on toward the goal..."

time. Lord, increase my belief." There have also been times when I search for Scriptures that reinforce each statement. believing that God's Word is active and alive, changing my heart.

While not a formal assessment, these three questions about my identity as a child of God offers me a focus for future study and prayer. The questions are also guideposts for managing routine thoughts throughout the day.

What resources are you using to bring focus to your spiritual formation? What disciplines are needed for you to be rooted in grace? Is your identity in Christ in a healthy place? As we become more intentional about spiritual growth, how

do we keep ourselves honest about our condition and set realistic goals? Do you have an accountability partner?

Tab is a place where so many of our members are native Hoosiers. In fact, many are native to Indianapolis, too. It is always interesting to learn about someone who chose to move to Indianapolis.

While not a native Hoosier, Linda McCabe was born and raised in the Midwest. Born in Greenville, Ohio, she grew up as a daughter of dairy farmers. Linda has an older sister and a younger brother. She has the distinction of being the first in her family to attend college. Linda chose Miami University (Ohio) and graduated with a degree in Business Education.

After college, Linda took a big leap of faith as she began her career. She packed up her things and drove to California. # Sanctuary Updates

## Lighting Overhaul

Step into the sanctuary and you will see one of the hanging pendant lights is missing! That's because it is being retrofitted with new LED lamps inside. In early April, workers carefully disconnected and removed it, so it could be packed up and safely driven to Wisconsin, where a company specializing in such things will create a custom LED array for the inside. The pendant will return in about 10 weeks, when workers will rehang it and we can test it out to see how it looks. If we like it, the company will create the arrays for the other eleven pendants, which can be installed without taking them down.

This is part of a larger project to overhaul the lighting in the sanctuary. Besides new LEDs for the pendants, the theater lights will be replaced with new LED fixtures, and new controls and dimmers will be installed to operate all the lighting. The entire project will be done in stages, and will take a few months to complete.

# Les Duvall & His Final Act of Leadership

Tab lost a long-time (65 years) and faithful Tab member on August 6, 2020. The Honorable John Leslie Duvall, Jr., former Indiana State Senator, Indiana Public Service Commissioner and community leader spent his life dedicated to improving the lives of people in our church, community and state. He is described by all who knew him as honest, thoughtful and fair.

When I asked Teresa Lubbers, Indiana Commissioner for Higher Education, former State Senator and Tab member to share her thoughts on Les, she responded, "Following in Les Duvall's wake in the Indiana State Senate was both an inspiration and an enduring reminder of why public service can be noble. He was smart, dedicated and principled. His faith marked every aspect of his life and was framed by his decades of service to Tab and others, including years of work on behalf of prison ministries. 'Well done, good and faithful servant' are words that clearly speak to the way Les Duvall lived his life."



A few weeks ago, Les' sons John and David visited Tab for the purpose of delivering their father's legacy gift to the Tab Endowment that he included in his estate; a gift that he made in memory of his beloved wife Carolyn. When I served as Tab's business manager in the 1980's, I remember Carolyn, a community leader in her own right, coming once a week to Tab simply to sharpen all the pencils in sanctuary.

I am grateful to my friend Les for serving as a leader and example to all of us, even in his last act of remembering the Tab Endowment in his Will. Les was a powerful force for good, married to an equally powerful force. Tab is a better church community because of this loving couple.
