# Pastoral Reflection

---

## As We Continue Forward...

Dear Friends,

This past week two different friends said to me, “That’s something we should do in the summer...Oh wait, it is the summer...and now it’s almost over!” It has gone too quickly, so let me update you on a couple of the things that have been keeping us busy.

**Associate Pastor process:** With Oscar’s accepting a new call in Longwood, Florida (wasn’t that a great send-off we gave him?) the Session has begun having conversations as to our next steps. We have met with Alan Thames, the Presbytery Executive, and he is willing to walk with us through this process. Arrangements have already been put in place for temporary supply pastors who are willing and able to preach on a given Sunday when I am unavailable. The next step for us will be to identify a pastor who will join us for a designated period of time (often called a contract or covenant pastor). That person will serve in the capacity of an associate pastor while the Session explores and determines the best staffing model for us in the future. Please pray for all those involved in this process.

**Facility improvements:** As I’ve mentioned before, the summer has been filled with numerous improvements to the building. The most significant now are the installation of a new HVAC system in the children’s ministry areas downstairs and the new lighting replacement in the Sanctuary. Imagine this: each of the chandeliers in the sanctuary draws approximately 1250 kilowatts an hour! All of the lighting in the Sanctuary is now being retrofitted with LED bulbs. This is good stewardship, both now and for the future. Pending projects are a redesign of the Front Office area, a new bathroom suite at the end of the Parlor Hallway, and renovation of Lower Level A after the water line break several months ago.

Periodically I am asked, “Why are we doing all these capital improvement projects now?” The answer is simple: “Because we can and because we must.” As we enter in to our centennial year at 34th and Central we are making concerted efforts to maintain and enhance our building for our next century of ministry here. This building is our greatest asset for ministry. Fortunately, we are in such good shape financially that we are able to do these very extensive and expensive improvements using existing funds without having to have a capital campaign. Thanks to all who have so faithfully and generously supported our mission and ministry through the years.

**Covid precautions:** Since March of 2020 we have tried to faithfully follow the guidance of the CDC and local health officials with regards to our Covid precautions and protocols. Regrettably, the recent outbreak of the Delta variance necessitates those bodies to recommend that we wear masks and practice good social distancing when gathering. We are implementing and encouraging these same guidelines when we gather for worship and activities at Tab. Our Covid protocols are listed on the front page of our website [tabpres.org](http://tabpres.org).

Each of us needs to make our own decisions as to when we feel comfortable returning to in-person worship both out of concern for our own well-being and that of those who are worshipping with us. We trust your good judgment on that, but I also want to encourage you to return to in-person worship as soon as you feel comfortable doing so.

Let us know if there is anything we can do for you. I look forward to being with you in worship.

# Missions Update

## Back-to-School Giveaway

On Sunday, August 1st, children, youth, and families of our neighborhood gathered in Tab Park for a Community Back-to-School Celebration presented by folks from more than 20 local entities—churches, businesses, programs and agencies. It was a beautiful day meteorologically, but even more so communally. The collaboration of diverse leaders from all around the Mapleton Fall Creek area was inspirational and the results incredible. As one participant put it, “At one point, I stood in the middle of the park and looked around at who all was there—the kids, the families, the community partners—there was so much joy. It felt so light after such a heavy year...and fun. Everyone was having fun.”

I could not agree more! Being part of the planning team for this event was truly one of the greatest blessings, yet, of 2021. In just six weeks, a conversation about kids returning to in-person school morphed into a neighborhood party that included bike safety lessons with free helmets, a giveaway of backpacks and school supplies, snacks, music, games, prizes, lots of interaction with public safety and a Kona Ice truck. (I mean, is it really a party without Kona Ice?)

More importantly, all of the planners left the busy day renewed, energized, and excited for the next thing we will do together. We have become partner-friends who are committed to ministering to the youth and families in our community through our different areas of work and influence.

There are too many “God was here” stories to share and more helpers to thank than we can list; still here are a few “wins” to celebrate:

- One of the most heartwarming measures of success for this event was the diversity of volunteers who helped ensure that Tab was an amazing event host. In addition to Tab staff and church family, we had neighbors from Phillips Temple, Constitution Gardens and Open Door helping as well. The Tab youth group and Tab Rec folks were invaluable help!



- We provided 260 cups of Kona ice, 170 backpacks, 112 custom-fitted bike helmets and thousands of school supplies, provided by the congregations of Tab and Phillips Temple, as well as employees from Bradley Company and EmployIndy.
- Leftover school supplies were distributed among three schools—Phalen Leadership Academy (48), The Oaks Academy, and the new Christian school, Harriet Tubman School of Excellence.
- Tab Missions Committee and Bradley Company provided back-to-school haircuts for a raffle. Amazingly, everyone who entered received a voucher for a haircut provided by our neighbor, Pierre’s Barber Shop or a stylist at Virtuous Styles Salon.
- God’s abundance was on full display...and the sense of community in all our diversity was, in my assessment, a glimpse of God’s “kingdom come, on earth as it is in heaven.” It was a day of utter joy!

# A Look Back

## Tab's Ground Breaking

One hundred years ago this month, the ground-breaking ceremony was held to begin the building of the Sanctuary unit of Tabernacle Presbyterian Church. The words of Edgar H. Evans on September 13, 1921 still apply today.

"The story of the past has been presented to us. It is a glorious past full of honor, an achievement, woven thru and thru with sacrifice and consecration. We have honored and will further honor in the program of today those who have spent their years in the service of the past.

But we shall also honor those who in years represent the future. The young of today represent the life of the morrow and if that morrow is to be glorious it must hold in mind not only the recollections of the past but an outlook of the future. If I were to take a theme I might look in the 28th chapter book of Proverbs, we read, "Where there is no vision the people perish." But I would rather take the more positive statement of Joel as he states, "I shall pour out my spirit and your old men shall dream dreams and your young men shall see visions." The achievements of the past were due to a vision that those devoted men and women then caught, that led them to establish the Third (old) Church, that again led them to move way out to 11th Street now that has led us to move to this land of wonderful promise. The visions in the past led to great achievement but a full vision of the future now has a promise beyond what we have to hope.

We have a wonderful opportunity here. The need of a devout religious feeling in the lives of men was never more needed than today. Sobriety and nobility of thought, high ideals of our duty to God and men are greatly needed today. Our vision of the future must begin with, and continue in allegiance to our Lord and Master Jesus Christ as the Son of God and the Savior of men. With this as our central motive the possibilities of accomplishment are almost unlimited. A structure is soon to be reared on this site, a building eminently suited to the purpose for which it is built, beautiful in appearance,

reverential in impression, useful in many ways. Here will be given great messages, addresses to the saving of men, the upbuilding of life and characters. The vigor and vitality and the eloquence of the preacher together in a common cause of worship and service.

We shall teach the boys and girls, men and women, in a great Sunday school the gospel of life, a school whose numbers shall go beyond our fondest anticipations and whose influence on the lives of thousands and thousands of people shall make the name of the Tabernacle Bible School forever blessed. We shall have departments for the young and the old, those in between with activities of a varied nature.

We shall have a Community house which will be a busy center of spiritual, social, and intellectual activity. Our boys and girls will have a gymnasium to build up their bodies and to furnish recreation and enjoyment of the highest order. And thus, we shall discharge our obligations and avail ourselves of an opportunity developing men and women well rounded in spirit, mind and body.

The vision of the future, what will give it the greatest responsibilities, what will enlarge the scope of its influence? The same spirit of consecration and devotion, the same high purpose in service, the same great ambition for the Kingdom of our Lord that has been found in the past."

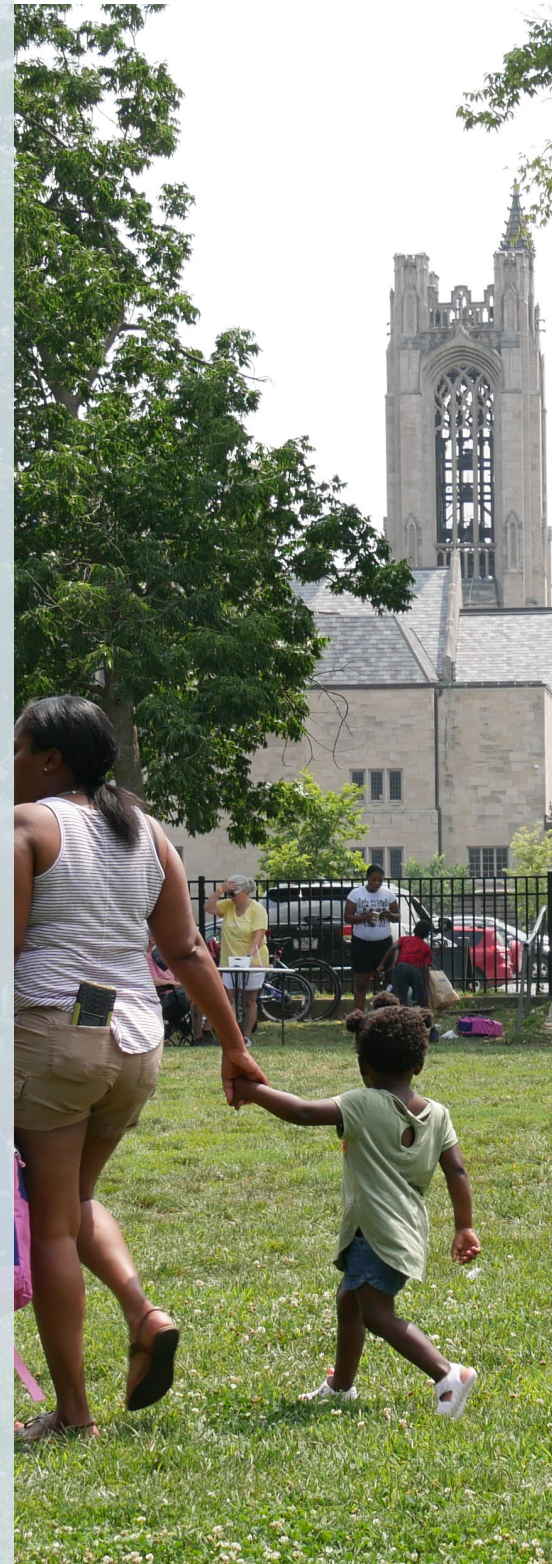
