



Pastoral Reflection

A New Plan...

Dear Friends,

During the past several months, since Oscar's departure, the Session and Human Resources Committee have spent a substantial amount of time discussing our next steps. Whenever there is a significant staff change it is wise to carefully reflect and consider not only the challenge but also the opportunity it presents.

One of the first steps we took was to contact Rev. Alan Thames, Executive Presbyter of the Whitewater Valley Presbytery, who met with us to explore various options for filling the Associate Pastor position. The Session determined the benefit of seeking a Transitional Associate Pastor who would join our staff immediately and work with us while the Session explored future staffing models.

Who could fill such a role? Alan gave us several names of possible candidates to interview, which we did, but the best possible candidate was already on our staff: Rev. Terri Thorn, our missions director.

Prior to joining us two years ago Terri served as pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Lebanon, Indiana for nine years. After leaving that position she was led to Tab to follow her passion for community ministry. In her time with us she has ably led our Mission Committee and has done a wonderful job helping us to navigate our ministry and outreach to our neighbors during an unprecedented time of pandemic. She has helped us, as a Mission Committee and a congregation, to emphasize the relational aspects of our ministry which goes beyond merely providing funds to help pay for utilities and rent. We have felt and appreciated her passionate faith and her love for the neighbors we serve.

When the Transitional Associate Pastor position came open Terri and I began having conversations as to her possible interest and what that position might look like. We began envisioning merging the Mission Director position description with the former Associate Pastor position description, moving it from part-time to full-time, which will allow Terri to use and expand her many gifts for ministry. Given that the Session will continue to explore other staffing models we proposed that this be on a one-year, renewable contract. We presented this idea to the Human Resources committee and the Session and got their full endorsement.

When Terri started with us several years ago we knew we were grateful that she decided to join us in our mission and ministry at Tab; at that time, however, we had no idea how grateful we would be that she is able and willing to expand her role and ministry with us in this way.

Terri will begin her new ministry with us on October 1. So as you see her, please welcome her AGAIN to Tab.

I look forward to being with you in worship!

A Look Back at Tab Symbolism

Symbolism & Design of Our Sanctuary

When I first wrote this article, I did not know how perfectly John Gable's sermon on September 5 was going to complement what I'd uncovered in the history archives recently. If you haven't already heard that message, please do yourself a favor and listen to "The Architecture of Worship".

STYLE: 15th century of French Gothic, characterized by the pointed-arch motif, hammer-beam trusses, carved woodwork, stained-glass windows and verticality. What the viewer and visitor experiences can be very emotional, which is the actual intent of the Gothic style. Both believers and non-believers were impressed with the Gothic structure whose enormous towers became beacons of spirituality to the towns and countryside. Other styles of architecture became popular. However, many people felt that no other style could approach the Gothic when it came to Christian churches. The massive stone pillars in the Sanctuary gave it a likeness of the cathedrals in Europe, but with a warmth which they do not have.

The plan of the church was cruciform; the transepts and galleries representing the arms of the cross and the chancel, including the Communion table, representing the head of the cross.

SYMBOLISM IN THE PLANNING:

Nave – 7 bays = 7 original churches

Chancel and Choir windows – 5 sections = Christ and the 4 Evangelists

Clerestory windows – 3 sections = Trinity

Side aisle windows – 2 sections = Old and New Testament

Front doors – 3 sections = Trinity

Carved border – vine and grapes = Jesus' saying of "I am the vine...ye are the branches."

Arches: Clustered, pointed Gothic arches executed in Indiana limestone

Exterior stone carvings: The building name and sayings carved above the entries are beautiful. The carved name of the building over the main entrance would become one of the architect's trademarks.

BUILDING MATERIALS:

Indiana Limestone for its color variations and liveliness

Slate roofing for its tone and richness

- Copper guttering and trim for its green patina
- Oak woodwork and flooring (much being carved)

Fluted stone columns carry the hammer-wood trusses supporting the roof

Moravian tile floor

Bronze lanterns





OTHER FACTS AND ROOM SIZES:

Sanctuary = 50' x 80' plus 25' x 16' transepts and 22' x 24' Chancel

Narthex = $12' \times 50'$

Altar / Communion Table – positioned high to be the center of the service and can be seen from all parts of the Sanctuary. Decorated with painted shields depicting the

APOSTLES:

St. Peter - Crossed keys and inverted cross

St. Paul – Bible (included though not one of the original Twelve Apostles)

- St. Andrew X-shaped cross
- St. Matthew Three silver money bags
- St. John Snake and chalice
- St. Thomas Carpenter's square
- St. Matthias Axe (the replacement of Judas Iscariot)
- St. James the Greater Scallop shells
- St. James the Less Bow saw
- St. Jude Golden ship
- St. Philip Loaves of bread
- St. Bartholomew Knives

(These shields are repeated at the ends of ceiling trusses.)





(St. Simon the Zealot was not represented. His shield would have displayed a book standing lengthwise on its edge and a fish lying on the upper edge of the book; the fish signifying that he was "a fisher of men" and the book signifying the Gospel.)

The back of the communion table is a seat for the minister when he/she administers the sacrament. The back of this seat has a very fine carved canopy divided into seven divisions and forms the pulpit which is several steps above the table platform. The two benches at the base of the Triumphal Arch represent the new and old dispensation.

Behind the Sanctuary on the main level, there was also a minister's study, the Session room and the church office. The choir room is on the second floor. The ground floor contains the assembly room with stage (used for Sunday School and social purposes); also the kitchen, pantry, boiler rooms and ventilating system.

All the important lines of the church are vertical, which gives an impression of added height. This impression was particularly desirable and necessary in this instance, as the proposed Chapel and Educational/Community House which will be placed at the left will be of good size and must not dwarf the church proper.
