# Pastoral Reflection

---

## For The Record...

Dear Friends,

I'm not sure if you've ever been in the room we call the "Session Room" near the entrance to the Sanctuary on the north hallway. If you have been, did you happen to notice the large safe on the east wall? If so, have you ever wondered what's in there? Curious minds want to know.

Among other sundry historical items are the master copies of our church's records dating back to our founding in 1851 when we were organized as Third Presbyterian Church. The membership registers list the names of every member, pastor, elder, deacon and baptism during our 170 year history. The minutes from every Session meeting are also recorded, beginning with hand-written minutes from our earliest meetings.

Consider for a moment the weight of the decisions our forbearers in the faith had to make during those decades which pre-date the Civil War. Consider the decisions which were made as to how and where to worship and how to do ministry as the city of Indianapolis grew and changed, the decisions made as to whether to move or stay when neighborhoods changed along with the controversies over the issues of the day. Consider the decisions which had to be made as there were changes in persuasions and politics as well as those who occupied the pulpit.

What a fascinating collection of our church's history we have at our fingertips.

But what I find most interesting in this reading of Tab's history, and in the reading of all history really, is that we are a part of it. While we have hand-written minutes from meetings in the 1850's we also have digitalized minutes of meetings held this month. While we have records of decisions made to move from our downtown location all the way up to 34th and Central in the 1920's we also have records of the decisions made to remain in place in 1966, a decision which was reaffirmed 50 years later in 2016 in our Vision Renewal report which is also safely stored.

I find it fascinating that the names of every member of Tab (AKA Third Presbyterian) are all listed, including their dates of membership, baptisms, marriages and deaths, as are ours, and so will be all those who follow us.

Just as the writer of Hebrews listed the names of faithful men and women in our faith's history in chapter 11 of his letter, so the volumes safeguarded in our safe list the names and actions of faithful men and women of Tab down through the ages. Truly we are "surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses."

Were all of their decisions correct? No, and time will surely determine that some of the decisions we make today are not either. For those, past and present, we must confess and repent of our errors in judgment. However, were all made as acts of faithfulness? I would like to believe so, just as I would like to believe that the decisions we make today, as individuals and as a church, are expressions of our faithfulness in response to God's great faithfulness.

We stand on the shoulders of those who have gone before us and pray that God will find us faithful today and for generations to come.

I look forward to worshipping among a great cloud of witnesses this Sunday.

# Biserica Crestina Baptista

## Happy 25th Anniversary to Our Friends in Zimnicea, Romania!

On October 10, 2021, the Biserica Crestina Baptista (Baptist Christian Church) of Zimnicea, Romania, celebrated the 25th anniversary of the dedication of their church building. Why are we telling you this? Well, this building was financed and built in part by members of Tabernacle Presbyterian Church. Back in the mid '90s, several Tab folks, including our current Youth Director, Dan Rexroth, started working on the building. In October of 1996, a group from Tab, including then pastor, Peter Larson, helped dedicate the completed structure in this southern Romanian city. For the 25th Anniversary, Tab was represented by Marshall McKenna of Mana Deschisa ministry of Romania. Marshall traveled with the Tab group in 1996, and has stayed in Romania ever since. During the celebration, photos of the construction and dedication were shared, and a musical video greeting from Tab was viewed. Tab continues to support this congregation through our work with Missio-Link International (MLI). On Sunday, November 14, Emil Toader of MLI will be at Tab, speaking at each service and presenting during Sunday School. You won't want to miss learning about all that MLI is doing in Romania.





# Member Spotlight

## Meet Kaye Diener

Have you ever met someone who just exudes kindness and hospitality? We have many members just like this in the Tab family. One of those people is our long-time member, Kaye Diener.

Kaye was born and educated on the north side of Indianapolis. A graduate of North Central High School, she studied Elementary Education and French at Purdue University. While Kaye pursued her degree, she worked as a written interpreter for French students by translating their theses from French to English.

A lifelong Presbyterian, Kaye met fellow Indianapolis native Bill Diener while she was a sophomore at Purdue. At the time, Bill was finishing his senior year at Wabash College. They got engaged within a year, and they were married on July 3, 1965, following Kaye's graduation from Purdue.

Kaye and Bill started their married life in Indianapolis. Kaye taught at Skiles Test Elementary School while Bill worked in Marketing at Eli Lilly. Bill also pursued a law degree at this time by taking night classes. A job transfer for Bill took them to Albany, New York, where they welcomed their son, Mark. The next job change for Bill took the family to Bethesda, Maryland, where they welcomed their daughter, Karen. Additional job changes took the family to Salt Lake City, then to Winter Park, Florida and finally, back to Indianapolis in 1979. They became members at Tab in 1989.

Upon Mark's birth, Kaye became a stay-at-home mother and an active volunteer. She credits volunteer work with helping her connect with and make new friends each time the family relocated. Once back in Indianapolis, Kaye became a member of the Children's Museum Guild, including serving as president. Other volunteer stints included PTA president in Washington Township Schools, Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School (where daughter Karen graduated), Chair of the Children's Museum Haunted House, and Chair for the Decorator's Showhouse. A lifelong horseback rider, she also volunteers with Agape Therapeutic Riding Resources.

Bill worked for Citizen's Gas upon their return to Indy and then for Ice Miller law firm. Bill was also an active volunteer, especially in tutoring kids at School 48, School 42 and at Shortridge Middle School. In addition, he tutored inmates at the Pendleton State Reformatory. At Tab, Bill was an elder, and Kaye has served as both a deacon and an elder over the years. Kaye has also been an usher for many years at the

# A Look Back

## Additional Space Required!

The growth of the congregation that accompanied the completion of the Sanctuary building placed Tab as fifth in size of all Presbyterian churches in the US. This growth underscored the need of a church in this neighborhood, one the community would support, and a building which would meet the demand.

Since the January 1923 completion of the Sanctuary, the entire temporary Chapel was given over to the Beginners, Primary and Junior Departments for their Christian education. The Adult Department used the Sanctuary hosting at least four classes simultaneously. The High School and Intermediate Departments used the Assembly Room (Dining Room). By 1928, attendance had grown to the extent that classes were scattered all over the building just so they can be part of the successful Sunday School.

Rooms not intended for classes were put into service for education: the boiler room, the coal bin, coat closets, the kitchen, the serving room, on the stage, even the church offices. It was said that "Every available nook has been occupied." Some classes were held on the staircases! Tents were also added outside for additional meeting space. The Yoke Fellows had a 20x30-ft structure constructed between the temporary Chapel and the Sanctuary (on today's courtyard) at Emsley Johnson's own expense (\$600) for the adult class he taught. The only quiet place the Church School officers could find to figure the Sunday school attendance and count the money was a small room off the kitchen at the foot of the stairs. It was obvious to all that space for the Bible school and for the young peoples' activities was an absolute necessity. The need was now.

The original plan was to build the full church building in three units: 1st – Sanctuary, 2nd – Chapel, 3rd – the Educational unit. The congregation approved to have the Chapel,

the Tower, and the Educational/Community Building built at one time, as delaying would be a hindrance to the work of the Church and Sunday school. The completed cost was \$364,903. The subscription slogan to raise the funds was "Everybody Active is an Active Church." The temporary frame building was moved to the vacant lot adjacent to the west with the owner's permission as the Trustees began to investigate purchasing the lot. The owner had not permitted Tabernacle to buy it when the 34th and Central lot was first purchased. Thankfully, he had also had not sold it to others, namely for an apartment building or to Third Church of Christ, Scientist (Phillips Temple) for their church to be built. This lot would become the start of our recreation field later. The dwelling on the southwest corner of Central and 34th Street was rented for use of some classes until the new building was ready for occupancy.

As stated in *The Tabernacle Builder*, Oct 1928, "Our new building will have an Assembly Room for every department of the Sunday school - Beginners, Primary, Junior, Intermediates. Seniors, and Adults. In addition to these Assembly rooms, there will be some sixty classrooms available for the larger classes. These surely will fill the needs of the community." A standard-sized gymnasium, ladies' parlors and additional bathrooms were also added. According to one newspaper article, quoting a member of the building committee, initial plans stated "The basement will contain clubrooms, one for men and one for women. There will also in all probability be a billiard and poolroom." (This did not happen.) When completed, the new unit was one of the best-arranged and equipped Sunday school buildings in the country. It was thought that very few, if any, Sunday schools had ever had so many small children in attendance. Both membership and SS attendance had increased by more than 1,000 since moving to 34th and Central.
