

Missions Spotlight

Nourish to Flourish Event

On Thursday, November 4th, Tab hosted a gathering of 29 community leaders from agencies, ministries, schools and churches to provide an opportunity for folks to step away from the stresses of leadership during a pandemic and gather with others for a nourishing of their bodies, minds and spirits.

In a dedicated time of lament and hope, participants were encouraged to share some of the pandemic-driven losses, or changes, that weighed heavily on their hearts, as well as to celebrate the exciting things emerging from the pivot toward new opportunities and ways of doing their work.

One of the most common laments heard was the losses experienced when organizations were forced to scale back programming, personal contact and (sometimes) staffing. As leaders whose vocation is to serve others in the community, the grief of the losses is still real and present. It was cathartic to hear that they were not alone.

There were, too, many joys celebrated. For example, some shared that they discovered that working from home can be productive and their organizations are now able to offer job-flexibility that wasn't in place before the pandemic. Another participant celebrated the realization that his group rose to the challenge and actually served more people with less workers than before. Another named the Nourish to Flourish Gathering as a celebration from the pandemic, citing how it brought them into contact with other leaders that they may not have met, were it not for coming together for this day of spiritual care.

Throughout the day, participants were fed physically with a delicious meals prepared by Chef Andre of Delectable Catering. Spiritual food came in the form of a Lament and Hope ritual led by Tab Associate Pastor Terri Thorn, as well as in original poetry readings by Rev. Brian Shivers, Poet and Senior Associate for Formation at Second Presbyterian. Tab's own, Amy Rexroth, offered encouragement and practical tactics in a talk on mindfulness, and friend of Tab, Rod Smith, inspired all with a keynote address.

Feedback has been very positive, and plans for a quarterly gathering with additional topics is in the works.


A Look Back

The Windows of Tab

Over the next few months we will be discovering some interesting details surrounding the stained glass windows of Tab. As we near our centennial celebration it is important to note that the windows were not part of the original building in 1923. The large north window was installed in 1924, one year after the dedication in 1923. The large south window was installed and dedicated in 1951. You will find out more about our magnificent windows in The Chimes beginning in 2022.

A little history about stained glass is interesting. The origins of the first stained glass windows are lost in history, but technique for making stained glass most likely evolved from jewelry making in the Middle Ages. Stained glass was used extensively in cathedrals to tell biblical stories to a mostly illiterate people. The glass was manufactured as single piece, cut into interlocking shapes and secured with lead canes and putty. Details were fired on the glass using a mixture of lead and ash. Each of the different colors were achieved by mixing metallic salts and oxides with the molten glass. Gold produces a stunning cranberry (thus making red glass the most expensive); cobalt makes blues; silver creates yellows and golds; and copper makes greens and brick reds.



During the Renaissance (from the 14th to the 17th centuries) the art of producing stained glass was lost and replaced by painted white or clear glass panels. Formulas for reproducing the colored (stained) glass were not rediscovered until the mid-1800's. A return to the "lost" art of stained glass began.

The windows of Tab were manufactured by Willet Studios in Philadelphia, a premier studio of stained glass artistry in the US.

CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING

The Annual Christmas Joy Offering will be taken at Tab's Worship Service on Sunday, December 20, or give online at tabpres.org/giving. By giving to the Christmas Joy Offering you will be helping families of active and retired church workers. The offering is shared equally by the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and Presbyterian-related racial ethnic schools and colleges for education. Special envelopes will be available Sunday morning for your convenience. Please give generously.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS (QCD)

When planning your IRA withdrawal strategy, you may want to consider making charitable donations through a QCD. A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year, as long as certain rules are met. In addition to the benefits of giving to a charity, a QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. Keeping your taxable income lower may reduce the impact to certain tax credits and deductions, including Social Security and Medicare. See your tax professional for full details.
