

## A Look Back

### The Evans Window

When the Sanctuary was completed in 1923 it had no stained-glass windows. Within a year the large Chancel widow was commissioned and was installed the following year. It was the generous gift of Edgar H. Evans, chair of the building committee, given in memory of his foster mother, Mary Evans. Thus it is known as "The Evans Window." At the dedication service on December 28, 1924, Edgar Evans said,

"I hope that in the days to come the light that shines through this glass... will bring to the thoughts of men and women the teachings therein portrayed of the Lord and Master whom my mother served and whose she was."

The windows is 18 feet high and 11 feet wide containing 20,000 individual pieces of 13th century style glass set in five narrow windows called "lancets." Each lancet features 10 medallions from the life of Christ. The central figure is the risen and reigning Christ with His right hand raised in blessing and His left hand holding a book with the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, Alpha and Omega. At the top of the center lancet is a throne and shield with the letters ICXCNI-KA which stands for "Jesus Christ conquers all things." At the apex of the window is the word "Emmanuel" which means "God with us."

Together, the figure of Christ and the banner above Him form a cross which is the central symbol of Christianity. It is clear from the design of the window that the representation of the risen Christ that it is meant to provide a focus for worship in this beautiful, new Sanctuary.


