## Member Spotlight

## Meet Rick & Patty Reel

Tab is blessed with several life-long members, such as Leonard Raymond (Rick) Reel III. Rick was born in Indianapolis and lived near 34th and College as a child. His grandparents and parents were active members of Tab, and Rick remembers multiple generations of his family all sitting together in the same pew each week for worship.

After finishing high school at North Central, Rick studied business at IU, where he also participated in the Little 500 and was a varsity wrestler. Upon graduating, he returned to Indianapolis to work in the family business, Reel Pipe and Valve, founded by his grandfather, Leonard Reel, Sr., in 1939 and is still in business today.

Patty grew up attending Northminster Presbyterian Church, but her parents married in Tab's chapel. She attended Broad Ripple High School and then obtained bachelor's and master's degrees from Butler University. She began work as psychometrist and then became a special education teacher in Lawrence Township Schools. It was there that she taught fellow Tab member, Gilbert Orban.

Rick and Patty met at a party hosted by Tab members Mary and Dave Mills. They were married in 1977 in the chapel by Dr. Byron Crozier. Their three children, Katy, Lenny (Leonard IV) and Amy, were actively involved in Tab's Children's and Youth Ministries programs.

Katy felt an early call to serve in the mission field. After college, she taught school for two years in California, then took a job with Neighborhood Ministries (NM) in Phoenix. Her impact on the children and families of NM was significant. However, after just a few years at NM, Katy was diagnosed with a brain tumor and passed away in January of 2006. Patty has spent many years in a labor of love in writing Katy's story. Her book, "Tell Them What You Know: Katy's Story," was recently published. Neighborhood Ministries remains a Tab-supported ministry today.

During her illness, Lenny, Amy, Rick and Patty moved to Phoenix to help Katy. Lenny is still there today serving as the director of Katy's Kids, which is the NM preschool created and named in honor of his sister. He and his wife, Gricelda, are the proud parents of Leonard V (Leo) and Milena (Mina). Amy lives in Indianapolis with her husband, Omar Martin, and their son Antonio. An artist, Amy's artwork can be found on the card used in Tab's Gracious Gifts Alternative Gift Market. Omar works as an electrical engineer.

Rick and Patty have served at Tab in so many ways. Patty served as a deacon and elder, sang in the choir, was super-intendent of Sunday school (prior to paid staffing) and has been a Tab tutor. She continues to serve on the Gracious Gifts committee, and she fondly remembers her time visiting with Tab's homebound members.

Rick is a former triathlete. He has also been committed to service at Tab as a deacon, elder and volunteer.

Patty and Rick recall with deep gratitude the love and support that they received from the Tab family during Katy's illness, as well as during some of their own health challenges through the years. They love "doing life" with their Tab family, and they are grateful to be a part of Tab where "Jesus is the center" and "God is raised up."



Having learned in February about a transplant pioneer, the first doctor to perform open-heart surgery, the first female African-American physician in the U.S. and other Black pioneers in healthcare, members of the Tab community were so enthusiastic about stories of under-celebrated Black Americans that the series is being continued...with a twist.

The original stories focused on heroes in healthcare in recognition of the national theme for Black History Month. Upcoming stories (such as the one earlier this month that featured race car driver and mechanic Charles Wiggins) will focus instead on Black pioneers with Indiana connections.

The product of a collaboration of the Missions and Spiritual Growth and Development committees, the stories seek to help the Tab community become more aware of the often-neglected contributions that Black men and women have made to our city, state, nation and world. As greater knowledge brings greater understanding, it is our hope that we can help to improve connections between races and begin to dismantle aspects of our culture that act as barriers to equity.

We pursue this goal guided by the example of Christ. As Ephesians 2:14 points out, "For He Himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility."

While the list of featured individuals for the year has not been finalized, the plan is for monthly articles to celebrate men and women from the arts, literature, government, music, business, sports and more. While some likely will offer lesser-known facts about well-known individuals, others will shine a light on people the history books might have neglected, always seeking to offer stories that make readers say, "I didn't know that!"

## A Look Back

## Decades of Challenges and Growth

When Dr. Ambrose Dunkel came to Tab in 1918 the membership was at 748, roughly the same number that had held steady the previous 20 years. Eleven years later, in 1929, much had changed. Membership had quadrupled to 3,002 (it would peak at almost 3,500 in 1935), Sunday School attendance was in excess of 2,000, a recreation program had been launched, and a new church building had been built and expanded. Dr. Dunkel was a national figure, the pastor of the sixth largest Presbyterian church in America. And then a month after the dedication of the new Chapel-Education wing on September 29, 1929, the stock market crashed, and the \$265,000 mortgage suddenly proved to be a difficult challenge to pay down.

Fortunately, this was also the year that several women of the church formed Circle A, a social group but also one focused on ministry to both those within and outside of the church. Sensing the need to support the church's sudden financial needs, the ladies called a meeting to see how they might raise funds. According to a delightful document entitled History of Circle A: "Mrs. Adolph Wagner told the ladies about some church that she knew of that made salted peanuts to sell. It was agreed that Mrs. Wagner would get the recipe from a friend, and she invited the group to her house to make the first recipe. The peanuts turned out well, but you should have seen her kitchen when they were finished! We then started our peanut business in the church kitchen the next Monday and have been making them ever since. We sold them for 75-cents a pound, and after we had accomplished that project, we didn't know what to do with the leftover grease from the peanuts, so Mrs. Elvin, Mrs. Wiles and Mrs. Robinson met and worked up a doughnut project. The next Monday we were in the doughnut business as well as the peanut business. Doughnuts sold for 40-cents a dozen. We helped pay the interest on the mortgage on the church during the depression." Circle A faithfully made regular contributions to the cause, setting an admirable example for all.

Long after the mortgage was paid off, the ladies of Circle A, now well into their 70s and 80s, continued to boil peanuts and fry doughnuts, selling them on Mondays every week, until 1972, when "many were afraid someone would get burned handling the heavy pots filled with hot grease." At their last meeting in February 1973, they voted to liquidate their treasury and share it with various groups in the church, including a \$1,000 gift to the Endowment Fund, as "a perpetual gift to the work of Tabernacle Presbyterian Church."

Financial challenges notwithstanding, the 1920s and 1930s proved to be an exciting time at Tab. The congregation voted in June 1939 to call an associate minister to support Dr. Dunkel. He, in turn, had previously "expressed doubt to the practicability of two pastors serving the same church," after having served as Tab's only pastor for 21 years, during which time 4,445 new members were added. Perhaps feeling somewhat threatened, Dr. Dunkel resigned two months later and took a call to a much smaller church in Ohio, before passing away in October 1944. A glorious era in Tab history had ended, but another one was soon to start.

### TAB'S COMMUNITY CLOSET CONTINUES BLESSING TABLE ON WEDNESDAYS AT OPEN DOOR CAFE

Through the generosity of the Tab family, the Community Closet continues to assist friends and neighbors of the Open Door Café ministry. Building on the mission statement of Tab, Wednesday gatherings include offerings to help fulfill physical needs of our community.

At this time, the closet is not accepting clothes or shoes, but accepts donations of new, unopened products listed below. Often, sample sizes fit the needs of our neighbors. The items are distributed through the Open Door Café ministry, Circles, Fresh Stop and Tutoring. When donations exceed need, volunteers may regift to other community partners for distribution.

According to Jennifer Matthews, coordinator of the Blessings Table on Wednesdays, the following items are accepted year-round: shampoo, conditioner, soap bars, lotion, razors, sample mouthwash, toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, lip balm, first aid kits, reading glasses, laundry pods, individually wrapped toilet paper rolls, tissues, paper towels, nail clippers, wash cloths & towels, and feminine hygiene products.

The annual fan distribution will take place Wednesday, June 15, through the Open Door Café. Donors can help with the fan distribution by dropping a fan at the tables in McKee Hallway on Sunday mornings or making a specific donation for use to purchase the box fans.
