UKRANIAN REFUGEE RELIEF | The Mission Committee recently learned of increasing financial needs being experienced by local churches in Romania which continue to provide care and resources to vulnerable refugees crossing the border from Ukraine. Missio-Link International, through their "Church in Mission" initiative, helps equip and supply the local congregations as they seek to offer the refugees safety and solace in Christ and provide for their physical and material needs (which are greater in the harshness of winter). At the December 2022 meeting Tab's Mission Committee voted to send a gift of \$10,000 to Missio-Link from a "Legacy Fund" granted by Session in 2022. In celebration of Tab's 100-year-legacy of generous support of missions, these funds were granted by Session to provide support to existing partners as they expand their current mission and ministries. In that same spirit of generosity, the Mission Committee would like to invite folks to consider additional gifts to our Romanian partners during the winter months. Our two primary partners are Missio-Link International and the Mana Deschisa Ministry headed by Marshall McKenna. Both partners are actively involved in helping resettle refugees and connecting them to churches in Romania. Both would welcome additional support.
