CHILDREN'S MISSIONS UNIT WEEKLY UPDATE

This week, Tab's elementary students will be visiting India, where we will learn about the Hindi alphabet and say a few words in Hindi, play an Indian board game called Parcheesi, do some "elephant math," get Henna tattoos on our hands, make colored rice mandalas and palm puppets at the craft tables, play Kabbadi and Cheetah-Cheetal in the Gym, and taste Chicken Tikka Masala, Naan, and mango cakes at the Food Center. Fun facts about India: One of the main religions in India, Sikhism, requires that Sikh men never cut their hair from the day they are born until the day they die. Also, about 70% of the world's spices come from India, including black pepper, cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg, paprika, turmeric and vanilla.
