

# **Pastoral Reflection**

### Jesus: Light of the World

#### Dear Friends,

Frederick Buechner has long been one of my favorite writers. He was a Presbyterian minister who had a wonderful way with words and keen insights in to the Christian faith and life. In his book, *Whistling in the Dark*, he writes this about Lent:

"During Lent, Christians are supposed to ask one way or another what it means to be themselves. If you had to bet everything you have on whether there is a God or whether there



isn't, which side would get your money and why?

When you look at your face in the mirror what do you see in it that you like most and what do you see in it that you most deplore?

If you had only one last message to leave to a handful of people who are most important to you, what would it be in twenty-five words or less?

Of all the things you have done in your life, which is the one you would most like to undo? Which is the one that makes you happiest to remember?

Is there any person in the world, or any cause, that, if circumstances called for it, you would be willing to die for?

If this were the last day of your life, what would you do with it?

To hear yourself try to answer questions like these is to begin to hear something not only of who you are, but of both what you are becoming and what you are failing to become. It can be a pretty depressing business all in all, but if sackcloth and ashes are at the start of it, something like Easter may be at the end."

I encourage you to use this season of Lent as a time of reflection on questions such as these and those you find yourself asking of yourself. It is my hope that through worship, prayer, study and reflection we will see more clearly who we are as both faithful and flawed, and who we are becoming as children of God and followers of Jesus Christ.

I look forward to worshiping with you throughout this season of Lent as we anticipate the celebration of the Easter day! 🕆
