Pastoral Reflection

of Rev. L. John Gable

Dear Friends,

"Every pastor is an interim pastor."

That rather stark reminder is the very first sentence in the preface William Vanderbloemen writes in his book titled *Next*. Whether one serves a church for 15 or 50 years, there was a "before" and there will be an "after." The better one prepares, and the better they help the congregation they serve prepare for that inevitability, the better it will be for everyone.

During the past several months, since I sent the letter announcing my retirement, I have been preparing myself, and hopefully you, for the day when I will no longer be called your pastor. And how have I done that?

In part, I've been planning for it for years. Personally, Kris and I have talked about our plans "post -ministry" and waited for the right time. We believe that time is now. Professionally, I began planning and preparing about five years ago when I laid out, in broad brushstrokes, the themes I wanted to preach on. With the Session and staff and various committees of the church I have helped to identify programs and projects I wanted to set in order before my departure. Who would have thought that tuck-pointing a building would make the bucket list?

As the time has drawn nearer I have been culling my office of books and materials I have used as tools of my trade for decades. A couple of weeks ago I asked Sean to carry 40 years-worth of hardcopies of my sermons to the dumpster! I have been sorting through my bookshelves, taking home those I know I want to keep, and giving others away. These have been my friends through-out my ministry, so I want them to go to a good home! I have been sorting through papers and file folders. Tossing most, organizing the rest for whoever may want or need them in the future.

I have been reflecting and reminiscing about my life and ministry. I am just completing a short sermon series on "What the Church Has Taught Me" and soon will begin a series on the wonder-fully unique quality of Tab. This time of reflection has been beneficial for me, and I hope for you as well, as I am being reminded of how blessed I have been, and continue to be.

And, of course, I am taking time to share conversations and meals with many I call friend. The Presbytery has very clear guidelines as to what a pastor can and cannot do after they leave a congregation, i.e. I can't do anything that even hints of still being your pastor. But it also clearly states, "this policy does not affect or require termination of friendships with individuals in the congregation."

There are times when I catch myself thinking, "I will really miss this!", and other times when I think "And this, not so much!", but I have loved ministry and the privilege of serving as your pastor.

Having said that, I am reminded "every pastor is an interim pastor." So, while I am grateful in the present for the past, I also look forward to the future, yours and ours, with great hope, knowing that God is faithful still.

I look forward to being with you in worship.

Obituary

Jeffrey L. Ellis was born on April 18, 1964, in Indianapolis, Indiana, to Sharon Perkins Ellis Nelson and Richard "Boo" Ellis. He entered this world five minutes after his brother, Gregory.

Jeffrey, who was affectionately known as Twin, El, El-Dog, and Jeff, was kind, compassionate, fun-loving and reserved. He was not much for meaningless conversations or interactions. He ws not flashy or braggadocios but mellow and laid-back. He was loyal and courageous, courageous because he persevered through the obstacles that came his way. He was content with spending time alone watching old westerns, sports and cheering for the Indianapolis Colts. The one sport Jeffrey mastered was basketball and played on the teams for both Shortridge and John Marshal High Schools.

Jeffrey was very passionate and protective of his family. There are many fond memories of family gatherings, from eating James Perkins' (maternal grandfather) fried chicken every Sunday; sitting around laughing and joking, dancing, enjoying delicious home-cooked meals, watching movies, traveling, attending concerts and sporting events together, as well as Turn-Up Thursdays, all of which were all done with immense joy and love. Jeffrey would say "I love you more" and his actions demonstrated just that.

Jeffrey was baptized along with his twin at Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church, his paternal grandmother's church, during his sophomore year of high school. He also sang in the youth choir there. He continued to serve God by working at Tabernacle Presbyterian Church ("Tab") for 27 years. He took immense pride in being the custodian at Tab where he felt appreciated and valued as a caring and considerate man.

Open Door Ministry Café

One-Year Anniversary Celebration Recap by Rev. Terri Thorn









n May 19th, 2022 the Open Door soup kitchen relaunched as the Open Door Ministry Café for the purpose



of: Feeding bodies and souls by providing a safe place with good food and even better conversation for the sake authentic relationship building that fosters Greater Faith, Deeper Relationships and Stronger Community.

On Friday, June 2, we celebrated the anniversary of operating under the new ministry model in which each day has a focus that aligns with Tab's Vision pillars:

- Greater Faith | spiritual well-being
- **Deeper Relationships** | personal well-being
- **Stronger Community |** *emotional well-being through community partnerships*

In addition, the restaurant-style ministry fosters a sense of belonging and uplifts dignity while providing opportunities for sharing and connecting with others. A video from the celebration can be found on Tab's YouTube site: insert link

The celebration included a meal of the most popular entrée choice of the past year (pork tenderloin sandwich!), music provided by Val Phelps and Graham Helft, a review of significant statistics and milestones, and plenty of energy, enthusiasm and yummy cake. Milestones of the past year include:

Attendance average in the summer was 60-70 people each day. Winter attendance dropped to around 55, and while there was a major snowstorm on January 25th, we did not close and served more than 30 neighbors in the middle of it. This spring, we are serving about 70 people, including several families with children.

What our Neighbors are saying:

William: *It means everything to me and the neighborhood. I appreciate all of it.*

Jonathan: Open Door is a saving place, a place of grace and mercy, a place of love, a place of kindness, and is the expectation of what God and Jesus want you to do.

Curtis: A place for fellowship, help and good food.

Marcus: Beautiful opportunity to be around positive people, giving hearts and beautiful spirits. Everyone comes around you and is beautiful. Come, relax, eat and fellowship.

Three, young Brothers: So good! Like the music!

LaToya: Thankful for everything you all are doing for everybody.

Leon: Important for folks who don't have meals, also interacting with the community and that's the most important. I see that Tab does things differently than other organizations. It's genuine here. You feel it.

Steve: Fellowship of people gathering together to experience the journey of life. Also, to crack jokes and have fun.

Michael: Good food really fills in gap with the pantry. A multitude of blessings. Pantries can't do what this does.

Charles: Excellent to bring people together nourishes with food and talk and music. A lot of people would be hungry in belly and spirit.

Amanda: I appreciate everything. Very good people.

Wendy: New for a couple of weeks. A neighbor told me about it and I've been coming since.

Spice: Every time I come, I leave full and thank the staff; definitely appreciated.

Del: *Nice way to meet the community.*

Samuel: Nice, friendly people.

Bert: Makes me feel comfortable. I am short on family so I feel at home here. Tab has always been here and never turns anyone away. You find a way to welcome everyone.

Heartfelt devotionals are offered every Monday and a blessing table was available every Wednesday that we were open. At least five different community partners visited regularly on Fridays throughout the year.

The average number of volunteers on a given day is 10-12, and our directory of volunteers includes more than 40 people – many of whom are not Tab members.

Food waste is negligible. Minimal leftovers are sent home with neighbors or delivered to other community partners including: Coburn Place, Horizon House or to a local senior apartments where one of the regular attendees lives.

Just over \$5,000 was collected in our "donations" box available for neighbors to contribute, as they are able.

Written prayer requests from the neighbors average about a dozen per week – not counting those said at the meals and with volunteers.

Although the number of people impacted by the Open Door Ministry Café is impossible to know, on the day of celebration, we inquired: **"What does the Open Door Café mean to you?"**

You will see their responses to the right here— which serve as evidence that the purpose is being served and lives are touched by Christ's presence in the ministry.⊕
