

DID YOU KNOW?

Session has recently approved a much-needed restoration and renovation project for the Sanctuary organ.

Our instrument has been well-maintained and has faithfully served the congregation for 40 years, but now major components are beginning to show their age and fail. The project that Session has approved will remove, restore, and reinstall every part of the organ and its systems, including keyboards, pedals, blowers, air reservoirs, all 3,603 pipes, and the cables and connections to each individual pipe. In addition, some prudent additions will expand the usefulness of the instrument.

We are excited to have signed contracts with two firms who will collaborate on this undertaking: the original builder of our organ, *Casavant Frères of Quebec, Canada*, and Indianapolis-based organ builders, *Goulding & Wood*. You will see signs of work beginning very soon, and the entire scope of the project is expected to last around 24 months.
