## Did You Know?

**Session has recently approved a much-needed restoration and renovation project for the Sanctuary organ.**



Our instrument has been well-maintained and has faithfully served the congregation for 40 years, but now major components are beginning to show their age and fail. The project that Session has approved will remove, restore, and reinstall every part of the organ and its systems, including keyboards, pedals, blowers, air reservoirs, all 3,603 pipes, and the cables and connections to each individual pipe. In addition, some prudent additions will expand the usefulness of the instrument.

We are excited to have signed contracts with two firms who will collaborate on this undertaking: the original builder of our organ, *Casavant Frères of Quebec, Canada*, and Indianapolis-based organ builders, *Goulding & Wood*. You will see signs of work beginning **very soon**, and the entire scope of the project is expected to last around 24 months.

**If you would like to find out more information about the project or learn how you can support this exciting opportunity, there will be an informational meeting held following the 10:00 am service on Sunday, August 13.**

# You Are Loved!

Dear Friends,

The Apostle Paul writes to the Church in Philippi:

*"I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the Gospel from the first day until now." (1:3)*

I have read and written those words many times before, but now they take on special meaning for me as this will be the last time I will write them to a congregation I have loved and served.

**"I thank my God for you"** (and indeed I do) **"every time I remember you"** (and indeed I will), **"constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you"** (which I assure you I will).

Paul was writing to a congregation he dearly loved, and I sense in his words a feeling I can only describe as homesickness. He was missing the friendships and relationships he had shared with them.

I know that I will feel the same once I step away from my role as your pastor. I have been asked many times by many of you, "What will you miss the most?" and I can honestly answer "I will miss YOU and the friendships and relationships we have formed." Of course there will be other parts of ministry I will miss: preaching and teaching, the hospital visits, the baptisms, the privilege of serving communion, even the funerals, because it is in those settings I have had the opportunity to share in ministry with people, yet I honestly think what I will miss the most are the relationships we have built simply by doing life and ministry together as a part of the Tab family.

Paul writes of his gratitude for the Philippian congregation's *"sharing in the Gospel from the first day until now."* I can say the same.

When we came to Tab in November 2007, we knew only a very few of you, and some of you will remember that I was called as a "designated" pastor on a three-year contract. No one knew if this relationship was going to work at all. (So uncertain were some of you that I got "more than the usual number of 'no votes' at the congregational meeting that called me.) But those three years turned into 15 wonderful years of sharing the Gospel together...and I am grateful.

I am writing this before the July 30 celebration which I know will be a wonderful day of worship and fellowship, and before my final service with you on August 6 which I anticipate will be meaningful, holy and emotional. So, even without those two very special and memorable events, I want to say **"thank you"** for the privilege you have given me to serve as your pastor. You have welcomed me into your hearts and your homes. You have listened to my teaching and respected my leadership and for that I will always be tremendously grateful. Through the years I have told so many of my colleagues that I have had the privilege of serving with people I enjoy and by whom I am inspired. **Thank you!**

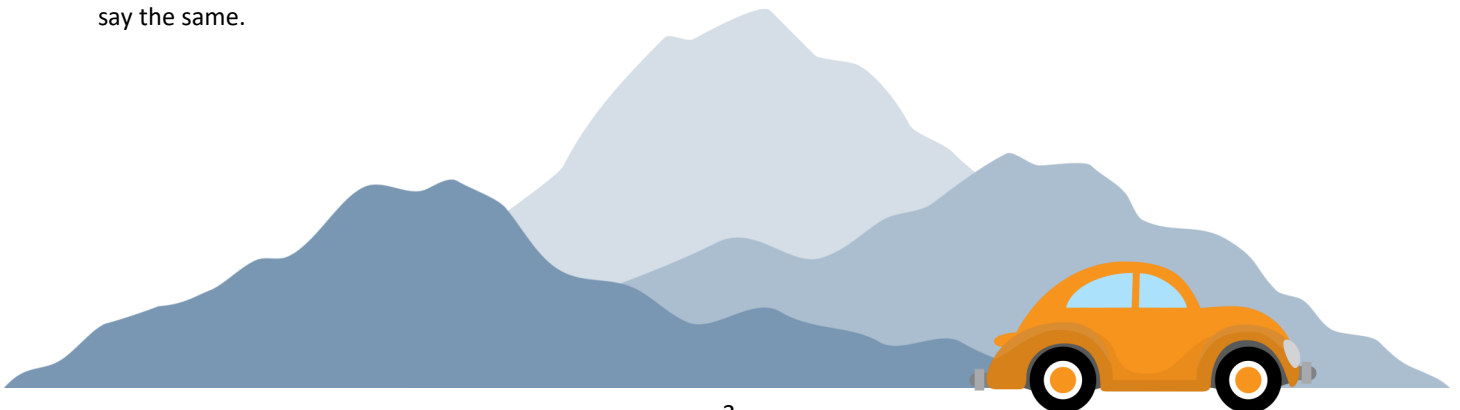

# Member Spotlight

## Sara Heitman: A lady of the people, for the people!

If you're stepping into Tab for the first time or if you are a member, one person you will see on Sundays, either in the Front Office or ushering you into worship is **Sara Heitman**. We know God is omniscient, omnipresent and omnipotent, but when it comes to Tab, Sara is omnipresent serving the church and the community.

So *who* is Sara Heitman? Sara radiates faith in every aspect of her life; she lives it. She is like the Ionic, Doric or Corinthian column holding up the church structure, in that, she is so totally engaged in church life. She is indispensable. Her unwavering faith in Christ and His Sovereignty over her life has kept her going, whether it was teaching 4th and 5th graders at IPS for 38 years or volunteering at Tab. Her faith has allowed her to survive losing her beloved father to ALS when she was 14, her mother and her only sister, and just last year, a personal bout of breast cancer.

She grew up at Tab from the age of four and has been a member for 65 years. Growing up in the neighborhood on Pennsylvania Street, her education began at School 60 and ended at Shortridge High School. Sara recalls seeing the spire and cross at Tab as she lay in bed. She and her sister attended Sunday school classes through middle school and high school. Sara remembers Tab youth camps at Winona Lake and Hanover. After graduating from Purdue in Education, she received her Master's at Butler University. She met her beloved husband, Don, when he sauntered up to her as the boys' chaperone at an education camp at Bradford Woods. Since then he has chaperoned her for 45 years! Where did they tie the knot you might ask? At Tab, as you see in the photo.

In general conversation, the commonly asked question is "*What* do you do, Sara?" If you ask

Sara that, you will be taken aback at the scores of jobs that are/ have been on her plate in her tenure at Tab. Sara has been a Deacon and an Elder, on the Missions, Worship and Congregational Life Committees (which encompasses TabFest, church celebrations and retreats). Her current responsibilities include Wedding Coordinator, Funeral Coordinator, Usher at Worship, and decorating the Sanctuary at Easter and Christmas. She is also involved in the Pastors' Bible Study and Small Group studies.

Past activities include tutoring, Sunday school teacher, Vacation Bible School and KidsGames. She was a permanent fixture at the Mozel Sanders' Thanksgiving Dinners for over 40 years and cleaned the grounds on Tab work days.

Mission trips have included those to Romania, Israel, Greece, and Phoenix to serve the "poor, naked and hungry women and orphans," as our Lord commanded us to do.

What does she do in her spare time? Amazingly, she finds time for her hobbies of travel (Oberammergau to see a passion play, Scotland and all 50 states); season

# Be Still and Know

## Mission Trip Reflections

**“Be still and Know”** was the theme for the 2023 Tab Youth Mission Trip to Neighborhood Ministries in Phoenix, Arizona. But, when you’re traveling with 13 young people, that theme seems a bit far-fetched. There’s not much stillness in airports, much less at Kids Camp - where more than 300 children eventually passed through the very popular craft room staffed by our team. On most days, the closest thing to being still was the motionlessness of our exhausted team on the van ride back to our rental house at the end of the day.

As chaperone and daily van driver of these incredible youth, I soon discovered that I actually had numerous opportunities to be still on our trip; to be still and know that God was present in all aspects of the mission; to be still and observe the joy and love overflowing from hearts of all ages; and to be still and know that God was at work in my own heart.

You see, like many folks at Tab, prior to this trip, I always viewed Tab’s connection to Neighborhood Ministries to be through Tab members, the Reel family. Post mission trip, I now see how God uses Tab’s relationship with Neighborhood Ministries in ways far beyond keeping Tab connected to Katy Reel’s legacy.

In the stillness of my own reflection, I discovered that God uses this partnership in ways that are as valuable, beneficial and meaningful to Tab’s own mission legacy as to NMPHX. In fact, as the mission committee continues to discern what constitutes a good mission partnership for Tab, NMPHX rises to the top in several ways.

For example, unlike any other current partners, NMPHX provides our youth with a unique hands-on experience God in service and through community. The annual mission trip is





also a “ready-made” opportunity to prepare and endear Tab’s future leaders to be missional and relational in ministry – in keeping with Tab’s own legacy.

Serving at Kids Camp also gives Tab youth the rare opportunity to participate in a model of mutual mission and ministry where “power” is balanced. Often mission trips rely on the “missionaries” to be the main providers of resources, time and talent; however, at NMPHX, the Kids Camp leadership - local teens and young adults who live in the neighborhood or grew up in the program - are the ones who have that role.



Tab youth are, in essence, the outsiders and must quickly learn to integrate with and learn from the NMPHX leaders in order to serve the Kids Camp children together.

NMPHX Kids Camp is also intentional about teaching their leaders (of all ages) how to comfortably talk about Jesus with others. Children and youth learn at a relatively young age how to share their own faith stories. Our youth have the chance to quickly become more skilled at sharing in ways that many adults are still not comfortable.



NMPHX is also an incredible example of how to grow a legacy of leaders in ministry such that there is never a lack of leaders for the programming. Some of the key young adult leaders and mentors at this year’s Kids Camp were once children in the program. They worked their way from participant, to junior leaders, to work crew, then to group leaders. Following this pathway eventually affords young people the chance to become a program intern who will undoubtedly provide mentorship to the generations coming up next. This “growing your own” pattern was common and created relational bonds that were both powerful and heartwarming to witness. I believe this is a model worth exploring for our own Tab ministries.



Finally, NMPHX is indisputably, a model of a faith-based, holistic, communal and social betterment ministry that is transformative across generations. They minister to the whole person, the whole family, and the whole neighborhood, in a way that creates Greater Faith, Deeper Relationship and Stronger Community. What better definition of a Tab mission partner could there be? ✝
