SG&D's "PROBLEM OF PAIN"

Sunday, October 8, at 9a in the Parlor, a new class begins on C.S. Lewis' book, "The Problem of Pain," facilitated by Mark John. "I am trying to show only that the old Christian doctrine of being made perfect through suffering is not incredible." In his book, Lewis offers a rational case for the problem of pain. This is not just reasons and arguments. Spiritual transformation begins with awareness. There may be reason with no morality, but there is no morality without reason. He speaks from the mind, but many of his examples arise from his own heart and life. As Lewis says, "Reason is the organ of truth, the imagination is the organ of meaning." In this class we will offer a presentation of Lewis' key points in his own words, but have built in at every stage images to help spark our imaginations to illustrate what Lewis is saying, and enliven the truth that he evokes in our hearts. Read the book in advance if you like, but it is not required.
