

A Thanksgiving Challenge

everal years ago I was part of a group of clergy women who accepted a mutual friend's social media challenge to post an expression of gratitude every day in November. The hope was that we, personally, would experience the increasing joy that comes when hearts are grateful and that our posts also would inspire others to practice gratitude as well.

In addition to the obvious things, such as family, friends and good health, most of us were intentional about naming our thankfulness for the ordinary things of life that might be discounted or easily overlooked. As sociologist and researcher, Brene Brown, suggests: "We practice gratitude to honor what's ordinary about our lives, because that is what's truly extraordinary."

Initially, it was easy to identify things for which I was thankful—things that brought a smile to my face, made my day better, caused happiness, or gave me a renewed sense of hope. One of the guidelines of the challenge, though, was to make each post unique. A new day meant a new gratitude.

As the month progressed, this no-repeat caveat forced my "gratitude posts" to first become a time of prayer. Each evening I would set aside time to quietly reflect on the activities of the day and to remember the people I had encountered along the way. This "naming" became a Prayer of Examen for me...a chance to examine my days, looking for the ways that God had been present in the ordinary whether I noticed in the moment or not. It also became an opportunity to be grateful for (and learn from) all that had happened and all the people whose life path crossed mine.

Since then I've tried to practice gratitude all year long, although I must confess two things; 1) by no means am I faithful at the daily examen prayer outside of November, and 2) I'm most intentional about naming my gratefulness when something specific is happening with family and friends or when things are particularly difficult, and I desperately need to experience renewed joy.

I have learned that practicing gratitude, meaning that I approach it with intentionality and consistency, joy and peace will always emerge. In fact, this is why, when asked to offer a stewardship verse for this year, I chose one from the first letter to the Christians in Thessalonica that I believe captures the intertwined relationship among prayer, gratitude and joy:

"Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

—1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 (NIV)

November holds a special significance for me, one that goes beyond the Thanksgiving holiday. It serves as a yearly reminder for us to live in a spirit of gratitude, not just during the holiday season, but throughout the year. In our Tab congregation, we take this opportunity to appreciate the many ways in which God has blessed us with generations of kingdom-building ministry. We celebrate with joy the fact that as stewards of God's blessings, we are called to be a blessing to others and promote Greater Faith, Deeper Relationships, and Stronger Community.

Some folks rightly call this "Stewardship Campaign" season in that we raise awareness of the need for the faithful financial support of the congregation's work and worship. I, however, hope that we will also experience it as a joyful "Celebration of Tab's Stewardship" of God's provision and kingdom work.

Friends, there is much that deserves our gratitude. I pray that November will be a time of intentional, prayerful practice of gratitude that leads to great joy in your life and for those whom you love. In that, God will rejoice, I'm sure.

Member Spotlight

DON McMURTRY

hould you go to the Open Door Café or other events, you would see Don McMurtry serving Tab's neighbors and members respectively. Don has been at Tab since 2009. He also is a regular attendee at the Pastor's Bible Study each week.

Born in Indianapolis on April 11, 1940, Don was brought up in a Christian home alongside a brother ten years his senior. Their father worked at Allison's making fighter jet engines during WWII and their mother stayed home to take care of the



family. Don attended IPS School 50 and graduated from Ben Davis High School.

After graduating from Eastern Oklahoma A&M College with an Arts & Science degree, Don worked in retail knowing that he would be drafted soon for the Vietnam war. After basic training at Fort Knox he was stationed at Fort Gorden in Augusta, Georgia as a Signal Supply Specialist until 1965 when he left the army. Don then worked in Fort Wayne in retail management for fourteen years and made his return to Indy in 1980 starting his own cleaning business for commercial and residential properties. Don retired after 30+ years at the age of 67.

Brought up in the Methodist Church, Don always believed in God. His spiritual journey ceased when he graduated from college through 1994. God, however, was active behind the scenes though because Don felt that gnawing sensation of something lacking in his life. He joined a Westfield church, rededicated his life and was soon "on fire" for Jesus! After attending St. Luke's United Methodist Church for seventeen years, he found Tab on a church hunting trip. He was mesmerized by its devotion to service in its neighborhood to the poor and needy.

That was the beginning of another chapter in Don's life. What appeals to him is Tab's multi-faceted approach to serving people in its neighborhood in every possible way; the servant attitude of its members and its many activities such as tutoring, legal aid, health clinic, and sports for kids.


The two Bible verses engraved in his heart is John 14:6, "in my house there are many rooms;" and Matthew 25:35, "I was hungry and you gave me food. I was thirsty, and you gave me something to drink. I was alone and you invited me into your house." Don looks at Tab as sharing its mansion of "plenty" with the poor and needy. His faith journey has seen a hyperbolic rise in adulthood, unlike others who "grew up in the church."

And what does Don do on the side?

He is a connoisseur of art and fine china; his home is filled with exquisite Dresden, Royal Doulton, Waterford and the like! Cooking, gardening, and listening to classic music are his other loves. Don has a lens for beauty on all levels! †

A Giving Heart, A Giving City

The Mozel Sanders Annual Thanksgiving Dinner by Mike O'Banyel



n the 1960s, 70s, and 80s, the Rev. Mozel Sanders served as pastor at Indianapolis' Mt. Vernon Missionary Baptist Church where he was known widely as a tireless champion for families in need. As part of his outreach in 1971 he started providing hot dinners on Thanksgiving Day to any and all who came to receive them.

Quickly, the annual dinner grew beyond something he and his congregation could do alone. To meet the need, "satellite" locations opened throughout the city. One of the first satellite locations (and now the longest running!) was at Tabernacle Presbyterian Church.

Soon, Tab became the dinner's largest distribution point. Over the years, Tab volunteers have provided more than 900 meals to area residents per year, dishing them up for

people who came to Tab to pick up their meals or delivering them to homes. Each meal was accompanied by; bakery items donated by Taylor's Bakery; pies made, and donated by Tab members; and bags of commodities donated by Gleaners that include: toiletries, canned goods, and other items.

As you might imagine, this is a massive undertaking, requiring many hands and hearts. That's where you come in. Tab needs volunteers to make this day a blessing to hundreds of hungry families.

Sign Up For A Well-Oiled Machine

Here are some things you might like to know as you consider serving this Thanksgiving:

- > The Mozel Sanders Thanksgiving Dinner serves some 40,000 meals from more than 50 locations.
- >> Citywide, the dinner will serve about 15,000 pounds of turkey and 10,000 pounds of dressing.
- >>> Here at Tab, Mozel Sanders is a well-oiled machine thanks in large part to processes created by Ted & Eileen O'Banyel and carried forward today by Mike O'Banyel and his family.

One key to a smooth operation is the pre-event volunteer sign-up. If you would like to volunteer, please sign up and include the names of anyone you plan to bring with you. If people show up without signing up beforehand, we'll try to put them to work, but job priorities will go to those who have signed up first.





These Are Our Guests

While we are proud of our well-oiled Thanksgiving machine, we don't do it to seem machine-like to our neighbors who receive meals. We also don't want to

treat them like "needy people getting a handout." On the contrary: we want them to feel like guests in our home.

To emphasize this welcoming feel, we create a space where people can sit and either have a piece of pie and cup of coffee, or enjoy a complete meal, all with a team of people with the sole job of being "Hospitality Hosts."

Even if you're not one of those designated hosts, we ask that

everyone serving on that day treat our guests as, well, *guests*. Greet them and wish them a Happy Thanksgiving. Share your name. Ask about their families. Ask if there's anything we can pray about for them.

In other words, in joining this massive undertaking, don't treat it like a massive undertaking. Instead, remember the heart of the man who started it all; a man who believed he didn't represent his church, or his annual event, but who felt instead that he represented Christ.

Serve with that heart, and you certainly will be a blessing to those you serve, and those with whom you serve.

Organ Renovation Update

This month the cantilevers that held the trumpets on the back balcony wall have been completely removed and are in the shop for a complete rebuild and re-leathering. The trumpets are on their way to the Casavant facility in Quebec where they will be re-voiced and restored along with other pipework that was removed from the east chamber.

Also this month we received the report from the structural engineer working on our project. The wooden supports in the east balcony chamber will be



replaced with more structurally sound steel beams and the back wall of the west balcony will soon be taken out and supported with steel beams that will be placed to make way for a new section of the organ that will be installed in that space. The floor of the west side of the back balcony will also be reconfigured to make space for a new 4-manual console that will have the capability to play both the back and the front organs when all of our work is completed.




STEWARDSHIP 2024
