#### **2023 YEAR-END CONTRIBUTIONS**

### **CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING**

The annual Christmas Joy offering will be taken at Tab's Worship Service on SUN, DEC 17, or you may give online anytime at tabpres.org/giving. By giving to the Christmas Joy offering, you will be helping families of active and retired church workers. The offering is shared equally by the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and Presbyterian-related, racial ethnic schools and colleges for education. ### QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS (QCD)

When planning your IRA withdrawal strategy, you may want to consider making charitable donations through a QCD. A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year, as long as certain rules are met. In addition to the benefits of giving to a charity, a QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. Keeping your taxable income lower may reduce the impact to certain tax credits and deductions, including Social Security and Medicare. See your tax professional for full details.




## Season's Greetings, Friends!

**100** Years of Outstretched Arms Into the Community by John Byers



o the story goes, soon after the Sanctuary wing of Tabernacle Presbyterian Church was completed, and years before the Gymnasium wing was finished, some of Tab's boys made a practice of playing basketball in the coal bin. Whether or not this influenced Pastor Dunkle, in 1924, to ask young Tab member, J. Dwight Peterson, to organize a recreation program with a \$50 allocation is a matter for conjecture. But it is a fact that he did. So during all of the year 2024 Tab church will celebrate the milestone event of its oldest outreach program, **Tab Recreation**, turning 100 years old.

This article, and others to come throughout the year,

will take a peek by decades at what was going on in the nation; in entertainment; in the world of sports; and highlights about "Tab's outstretched arm into the community" as former pastor James Martin was fond of referring to Tab Recreation.


The Roaring 20's described the early years of the decade. Women got the right to vote in 1920; The Charleston became the dance craze of the nation, and The Cotton Club was the place to be. In 1927 Lindberg flew solo across the Atlantic and The Jazz Singer, the first 'talking picture,' was in theaters. By 1929 the Great Depression was underway.

It was 1920 and Babe Ruth's first season with the

Yankees. Lou Gerrig, the Yankees' first baseman, was his sensational rival. Yankee Stadium was constructed in 1922. The first winter Olympics took place in Chamonix, France in 1924. The Toronto Granites took the gold medal in hockey, beating the United States 6-1, and, Red Grange, the "Galloping Ghost," was the Chicago Bears sensational halfback.

During the 20's, in addition to sports, Tab Recreation's outreach included Boy Scout Troops 72 and 36, Girl Scout Troop 22, and Roki Camp Fire Girls. The Tab Players Club, did productions on the fully equipped stage in Tab's Gym. James B. Martin was hired as the first Director of Tab Recreation in 1926. Tab's basketball teams played teams sponsored by other churches and organizations around the city and beyond.

This was the decade of the 1920's. Tab Recreation was given birth and was beginning to grow. •


