The Interim Transition Team is rejoicing that Session unanimously approved and the Committee on Ministry of Whitewater Valley Presbytery resoundingly endorsed the The Rev. Dr. Bill Smutz as Tab's Interim Senior Pastor. Dr. Smutz received his Master's in Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary and his Doctorate in Ministry from Eden Theological Seminary, and was ordained as a Minister of Word and Sacrament in the PC(USA) in 1987.
