("Missions Unit" is Tab's Sunday school replacement for elementary-aged students to learn about the geography, culture, and Christian missions in other countries.) **This**

week, Tab's elementary students will visit Brazil. While we are there, we will learn a few words and phrases in Portuguese, create pan flutes at the International Challenge, make (and taste!) a chocolate treat called "Brigadieros," play "Chicken Fight" and have a soccer relay in the Gym, try our hands at a traditional Brazilian table game called "Coyote and Chickensi" at the Game Center, create wooden snakes and make cupcake liner parrots at the craft tables, play a matching game about some of the more than 4 million (!) animals of the Amazon, and taste Pao de Quiejo (cheese bread) and Feijoada (the national dish of Brazil) in the Food Center. FUN FACTS ABOUT BRAZIL: Brazil has won the soccer World Cup five times, more than any other country. Also, Brazil has the largest number of native Japanese people outside of Japan itself.
