THIS WEEK'S MISSIONS UNIT UPDATE

This week, on our "trip around the world" to learn about the geography, culture, and Christians missions in other countries, Tab's elementary students will be visiting: **The Netherlands!** While we're there, we will learn a few words and phrases in Dutch, cook (and eat) a Dutch pastry called a Poffertjes at the International Challenge, play "Alles Vogels Vliegen" and Dutch Pins in the gym, try our hands at Dutch Blitz at the Game Center, create paper windmills and plant tulip bulbs at the craft tables, learn about the Dutch Masters and play a matching game with some of their most famous paintings at Brain Busters and taste Frikandellar (Dutch fried meatballs), Gouda cheese, Herring on rye bread, and Stroopwaffles in the Food Center.

FUN FACT ABOUT THE NETHERLANDS: Amsterdam, the nation's capital, has 1,281 bridges spanning the cities 165 canals. Bonus fun fact, Dutch men are, as a group, the tallest men in the world with an average height of 6 feet.
