A Spiritual Snack

Are Spiritual Snacks Really A Thing?!

We all have questions! Questions that continually rumble around in our minds and in our hearts. Questions that invite us to ponder important, weighty topics of meaning and purpose, of life and death, of values and priorities—especially for we who consider ourselves to be children of God and disciples of Jesus.

If you have a moment and would like to tackle some of these questions through the lens of a Psalm, here is a spiritual psalm snack that may be a useful resource.

Snack Enhancing Ideas

- Find a comfortable place that offers quiet for reflection
- · Light a candle if desired
- Read the psalm. An NRSVUE translation is provided.
 Additional translations/paraphrases may enhance your experience
- Note on a piece of paper, words, ideas, feelings, and images that rise up or stand out
- Read the brief reflection provided, set it alongside your observations, and consider how the Holy Spirit may be speaking to you in the present through this psalm
- Spend a few moments thinking about individuals and situations for which you feel led to pray
- Close with your own prayer or the one provided
- DON'T FORGET TO BLOW OUT THE CANDLE!

Psalm 121 (NRSVUE)

A Song of Ascents

- ¹ I lift up my eyes to the hills from where will my help come?
- ² My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.
- ³ He will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber.
- ⁴ He who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep.
- ⁵ The Lord is your keeper; the Lord is your shade at your right hand.
- ⁶ The sun shall not strike you by day nor the moon by night.
- ⁷ The Lord will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life.
- 8 The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time on and forevermore.

Reflection

Notice first that Psalm 121 is described as a song of ascents; a song that the faithful would sing when they traveled to and from the Temple in Jerusalem to attend a great festival. The reminder of the Lord's constant presence surely provided great comfort to pilgrims who rarely traveled more than a few miles from where they were born and lived. Note second the second line of verse 6—'nor the moon by night.' This is most likely the origin of the word "moonstruck." In parts of the ancient world it was believed that moonlight was responsible for physical and mental maladies, and so should be avoided.

We present day pilgrims are probably most familiar with this psalm from a funeral. At a time of great loss and sorrow, when we struggle to form our thoughts, Psalm 121 speaks for us the meaningful words we want to say in such an important moment.

I take great comfort in the unmovable presence of God proclaimed in Psalm 121. We can be lost physically or emotionally or both. We can try to run away from our poor choices and bad behaviors. We can attempt to get away from the bad stuff of life by hiding under the covers with the pillow over our head. Yet, no matter where we go, God is present, God is with us, God does not and will never abandon us. When we are feeling uncertain about all manner of things, our good and amazing and hope-filled news is that God is right alongside us! Never a bad thing to know!

Closing Prayer

Loving God, thank you for never losing track of us; especially in those moments when we try to lose track of you. Keep our coming in...keep our going out...in Jesus, keep our lives—today and tomorrow and forever. Amen!

Member Spotlight

Meet Louise

John 13:34-35 says, "By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." That is true of 98 year old Louise Willson. She lives this commandment to the letter.

Born in Hamilton, Ohio, Louise spent her early years with her three brothers in Ohio, until they moved to Hagerstown, Indiana. Her father was the Superintendent of Schools and her mother, a teacher. Louise was Prom Queen in high school. While a senior in high school, her aunt Margaret and her good friend Aunt Alice (husband-to-be Bill's aunt) arranged a date for her, with Bill. It was love at first sight. Their first date was a football game and a sock hop, following it.

Graduating from high school in 1944, Bill joined the Merchant Academy and spent time during WWII, transporting food and

supplies. The faithful Louise wrote Bill a letter each day when Bill was away. When the war ended, he transferred to Purdue University. Louise enrolled at Indiana University. No one screams



louder than Louise when it comes to IU's basketball games! In her very first year, the beautiful Louise was voted

"Homecoming Queen." The couple tied the knot when Louise graduated from IU with a degree in business education in 1948.

After marriage, Louise taught business and English at a school in Battle Ground, close to Purdue. Bill's graduation from Purdue in 1951 coincided with the birth of their oldest daughter, Nancy. They moved to Richmond where Bill began working with Richmond Fireproof Doors, and where they bought their first home.

They attended Reid Memorial Church in Richmond. Louise kept busy with bridge clubs, in between giving birth to



Debbie in 1954 and Libby in 1959. When the Richmond Gas Company sponsored Louise for the "Mrs. America" competition, she came in second place. The family

spent some time in Toronto when Bill was transferred there. The girls learned to ski, ice skate, and sing "God Save The Queen" while Bill enjoyed ice hockey. Following Toronto, Bill found a job in Indianapolis in 1968. The family attended Northminster Presbyterian church, where Louise taught Sunday School and she and Bill sang in the choir. Both served as Elders, remaining at Northminster for more than 30 years. Both loved travel and entertaining fellow church members and neighbors. All three girls graduated from IU and were married at Northminster.

After 60 years of marriage, Bill passed away in 2008. Louise, then, joined Tab where she was an usher for many years. She served at Open Door and formed many close friendships which have sustained her through the deep loss of her daughter Debbie in 2018. She attended John Gable's Wednesday bible studies until she stopped driving at 96.

Louise has felt the Almighty covering her with His shadow through each trial. Like Lazarus, Louise has been at the brink of death and, yet, the Lord brought her back from a ruptured appendix, a broken hip and pneumonia; twice, from hospice care. A beautiful, vivacious and lively lady, she feels her work on earth is not yet done. 1 John is her favorite chapter.

Tab Recreation

1980s Population Growth

This article, and one more to come this year, will take a peek by decades at what was going on in the nation; in entertainment; in the world of sports; and highlights about "Tab's outstretched arm into the community" as former pastor James Martin was fond of referring to Tab Recreation.

"Baby boomers" of the 1950's had babies in the 1980's. Youth sports, along with schools and other organizations faced pressure to find space for the growing population. We experienced Reaganomics, massive increases in military spending, more national debt accumulated in eight years than in all of previous U.S. history, the worst recession since the Great Depression, and a stock market crash. Nonetheless, the economy righted itself. A hardline U.S. approach to Communism everywhere in the world eventually led to the decline of Communism, the fall of the Berlin Wall, and the collapse of the Soviet Union.














When Americans went to the movies, they saw Ghostbusters, Die-Hard, Beverly Hills Cop, E.T. and Fast Times at Ridgemont High. Action movies included Indiana Jones, Star Wars and Drugstore Cowboy. On television we watched The Jeffersons, The Cosby Show, The Simpsons, Family Ties and Roseanne. Night time soaps included Dallas, Dynasty and Falcon Crest. VCRs permitted us to rent movies to watch at home. And, music videos made stars of Duran Duran, R.E.M., Madonna, Prince and Michael Jackson.

Early computers became available to average individuals in the 80's. Time magazine's Man of the Year in 1982 was The Computer. Creation of the internet allowed us to communicate with one another. Microsoft's Word, word processing system, and the Windows operating system made operating computers easier to learn. Video game systems Atari, Nintendo and Game Boy became popular. Kids and adults alike became enamored with games like Super Mario Bros., and Tetris. Pac Man was an arcade favorite.



In sports, hockey's Wayne Gretzky; boxing's Mike Tyson; soccer's Diego Maradona; and basketball's Larry Bird, Magic Johnson and Michael Jordan garnered the



headlines. In the 1980 Winter Olympics, the U.S. Hockey Team's 'Miracle on Ice' stunned and thrilled Americans. In the 1986 FIFA World Cup, Maradona's 'Goal of the Century' left an indelible mark on soccer folklore.

At Tab Recreation, the 34-year tenure of Recreation Director Russ Earl came to an end, as Russ accepted the position of Adult Fellowship Director, and John Byers was appointed interim Recreation Director. Softball and basketball programs were at capacity, with both boys' and girls' leagues in each sport. Soccer was a program gaining in popularity nationally, and growing at Tab as well. Football leagues, although not large in teams, took up a lot of field time and space in the fall. With select, tournament teams in women's softball, youth football and youth soccer, Tab's one gym, and one field was stretched beyond capacity. Remote sites in several nearby school gyms allowed basketball to continue growing. A second, late-winter season

was added, and basketball grew to 100 teams at its max. St. Richards' School allowed Tab recreation to use its field for spring and fall soccer.





which relieved the conflict with softball and football. Other changes introduced with the change in leadership included:

team practices in all sports starting at 6p or 7p on weeknights, with games scheduled on Saturdays. A team could count on having its practice at the same time and place throughout the season; devotions were prepared and given to coaches, who were expected to share them at the end of each practice; t-shirts were redesigned with new logos; and team photos were prepared with the player's name and team name, and given at no cost to all players at the end of seasons. While trying not to throw anyone off the train, Tab Recreation was attempting to gently move in some new directions. So ended the 1980's.


ORGAN PROJECT


