A Litany of Confession & Spiritual Growth

Based on Galatians 5:22-23 and Journal entries from the Youth Mission Trip

Liturgist: In his letter to the Galatian faith community,
Paul reminded Christ followers that we are
to live by the Spirit of God, and not by our
own egos and desires. He gave a picture
of the fruit that emerges when the Spirit
is present in our lives and at work in the
world: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness,
goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and
self-control. As a faith community, let us
confess the things that keep us from living
by the Spirit and from seeing God's Spirit in
one another.

Reader: Gracious Lord, on our mission trip in Phoenix, we were tasked with looking for evidence of your presence in our ministry work and in each other. Thank you that when we sought, you were always found.

Reader: We first saw the presence of your Spirit in the way the youth group was unconditional in its love for the kids at the camp from the first day we arrived. We received your love as the kids accepted us. We felt your love grow among us as we got to know one another.

People: Forgive us, Lord, when we are too afraid to reach out to people we don't know and miss the chance to give and receive love.

Help us be more courageous and inclusive.

Reader: We felt pure joy each morning in the worship services when everyone was singing, dancing and getting so excited for their favorite worship songs. We pray it was pleasing to you, Lord. We especially saw joy in the face of one of the little ones when the worship song was sung in her family's first language, Spanish.

People: Forgive us, Lord, when we are more worried about what other people think than we are about embracing pure worship of you. Help us to express joy in our own ways and to encourage others as they worship you in their own languages, cultures, and forms.

Reader: Loving God, we recognized the presence of your peace when doing crafts with the kids. Even with all the craziness we felt peace because we saw how much the kids enjoyed what they were doing. We also felt peace every day when we slowed down and reflected back on the day of service.

People: Gracious God, forgive us for the times we let the noise around us disturb the peace within us. Help us learn to slow down and offer gratitude for your presence in every circumstance.

Reader: Patient Lord, we saw your gracious forbearance displayed in one of the Tab youth when a little girl was demanding and disrespectful toward her. Rather than let her patience be tested, the youth group member stayed calm and used spunky humor to gently reset the tone with the girl. Her patience with the little girl created a special bond between the two of them for the rest of the week.

People: Forgive us, merciful God, for the times we react with defensiveness rather than seize the opportunity to respond with grace.

Help us see one another's pain and to look for ways to connect in our common need for grace, humor, and love.

Reader: Loving God, we were witness to so much kindness on our trip to Phoenix especially in the way the little children treated each other—helping one another, sharing craft supplies with one another, and siblings consoling younger siblings who were upset. We also saw kindness in our youth group when one of the girls volunteered to go on an errand so that another could finish her summer class homework online. Many of the girls experienced kindness from some of the older girls who gave up their breakfast time every day to help braid hair for the newbies before we went to the Kids Camp.

People: Kind and compassionate God, forgive us when our self-concern is so great that it blinds us to the needs of others or keeps us from being kind. Open our eyes to see the little things that we can do and the simple sacrifices that we can make so that others will experience feelings of comfort, care, and belonging.

Reader: Holy God, we saw your goodness in all the children we served. They were pure, kind, and eager to participate. We also experienced your goodness in our youth group by the way we interacted with each other, always had each other's backs, and pitched in on the chores.

People: Forgive us, Lord, for the times we are defensive and ruthless, seeking to be right rather than good toward others. Open our hearts and minds to be like curious and eager children...eager to love and serve you by loving and serving one another.

Reader: Faithfulness was evident in the way the local teen leaders responded to the spread of Covid in their group over the first weekend. Despite the need to merge groups, the complications in the transportation, and the many schedule changes, the still healthy teens modeled faithfulness. They were very chill and trusted God in whatever happened. They wrote their prayer requests on the prayer wall and trusted God would hear them. As an act of our own faithfulness, God, we pitched in helped where we could. We praise you for taking care of everything and everyone.

People: Forgive us, O God, when we panic. We when try to fix and control everything rather than trusting in your provision, guidance and will. Help us learn to be "chill," trust, and release to you!

Reader: Your beautiful gentleness, God, was present in so many leaders as they worked with kids, but we were especially touched to see it in an interaction between two little girls one who spoke both Spanish and English and another one who mostly spoke Spanish. This little girl was very curious about Indiana, but her limited vocabulary made it hard for her to express herself. The first little girl very gently helped her friend talk with us about Indiana by encouraging her and translating when necessary.

People: Forgive us Lord, when we are insensitive to the hearts and minds and contributions of those whose abilities are different than our own. Remind us again that you have created all of us good and given us purpose in your world. Help us become more like Jesus who notices struggles, appreciates contributions, and responds with compassion.

Reader: Thank you, God, that even in the heat and humidity of Phoenix, we saw people practicing self-control that was not very easy to do. During the really hot afternoons, it was tempting for everyone to go to the water-game areas or stay in the air-conditioned classrooms instead of rotating to the outside activities, however, the groups chose to do what they were supposed to do. We also saw self-control in our group at dinner each night when we all made sure that everyone had enough to eat before we took seconds. The adult leaders saw us showing self-control when we stayed off our phones in the evenings and hung out with each other instead.

People: Forgive us, God, for those times when we just can't wait, when we don't want to stop, when we indulge ourselves...and in doing so, sacrifice the well-being of ourselves or others. Help us find the balance of being carefree and spontaneous as well as disciplined and purposeful so that we might experience the joy and peace that comes with self-control.

Liturgist: In the words of St. Augustine of Hippo, "To confess, then, is to praise and glorify God; it is an exercise in self-knowledge and true humility in the atmosphere of grace and reconciliation." Having confessed with the intention of growing in God's grace, we give praise and glory to the One who loves us, forgives us and makes us whole. Amen.
