





A Spiritual Snack

Are Spiritual Snacks Really A Thing?!

We all have questions! Questions that continually rumble around in our minds and in our hearts. Questions that invite us to ponder important, weighty topics of meaning and purpose, of life and death, of values and priorities—especially for we who consider ourselves to be children of God and disciples of Jesus.

If you have a moment and would like to tackle some of these questions through the lens of a Psalm, here is a spiritual psalm snack that may be a useful resource.

Snack Enhancing Ideas

- Find a comfortable place that offers quiet for reflection
- Light a candle if desired
- Read the psalm. An NRSVUE translation is provided. Additional translations may enhance your experience
- Note on a piece of paper, words, ideas, feelings, and images that rise up or stand out
- Read the brief reflection provided, set it alongside your observations, and consider how the Holy Spirit may be speaking to you in the present through this psalm
- Spend a few moments thinking about individuals and situations for which you feel led to pray
- Close with your own prayer or the one provided
- DON'T FORGET TO BLOW OUT THE CANDLE!

Psalm 147 (NRSVUE)

A Song of Ascents

- ¹ Praise the LORD!
- How good it is to sing praises to our God, for he is gracious, and a song of praise is fitting.
- ² The LORD builds up Jerusalem; he gathers the outcasts of Israel.
- ³ He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.
- ⁴ He determines the number of the stars; he gives to all of them their names.
- ⁵ Great is our Lord and abundant in power; his understanding is beyond measure.
- ⁶ The LORD lifts up the downtrodden; he casts the wicked to the ground.
- ⁷ Sing to the LORD with thanksgiving; make melody to our God on the lyre.
- ⁸ He covers the heavens with clouds, prepares rain for the earth, makes grass grow on the hills.
- ⁹ He gives to the animals their food and to the young ravens when they cry.
- ¹⁰ His delight is not in the strength of the horse nor his pleasure in the speed of a runner,

- ¹¹ but the LORD takes pleasure in those who fear him, in those who hope in his steadfast love.
- ¹² Extol the LORD, O Jerusalem! Praise your God, O Zion!
- ¹³ For he strengthens the bars of your gates; he blesses your children within you.
- ¹⁴ He grants peace within your borders; he fills you with the finest of wheat.
- ¹⁵ He sends out his command to the earth; his word runs swiftly.
- ¹⁶ He gives snow like wool; he scatters frost like ashes.
- ¹⁷ He hurls down hail like crumbs who can stand before his cold?
- ¹⁸ He sends out his word and melts them; he makes his wind blow, and the waters flow.
- ¹⁹ He declares his word to Jacob, his statutes and ordinances to Israel.
- ²⁰ He has not dealt thus with any other nation; they do not know his ordinances.
 Praise the LORD!

Reflection

The editor or editors who assembled the book of Psalms wanted the book to end on a high note of praise; and so, I invite us to see that the last five psalms (146–150) share the opening line—"Praise the Lord". The focus on praise, this reminder for God's people to stop and praise the Lord, is always timely and important to hear. The reminder to praise is important, because we so easily get caught up in our busyness, caught up in our head games, caught up in our pessimism, caught up in our self-import that we forget to Praise God.

When we say, "God I don't have time to pray."

The psalmist says, "That's nice, but you still have to make time to praise the Lord!"

When we say, "God, my candidate didn't win, so I have no praise within."

The psalmist says, "That's no reason to forget our responsibility to praise the Lord!"

When we say, "The journey through life is all about me."

The psalmist says, "Get over yourself, and never stop praising the Lord!"

When we say, "Hear my praises God, and know how special I am."

The psalmist says, "Put a sock in it. Praise is always about God and never about you!"

Psalm 147 imagines God as the one who has a hand in all the forces of nature (see also Job 38 & 39), as the one who is deeply concerned for the peoples of the earth, and as the one who is ultimately clothed in mystery.

The psalmist makes clear that God does not need our praise, as much as we need to offer it. Praise keeps us humble and balanced and focused on God's purposes. A song of praise from God's people is always fitting (v1).

Let us pause for a moment over verse 11, especially the first phrase: "but the Lord takes pleasure in those who fear him." I believe the intent here is to encourage our "awe" before the Lord. The psalmist is not telling us to be afraid of the Lord. Instead, we are invited and encouraged to have great respect for the Lord, to hold the Lord in our highest regard, to be in awe of the Lord's love for us. We need to be very skeptical of anyone who ever encourages us to be scared of our God!

Closing Prayer

Lord of All, we hold you in awe today and every day. Thank you for creating us. Thank you for loving us so completely in Jesus. May our praises always ring in your ears. Amen!

What about Tab makes them keep coming back? The teaching, the friendliness, the warmth and ongoing relationships with people who love the Lord.






Their anchor verse is Deuteronomy 31:8, "The Lord Himself goes before you and will be with you. He will never leave you nor forsake you".


