

FROM TAB'S INTERIM PASTOR

Dear Friends,

The church year invites us to think about time differently. Instead of being built around calendar months, lunar cycles, or the rhythm of educational institutions, the church year is based on the major events in the life of Jesus. Experiencing time this way invites us as disciples to set the internal clock of our lives according to the compassion, love, and faithful imagination exhibited by Jesus as described in the Gospels. In this way of marking time, the first Sunday of Advent (December 1, 2024) is New Year's Day!

A new church year always begins with a season of waiting—remembering that God's people waited for a long time for the promised Messiah to appear. Advent is also a reminder that God's plans for creation and for our lives unfold according to God's time frame and not ours.

I hope that you—and those with whom you share this season—will find time in the midst of busyness to experience the quiet and anticipation that come with waiting. As we prepare to celebrate afresh God's gift of Jesus, whom we embrace as our Messiah, deliverer, and agent of change for our lives and world, we have the opportunity to refocus our lives in ways that make us better people and bring glory to God.

One of my favorite poems of the Advent season is by Presbyterian poet Ann Weems:

When God is ready
God will come
even to a godforsaken place
like a stable in Bethlehem.

Watch... for you know not when God comes.

Watch, that you might be found whenever wherever God comes! Let us make ourselves ready with joy and hope!

Lighting Advent Candles at Home:

A FAMILY TRADITION OF WAITING AND HOPE

Disciples of Jesus know and celebrate Advent as a time of waiting and preparation for Christmas—the celebration of Jesus' birth. The word Advent means "coming."

Advent observance dates back to the early Church. In 567 CE, the Council of Tours, a gathering of church leaders, established Advent as a time of fasting leading up to Christmas Day. Over time, the season of Advent has varied in length, ranging from three to seven weeks. In more recent centuries, the familiar four-week observance became the standard.

The Advent wreath originated in the Middle Ages in Germany or France. The circle of the wreath represents the unending love of God, and the evergreen branches symbolize eternal life

One of the loveliest Advent traditions is the lighting of Advent candles at home. Households prepare for Christmas with a weekly ceremony that includes scripture, prayer, and the lighting of candles (singing carols is optional) to signal the approach of Jesus' birth. Four candles, one for each week of the Advent season, are lit during these brief ceremonies. A fifth candle, the Christ candle, is lit on Christmas Eve or Day.

How an Advent Ceremony Works

On the first Sunday of Advent, during a simple service of worship, one of the candles is lit as a reminder for the household to prepare for the birth of Jesus. Each Sunday through Advent, another candle is lit until all four are burning, signaling that Jesus' birth is near. On Christmas Eve or Day, the fifth candle is lit to celebrate Jesus' arrival!

Set aside a few minutes each week for the household to gather in Advent worship. This time together, and the growing glow of the Advent candles, is a meaningful way to experience God's great love through Jesus, the light of the world.

The simple candle-lighting liturgies that follow can be used as is or enhanced with your own ideas and household traditions. Be sure to involve everyone in the services. They are designed for a child, and the child in all of us, to experience afresh the awe and wonder of God becoming flesh and dwelling among us.

The First Sunday of Advent

DECEMBER 1: THE CANDLE OF HOPE

Introduction: Someone says...

We light the first Advent candle to start this special season. Jesus is on the way; a reminder of the abundance of God's generosity towards us. Through the generous gift of Jesus, we dare to hope that all the world will become as God wants and intends it to be!

Scripture: Someone reads...

Scripture says – Happy are those whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord their God... Psalm 146:5

The Candle: As the first candle of Advent is lit, someone says...

A single flame announces that our time of Advent waiting has begun. As we anticipate God's good gift, may our hope flow onto all around us!

Prayer: Someone says...

Let us pray: "Hopeful God, help us to get ready for Jesus; making room in our lives and the entire world for all the hope he brings us from you. Amen!"





Binding Generations:

THE GIFT OF FAMILY TRADITIONS AT CHRISTMAS

For me, the best thing about the Advent/Christmas season (besides the obvious hope and joy represented by the birth of Christ and the anticipation of His eventual return) is the many traditions we share in my family. I'm a strong believer in the importance of family traditions as a way to connect each generation with the next.

For instance, our family Christmas tree has never been one you'd see on a magazine cover. Instead, it's adorned with ornaments like my husband's Purdue graduation tassel, a hideous Styrofoam ball with Q-tips randomly inserted, a painted wooden Santa with huge, soulless black eyes and a lurid red mouth, and various other lovingly made decorations from our children over the years—and even a few from my childhood and my husband's. Nowadays, there are also ornaments from our grandchildren, and we treasure all of these special artifacts deeply.

We also display a beautiful porcelain nativity set made by my mother, placed in a central spot of honor. The grandchildren help me put out my 60 or so Santa figurines. We play Charades on Christmas Eve and have exploding Christmas crackers from England, filled with tissue paper crowns, cheap little toys, and bad jokes during Christmas dinner.

We treasure these traditions, along with many others, because they not only bind our Christmases together, but they bind us together through our memories, shared history, and eagerness to fold the next generation into our family and lives.

CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING | December 22

Each year during Advent and Christmas, we celebrate and support the leaders of the church—past, present, and future. The Christmas Joy Offering honors God's gift of Jesus by providing vital assistance to current and retired church workers in need, while also supporting the education of future leaders at Presbyterian-related schools and colleges serving communities of color. 2024 YEAR-END CONTRIBUTIONS

Tuesday, December 31, is the final day Tab is able to physically receive contributions in the Finance Office for credit to your 2024 giving statement. Checks dated, postmarked, and sent via the U.S. Mail on or before December 31 will be credited as 2024 giving, even if received in 2025. Online giving must have a December 31 processing date for credit in 2024. All of the above is in accordance with IRS rules and regulations. Those interested in donating securities should contact Kristine Green at extension 111 in the Finance Office well in advance of year-end.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS (QCD)

When planning your IRA withdrawal strategy, you may want to consider making charitable donations through a QCD. A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your required minimum distributions (RMDs) for the year, as long as certain rules are met. In addition to the benefits of giving to a charity, a QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. Keeping your taxable income lower may reduce the impact to certain tax credits and deductions, including Social Security and Medicare. See your tax professional for full details.

Three bright flames tell us that our joy is nearly complete! This generous aift changes our lives and changes the world. Now is our time to be ready.

Prayer: Someone says...

Let us pray: Joyful God, you are so generous with us. Guide us, now, as we get ourselves ready for Jesus' birth. Help us to open our hearts, so that you can fill them with all your good gifts - hope, peace, love, and joy! Amen.

Open Door Café is more than just a place—it's the heartbeat of God's love in our community, dedicated to nourishing both body and spirit. 
Prayer: Someone says...

Christmas Eve or Day


JESUS IS BORN!: THE CANDLE OF LIGHT



We light all the candles on the Advent wreath to announce that Baby Jesus is born! All our waiting is over, and in the light of five candles, our excitement can begin!

Scripture: Someone reads...

Scripture says – And Mary gave birth to her firstborn son and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. Luke 2:7



The glow of the fifth candle announces that the light of the world has arrived! Welcome, Baby Jesus. We're glad you are born. We run now to the manger, to help keep you warm!

Prayer: Someone says...

Let us pray: Thank you God for sending Jesus to us. He lights up the whole world with your love. Help us to love him, and to share his light and love generously, so that every person here in Indianapolis (or whatever your home), and all around the world can feel it too. Amen!





Dearest Friends,

My only "job" this year will be to love and enjoy my family and friends. I'm still wrapping my head around the fact that I'll have the chance to attend family gatherings, watch Hallmark movies, cheer at Purdue basketball games, and socialize with friends—without scheduling around committee meetings or adhering to the 9pm Saturday night wind-down I need to be ready for Sunday morning worship.

As I reflect, I feel a mix of gratitude for this rare opportunity and an unsettledness about being away from ministry for two months. Already, I sense a growing sadness that I won't be with the Tab community during the Advent season. I'll miss our beloved traditions, the beauty of our worship services, and the joy of Passing the Peace with the children each Sunday. I'll miss fellowship with you all and with our neighbors throughout the week. I'll even miss the weekly rhythms... (maybe even some of the meetings—though, maybe not!)


