

# A Spiritual Snack

#### ARE SPIRITUAL SNACKS REALLY A THING?!

We all have questions—questions that stir in our minds and hearts, inviting us to ponder important topics of meaning, purpose, life, and death. As children of God and disciples of Jesus, we often seek answers. If you'd like to reflect on some of these questions through the lens of a Psalm, here's a spiritual "snack" to consider.

#### **Snack Enhancing Ideas**

- Find a quiet, comfortable place for reflection.
- · Light a candle if desired.
- Read the provided Psalm (NRSVUE translation).
   Additional translations can enhance your experience.
- Jot down words, ideas, feelings, or images that stand out.
- Read the brief reflection, compare it with your observations, and consider how the Holy Spirit may be speaking to you.
- Spend a few moments praying for individuals or situations that come to mind.
- Close with your own prayer or the one provided.
- Don't forget to blow out the candle!

#### Psalm 4 (NRSVUE)

- <sup>1</sup> Answer me when I call, O God of my right! You gave me room when I was in distress. Be gracious to me, and hear my prayer.
- <sup>2</sup> How long, you people, shall my honor suffer shame? How long will you love vain words and seek after lies? *Selah*
- <sup>3</sup> But know that the Lord has set apart the faithful for himself: the Lord hears when I call to him.
- <sup>4</sup> When you are disturbed, do not sin; ponder it on your beds, and be silent. *Selah*
- <sup>5</sup> Offer right sacrifices, and put your trust in the Lord.
- <sup>6</sup> There are many who say, "O that we might see some good! Let the light of your face shine on us, O Lord!"
- <sup>7</sup> You have put gladness in my heart more than when their grain and wine abound.
- <sup>8</sup> I will both lie down and sleep in peace, for you alone, O Lord, make me lie down in safety.

#### Reflection

My brother and I shared a bedroom for eighteen years. Each night, Mom would have us pray before bed, asking God to bless our family, grandparents, and even distant relatives. This ritual provided comfort, knowing God was watching over us, allowing us to sleep peacefully.

Psalm 4 reflects this same bedtime peace in verse 8: "for you alone, O Lord, make me lie down in safety." However, the journey to peace was not easy. The psalmist begins in distress, having suffered from gossip and false rumors that caused humiliation and robbed them of honor and dignity. In ancient Israel, these qualities were crucial to one's identity and emotional health, especially within the community. The pain of gossip was often worse than physical harm.

The psalmist overcomes this pain by recognizing that the only voice that matters is God's (v. 3). The relationship with God transcends the false judgments of others. By acknowledging God's love and presence, the psalmist experiences grace, which transforms the pain inflicted by words.

May we, as disciples of Jesus, use our words with care and love, knowing the importance of honor, dignity, and respect.

#### **Closing Prayer**

O Lord, open our lips that our mouths may declare your praise, and speak our care for one another. Amen.

# Fresh Stop Returns

#### WINTER PILOT BEGINS JANUARY 18

As more Americans are suffering from preventable, fatal illnesses, more and more people are becoming aware of the importance of good nutrition as the very basis of good health. As Christians, we know that the Bible says that our bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit, and it only makes sense that we should keep them in tip-top working order so that we can serve the Lord with energy and enthusiasm. We know that we should be avoiding ultra-processed foods, refined sugar, etc., but what should we be eating? A beautiful array of vegetables that have been raised without pesticides is certainly a great starting point.

When you order a Fresh Stop share, you are all set to begin feeding yourself and your family in a nutritious way that will support their bodies in the way God intended. Sadly, this type of eating is more expensive than eating non-organic produce, fast food and ultra-processed foods. That's why our ministry makes each bag of produce available at three different price points based on income. You can go to FreshStop.org to see the exact income levels, but basically, if you have a SNAP card, you pay \$10, if you're lower income, you pay \$15 and if you're higher income, you pay \$30 for your share. The higher priced shares combined with the discount our farmers give us for ordering in bulk make for a nice, hefty bag of produce.

We have never run Fresh Stop in the Winter before. Our season usually goes from June to November, but several of our farmers keep growing in the winter using greenhouses and they have said that they can accommodate us, so we decided to try it! The regular Fresh Stop buyers are very excited about this winter option! Our Pilot Winter Fresh Stop Program will start in mid-January (1/18 to be exact) and go every other Saturday through March. We're encouraging folks to go ahead and buy for the whole 5 Fresh Stops in advance, but you can still order one at a time if you'd rather. You'll see both options on the website (www.freshstop.org). The deadline for the first Fresh Stop will be midnight on Sunday, 1/12. You can leave a check or cash at the front office, or you can use a credit card or PayPal online. If you're ordering with a SNAP card, you need to get in touch with Sally at sallybjohn@gmail.com.

The past two seasons, we have held our Fresh Stops at the Raphael Health Center, but they cannot accommodate us this winter, so we will be back in the Tab Dining Room. If you order, plan to come early and enjoy chatting with our chef, Koby Bluitt. She will be giving us ideas about how to use your share and will be handing out samples. We'll also have a newsletter with info about the produce and more recipe ideas, and the coffeepot will be on to warm us up. It's a fun morning between 10 and 11am sharing ideas for how to have a more healthful nutritious diet for these temples God has given us. Won't you give it a try?

Jeanne and Scott Rieger, both born in 1959 in Forest, IL, met in 5th grade. Jeanne, adopted by a farming Methodist family, earned an AS in Surgical Technology from Parkland College and an MS in Education from IU Bloomington.

Scott, who received an MS in Spiritual Formation & Direction, introduced Jeanne to Jesus in 1980. They married in 1980 without dating and had three daughters: Sarah (1981), Annah (1983), and Jennah (1986). Annah and Jennah are RNs, and Sarah is a personal trainer. The family now includes three granddaughters (Selah, Neelah, Priyah) and two grandsons (Ivan, Micah).

In 1988, Jeanne and Scott moved to Indianapolis. Jeanne worked at Pike High School teaching gymnastics before moving to Ivy Tech Community College, where she now serves as Program Chair in Surgical Technology.
