SESSION UPDATE

Session met for a Special Session on Tuesday, March 4 to discuss concerns presented at the February 23 Annual Meeting of the Congregation, recent information provided by the Commission on Ministry of the Whitewater Valley Presbytery, and the resignation of Associate Pastor Reverend Terri Thorn. It was determined that, on the recommendation of Presbytery, teams will be appointed to determine the selection of a consulting firm and with which to work before calling a new Interim Pastor. In addition, the need for a "temporary bridge pastor" to work with Pastor Smutz on a part-time basis was reviewed. Also discussed at length was the Congregation's input and comments on the issue of denomination affiliation, which will continue to be pursued in the coming weeks.
