

Dr. Lantzer is currently working on the manuscript, which will include many of the historic photographs we've collected over the years.

He is now looking to enrich the story with personal recollections from Tab members. To help with this, Tab is offering 75-minute group interview sessions (6 to 8 participants each), beginning this Saturday, April 26. Additional sessions will be held on Sunday, April 27 and May 4, as well as on weekdays—April 30, May 6, and May 7.
