

# Serving in Arizona

This was my fourth year going to Phoenix, Arizona, with the youth group. Each year, the trip seems to come around faster, and the week we spend there—after months of planning—flies by even quicker than the last. This year, our group took on more responsibilities than before, despite having five fewer people and four different stations to staff. It was clear we were in for a busy, challenging, and rewarding four days.

We could have complained or wondered how we'd manage, but I believe God guided us and used us to create the best experience possible for the kids we served. Whether packing supplies for the next day's crafts, sharing our highs and lows after a long day at **Neighborhood Ministries**, braving the blazing heat for a game of kickball, or managing 60 kids in an overfull craft station—our group met each moment with enthusiasm and a willingness to serve.

This trip has left a personal mark on me, as it does every year. I hope our time and service made a difference in the lives of the kids and the ministry. Each trip reminds me to live by the principle of being third: God first, others second, and myself third. It's a mindset we should carry every day—not just on mission trips—but it's on trips like these that you see it most clearly in action.

# Member Spotlight

## MEET VIRGINIA BROWNING

The name “Browning” conjures a vision of something well-seasoned and cared for—qualities that perfectly describe Virginia Browning (née Hunter), a gentle, devoted follower of Jesus and a treasured member of Tab. Her family’s connection to the church runs deep: her grandfather, Emsley W. Johnson, taught Sunday School and famously burned Tab’s mortgage in 1944, the year Virginia was born. Both sets of her grandparents lived just two blocks from Tab, and her parents were married in the church. Virginia recalls walking to Tab as a child, holding her great aunt’s hand, growing up surrounded by family and faith.



Baptized and nurtured at Tab, Virginia now celebrates the baptism of her great-grandson in 2024—the sixth generation of her family at the church. At age six, she was a flower girl at baptisms, handing out carnations. She played the glockenspiel and flute in the church orchestra led by her uncle, Emsley Johnson Jr, sang in the children’s choir, and was an active member of the youth group. Tab was a constant in her life, filled with fond memories of playing Tic-Tac-Toe and Hangman with cousins.

Virginia met Scott Browning at a Christmas party, and after a whirlwind romance, they were engaged in February and married in June 1966, shortly after she graduated from Indiana University with a degree in elementary education. She taught kindergarten for two years before dedicating herself to raising their son, Charlton, born in 1968.

Both were active in Tab’s Young Mariners group. Scott served as a deacon and on numerous committees, while Virginia volunteered in many capacities—she was the last President and first Moderator of Tab’s Women’s Association and devoted 12 years to the preschool program. Each Thanksgiving, she made pies for the Mozel Sanders dinner, and her recipe for “Ayres Tea Room Chicken Salad” was featured in Tab’s cookbook. Proudly, she recalls winning the 4-H cake-making competition as a teenager. Virginia also enjoys oil painting, crewel work, and cut-work.

After Scott retired at 47, they traveled extensively—to Hawaii, China, Scotland, and Italy with Tab—and spent winters as snowbirds in Naples, Florida, for over 30 years. Scott’s passing in December 2021 left a deep void, but Virginia’s home reflects her vibrant spirit through collections of fine bone china, crystal, and her exquisite handiwork. A devoted grandmother, she finds joy in her grandchildren.

Virginia’s faith, grounded in John 3:16 and Psalm 23, is unwavering. She knows intimately the rhythms of birth, death, and rebirth—in faith and life—and embodies the steadfast love of Christ in all she does.

# The Mozel Sanders Thanksgiving Dinner

SHARING LOVE THROUGH A MEAL

For more than 50 years, the Mozel Sanders Thanksgiving Dinner has embodied what it means to be a neighbor—sharing love, generosity, and community.

What began in 1971, with Rev. Mozel Sanders and his wife serving just 20 meals has grown into one of the largest Thanksgiving outreach efforts in the country. Today, more than 40,000 meals are shared across 50+ locations throughout Indianapolis.

At Tabernacle Presbyterian Church we are honored to be one of the largest serving sites. Each year, our Dining Room becomes a place where nearly 1,000 meals are prepared and shared with our neighbors. But it's not just about the food—it's about creating a space

where everyone belongs and where a simple meal becomes a reminder of God's abundant love.

This cherished tradition wouldn't be possible without people like you. There are many ways to get involved:

- Volunteer for a shift and help prepare, package, or serve meals
- Donate a pie (sweet potato pies are always a favorite!)
- Offer your presence—whether through a smile, a prayer, or a helping hand

No role is too small, and every gesture makes a difference. When we come together, we share more than food—we share hope, dignity, and connection.
